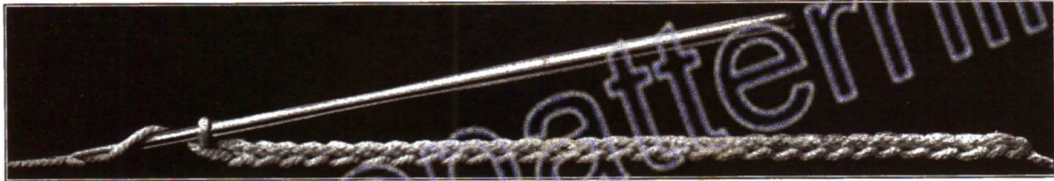

## First Stitches Cotton Crocheting

### CHAIN STITCH



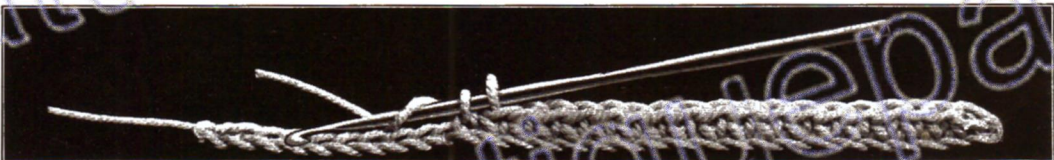
Chain stitch (Ch.) begin by making a slip knot or tying a thread around needle; draw thread through loop, draw another thread through second loop, continue until chain is of length desired.

### SLIP CROCHET OR SLIP STITCH



Slip crochet or slip stitch (Sl. C. or Sl. St.) mostly used in this book to join rounds or different parts in the work. Insert hook into work (indicated in directions) draw thread through work and loop on needle at the same time.

### SINGLE CROCHET



Single crochet (Sg. C.) insert hook in work, draw thread through, having two loops on needle, draw thread through both loops.

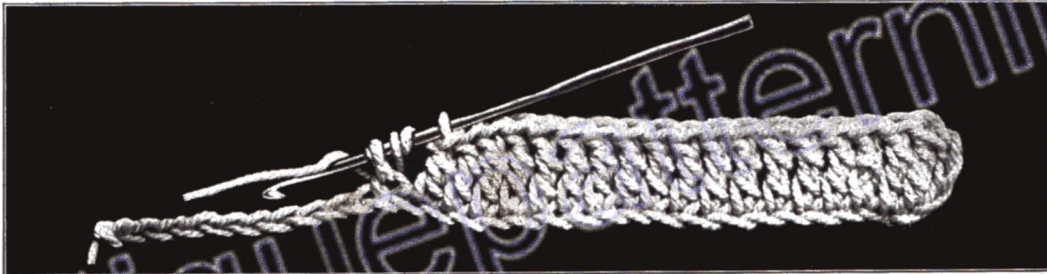
### DOUBLE CROCHET



Double crochet (D. C.) pass thread around hook, insert hook in work, draw thread through work (having 3 loops on needle) pass thread around needle and pull through 2 loops, thread around needle again, pull through last 2.

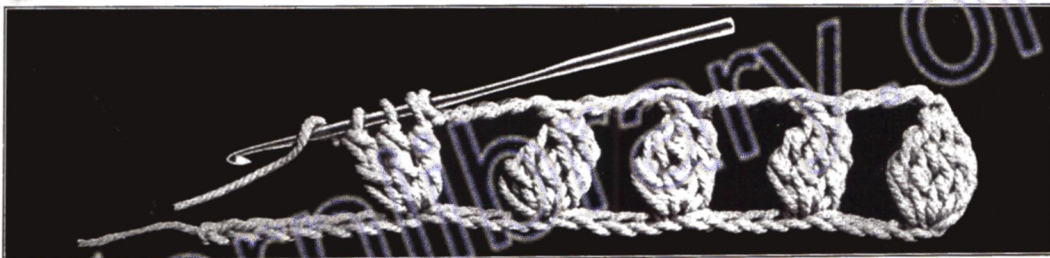
## First Stitches Cotton Crocheting

### TREBLE CROCHET



Treble crochet (Tr. C.) pass thread around hook twice, insert hook into work, pull thread through, thread over needle pull through 2, thread over pull through 2 again, thread over needle and pull through the last 2 loops.

### HALF TREBLE



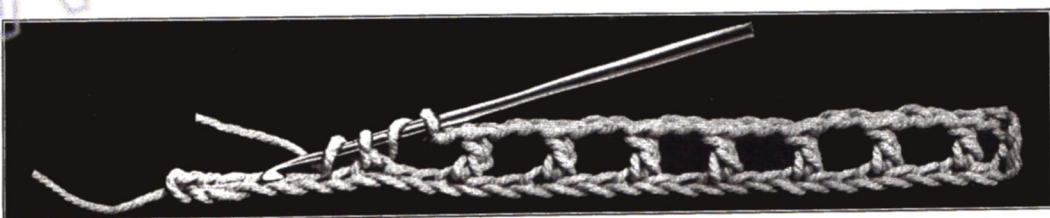
Half treble (H. Tr.) this term was used where the thread was wound around hook two, three, or more times, and worked off by 2 at a time, retaining the last stitch on needle until all the half treble were made and worked off in last stitch.

### PICOT



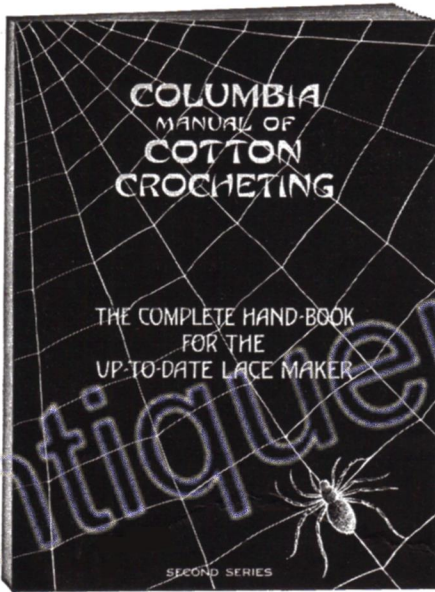
Picot (P.) make a chain of 3 or more stitches as indicated in directions, insