Pattern No. 65.—For Edging.

Jonas Brook and Brothers' Goat's Head Crochet Thread, No. 22, and Walker's Penelope Crochet Hook, No. 4.



MAKE a chain the length required, allowing 18 loops for each pattern, turn back and the

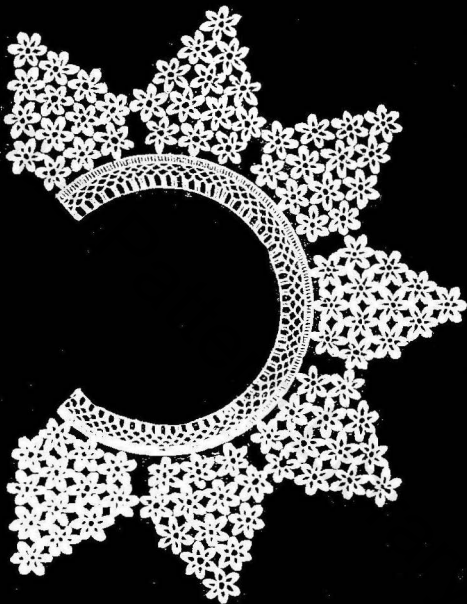
1st Row.—Chain 3, miss 3, work 3 treble, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

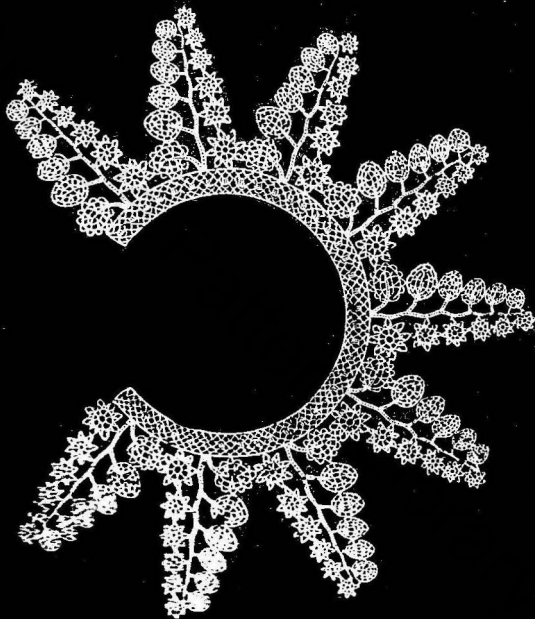
2nd Row.—Plain 1 in the centre of the first three treble of last row, chain 3, miss the next three treble of last row, and work 1 treble in the three chains of last row, then chain 3 and work 1 treble for five times more in the centre of the same three chains as before; then chain 3 and miss the next three treble, repeat to the end, fasten off, and the

3rd Row.—Plain 1 at the top of the one plain of last row, chain 3, miss the first three chains of last row, work 1 treble in the centre

of the next three chains of last row, chain 3, work 1 treble in the centre of the next three chains of last row, chain 3 and work 1 treble in the centre of the next three chains of last row, chain 3 and work 1 treble in the same place as before; chain 3 and work 1 treble in the centre of the next three chains of last row, chain 3 and work 1 treble in the centre of the next three chains of last row, chain 3, repeat to the end, and fasten off, and the


4th Row — Work 1 treble at the top of the one plain of last row, work 1 treble at the top of the first treble of last row; chain 6, miss the first three chains of last row, and work 1 treble in the centre of the next three chains of last row, chain 4, and work 1 treble in the next three chains of last row; chain 4 and work 1 treble in the same three chains as before; chain 4, work 1 treble in the next three chains of last row, chain 6, miss 1 treble and work 1 treble at the top of the second treble of last row, repeat to the end and fasten off, which completes the edging.





Pattern No. 73.—For a Collar.

Jonas Brook and Brothers' Goat's Head Crochet Thread, No. 22, and Walker's Penelope Crochet Hook, No. 3.

 **MAKE** a round loop the size of this O, and work in the round of the loop, seven double.

2nd Round.—Chain 8, plain 1 in the first one double of last round, repeat round. You should have seven lots of the eight chains in the round, and the

3rd Round.—Work 1 plain in the one plain of last round; work 8 double in the eight chains of last round, repeat round.

4th Round.—Chain 3, miss, 1, and plain 1; repeat round all the seven points and fasten off, which will complete the flower.—You require thirteen of these flowers to form one scollop, and one hundred and seventeen for the collar. You can join them together

as you go on with the work, by plaining one in the one previously done, or join them together with a needle and thread, as shewn in the illustration. After you have done the number required, and joined them together, you then work the following band to go round the neck part of the collar :

1st Row.—For the Band—Plain 1 in the centre of the flower, (see illustration, chain 6, work 1 treble between the two flowers, chain 6 and repeat to the end, turn back.

2nd Row.—Work 1 treble in each loop along the last row, turn back, and the

3rd Row.—Chain 5, miss 2, plain 1, repeat to the end, and the

4th Row.—Chain 5, plain 1 in the centre of the five chains of last row, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

5th Row.—Work the same as last.

6th Row.—Work 2 treble in the centre of the five chains of last row, repeat to the end and fasten off, which completes the collar.

Pattern No. 74.—For a Collar.

Jonas Brook and Brothers' Goat's Head Crochet Thread, No. 10, 16, 24, 30, 40, and 50; and Walker's Penelope Crochet Hooks, No. 3, 4, and 5, with the coarse Hook and thread.

MAKE a round loop the size of this O, and work in the round loop 16 double, plain 1 to form the round and fasten off.

2nd Round.—Work 1 treble, chain 3, miss 1, and repeat round, plain 1 to form the round and fasten off. You should have eight treble in the round.

3rd Round.—Plain 1 in the centre of the 3 chains of last round, chain 3, work 1 treble at the top of the one treble of last round, chain 3, work 1 treble in the same loop as before, chain 3, and repeat round, plain 1 and fasten off, which completes the flower. You require to make one flower in each size crochet thread,

and the crochet hooks varied to suit the thread.

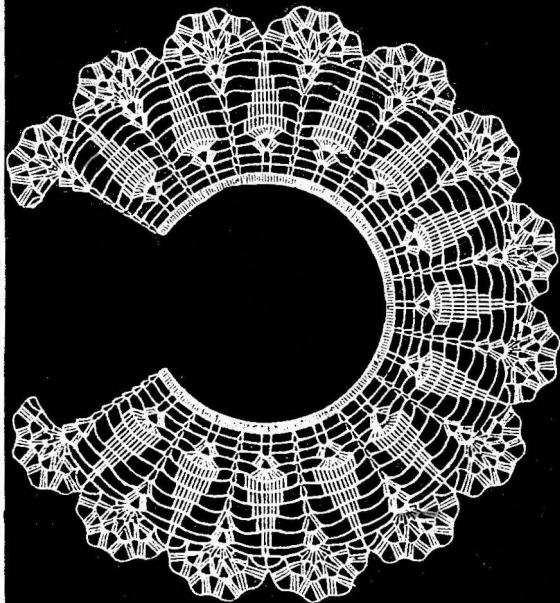
Pattern for Leaf.

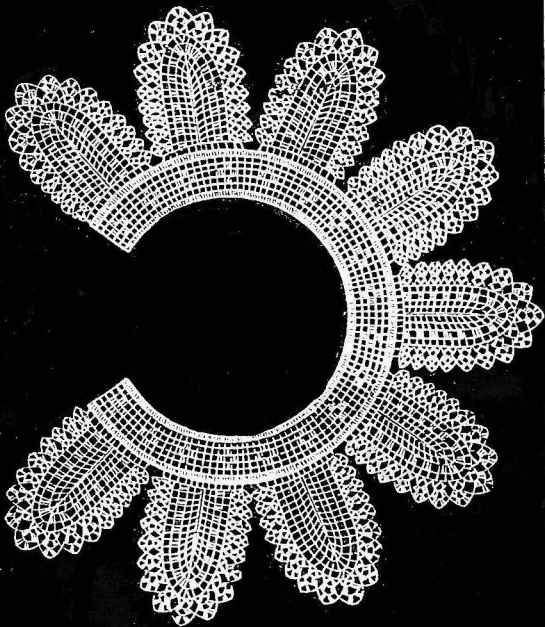
You require one leaf made from each of the six different sizes crochet thread, the same as the flowers, as follows:—

Make a chain of six loops, turn back, work the six loops double, and the

2nd Round.—Chain 3, miss 2, work 1 treble, chain 3, miss 2, work 1 treble, chain 3, work 1 treble in the end loop, chain 3 and work 1 treble opposite the treble on the other side, chain 3 and work one treble opposite the treble on the other side; chain 3 and work 1 plain in the end, turn back, and the

3rd Round.—Chain 3, work 1 treble at the top of the one treble of last round, chain 2 and work 1 treble in the same loop as before; chain 3, and work 1 treble at the top of the next one treble; chain 2 and work 1 treble in the same loop as before; chain 3 and work





1 treble at the top of the next one treble of last round ; chain 2 and work 1 treble in the same loop as before ; chain 3 and work 1 treble at the top of the next one treble of last round, chain 2, work 1 treble in same loop as before ; chain 3, work 1 treble at the top of the next one treble of last row ; chain 2 and work 1 treble in the same loop as before ; chain 3 and plain 1 at the end, turn back.

4th Round.—Chain 4 and plain 1 in the centre of the three chains of last round ; chain 4 and plain 1 in the centre of the two chains of last round ; repeat round and fasten off. You now work a stalk to the leaf in the following manner :—Chain six and work 1 treble in the first side, at the end of the leaf ; work 1 treble in the same manner on the other side ; turn, and work the six chains plain and fasten off, which completes the leaf. After working the number of leaves required, you then join them together as follows, with middle size thread. Plain 1 at the end of the largest leaf, chain 6 and work 1 treble in

the largest flower in the part where you fasten off; chain 6, and repeat the same until you have joined all the six leaves and flowers together, turn each leaf alternately the reverse way; turn back and work the chain loops double, fasten off, then work another scallop the same, and so on, until the whole nine scallops are completed. You then join them together, as shewn in the illustration, and work the following

Band for the Neck.

Plain 1 in the tip of the flower, (see illustration,) chain 7, plain 1 in the next tip of the flower, plain one in the next tip of the flower, chain 7, plain 1 in the end of the stalk, chain 7, plain 1 in the centre of the first four chains of the leaf, chain 7, plain 1 in the next four chains of the leaf, chain 7, plain 1 in the next four chains of the leaf, chain 7, plain 1 in the next four chains, chain 7, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

2nd Row.—Chain 5 and plain 1 in the first

seven chains of last row, repeat to the end, and the

3rd Row.—The same as last.

4th Row.—Chain 3, work 4 treble in the first five chains of last row, chain 3, plain 1 in the next five chains, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

5th Row.—Chain 5, plain 1 in the centre of the first three chains of last row, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

6th Row.—Chain 5, plain 1 in the centre of the first five chains of last row, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

7th Row.—Chain 3, plain 1 in the centre of the five chains of last row, repeat to the end and fasten off, which will complete the collar.



Pattern No. 75.—For a Collar.

Jonas Brook and Brothers' Goat's Head Crochet Thread, No. 18, and Walker's Penelope Crochet Hook, No. 4.



MAKE a chain of 135 loops, turn back, and the

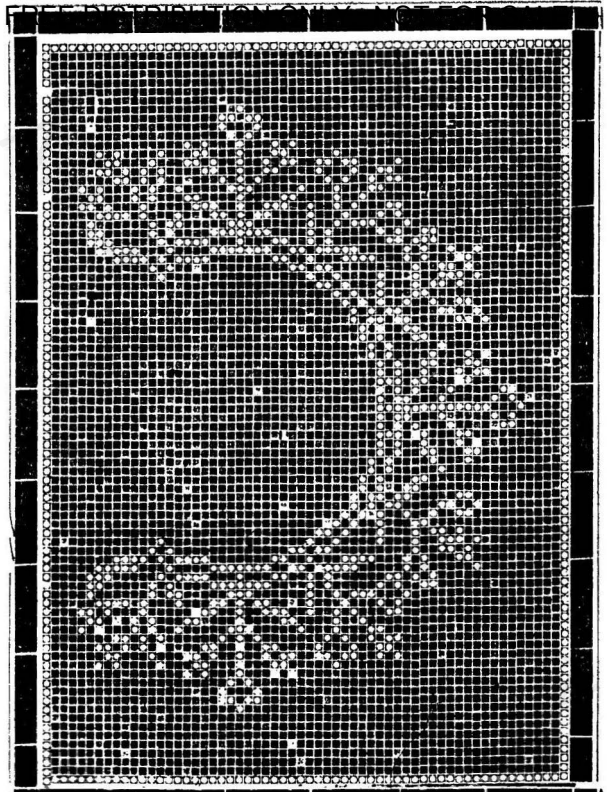
1st Row.—Work treble crochet.

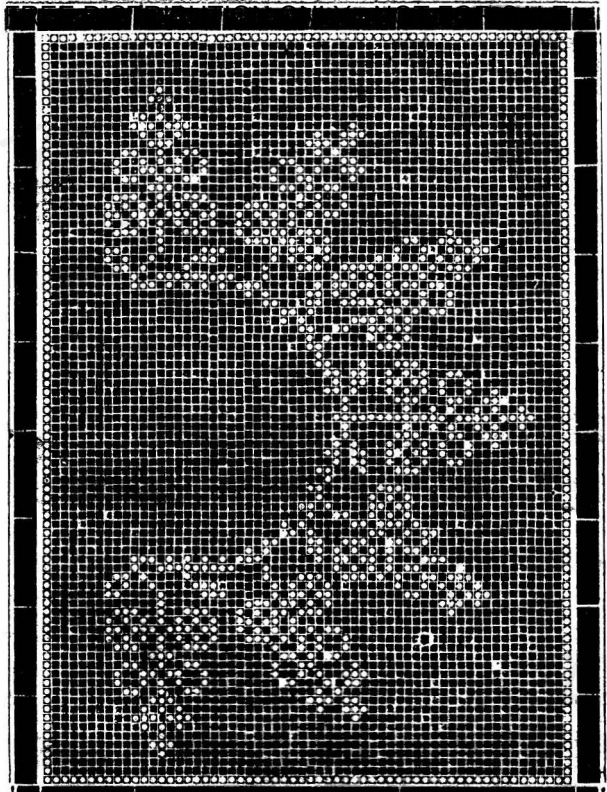
2nd Row.—Work 2 treble, chain 4, miss 3, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

3rd Row.—Work 2 treble between the two treble of last row, chain 5, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

4th Row.—Work 2 treble between the two treble of last row, chain 4, work 3 treble between the next two treble of last row, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same loop as before, chain 4, repeat to the end, making both ends correspond, turn back, and the

5th Row.—Work 2 treble between the two treble of last row, chain 3, work 9 treble in the three chains of last row, chain 3, repeat





to the end, making both ends correspond, turn back, and the

6th Row.—Work 2 treble between the two treble of last row, chain 3, work 11 treble at the top of the nine treble of last row, chain 3, repeat to the end, making both ends correspond, turn back, and the

7th Row.—Work 2 treble between the two treble of last row, chain 4, work 9 treble at the top of the eleven treble of last row, chain 4, and repeat to the end making both ends correspond, turn back, and the

8th Row.—Work 2 treble between the two treble of last row, chain 7, work 7 treble at the top of the nine treble of last row, chain 7, and repeat to the end, making both ends correspond, and the

9th Row.—Work 2 treble between the two treble of last row, chain 3, work 2 treble in the same place as before, chain 8, work 5 treble at the top of the seven treble of last row, chain 8, and repeat to the end, making both ends correspond, and the

10th Row.—Work 3 treble in the three chains of last row, chain 4, work 3 treble in the same three chains as before, chain 9, work 3 treble at the top of the five treble of last row, chain 9, and repeat to the end, making both ends correspond.

11th Row.—Work 2 treble in the four chains of last row, then chain 4 and work 2 treble for four times more in the same four chains of last row, chain 9, work 2 treble at the top of the three treble of last row, chain 9, and repeat to the end, making both ends correspond.

12th Row.—Work 2 treble in the first four chains of last row, chain 4, work 2 treble in the same four chains as before; repeat the same in all the four lots of the four chains of last row; plain 1 in the centre of the nine chains of last row, chain 3, work 1 treble at the top of the two treble of last row, chain 3, plain 1 in the centre of the nine chains of last row, repeat to the end, making both ends correspond, turn back, and the

13th Row.—Work 3 treble in the first four chains of last row, chain 4, work 3 treble in the same four chains as before, repeat the same in all the four lots of the four chains, work 1 plain at the top of the one treble of last row, repeat to the end, making both ends correspond, which completes the collar.



Pattern No. 76.—For a Collar.

Jonas Brook and Brothers' Goat's Head Crochet Thread, No. 30, and Walker's Penelope Crochet Hook, No. 4.

MAKE a chain of twenty-six stitches, turn and work the twenty-six loops double, turn back, and the

1st Round.—Chain 2, miss 1, work 1 treble, repeat to the end, chain 3, work 1 treble in the end loop, chain 3, work 1 treble opposite the treble on the other side, then chain 2,

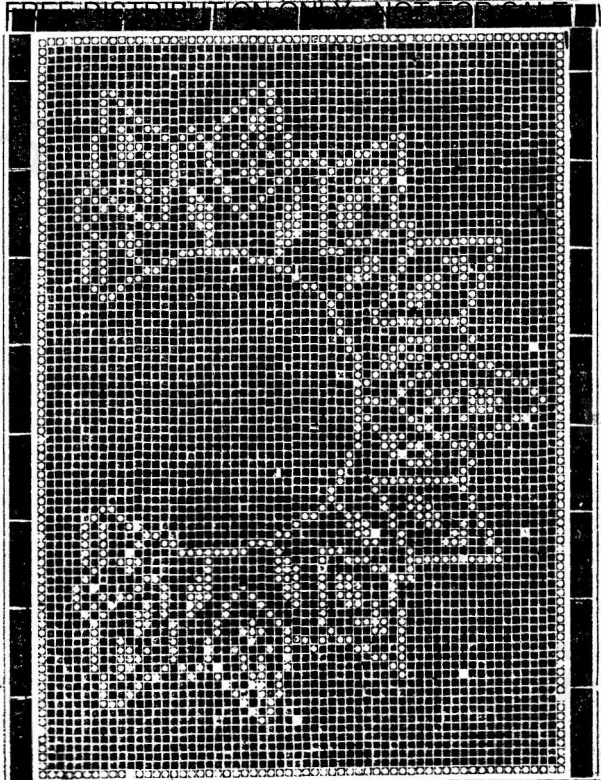
miss 1, and work 1 treble to the end, making both sides correspond, turn back, and the

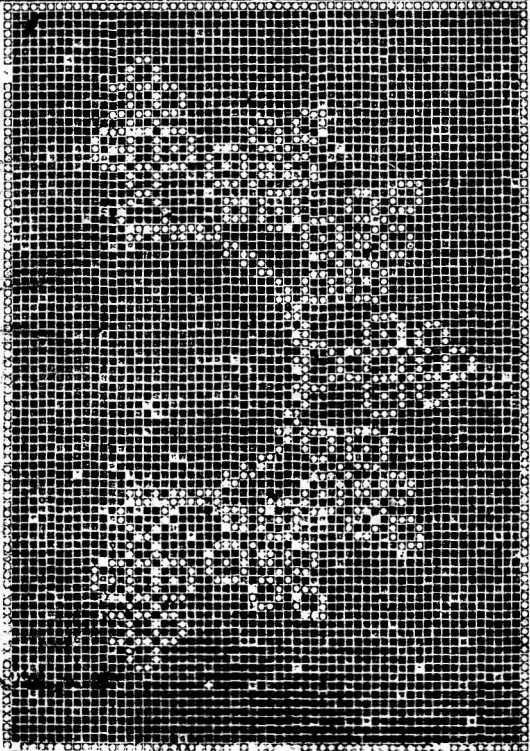
2nd Round.—Chain 2, work 1 treble at the top of the first treble of last round, repeat to the end, and at the end, chain 3, and work 1 treble for three times in the one loop at the end of the end treble; work the other side the same as the first, turn back, and the

3rd Round.—Work 4 treble in the first two chains of last round, chain 2, miss the next two chains, and repeat to the end, and at the end, chain 2, and work the other side to correspond, turn back, and the

4th Round.—Chain 2, miss 2, work 1 treble repeat to the end, (the treble stitches should be worked on the two end ones of the four treble,) and at the end work 3 treble with three chains between them in the end loop, work the other side the same as the first, then turn back, and the

5th Round.—Work 2 treble in the first two chains of last round, chain 3, work 2 treble in the same loop as before, chain 2,





plain 1 in the next two chains, chain 2, and repeat round, turn back, and the

6th Round.—Work 3 treble in the centre of the three chains of last round; chain 3, and work 3 treble in the same three chains as before, chain 4, repeat round, and turn back.

7th Round.—Work 3 treble in the centre of the three chains of last round, chain 3, work 3 treble in the same three chains as before, chain 1, work 1 plain in the centre of the four chains of last round, chain 1 and repeat round, fasten off and work 9 pieces the same, then work a band to go round the neck, and form them all in one length, as follows:—

Pattern for Band.

You commence working along the plain part as follows:—Work 1 treble in the end of the first round, chain 2, and work 1 treble in the next round, repeat, with one treble and two chains for the fourteen rounds on the ends of the round on both sides, chain 2, and re-

peat for the length of the collar, or nine portions, turn back, and the

2nd Row.—Work double crochet.

3rd Row.—Chain 2, miss 2, work 1 treble, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

4th Row.—Chain 2, and work 1 treble at the top of the one treble of last row for five times, work 3 treble, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

5th Row.—Chain 2 and work 1 treble at the top of each of the one treble, except on each side of the four treble, which you work 4 treble on each side of the four treble of last row, with two chains between them; repeat to the end, and the

6th Round.—Chain 2 and work 1 treble at the top of each of the one treble, and four treble in the centre of the eight treble, repeat to the end, turn back, and the

7th Row.—Chain 1 and work 1 treble at the top of the treble of last row, repeat to the end, making this row correspond with the third row, only drawing it in tighter.

8th Row.—Double, which completes the collar.

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
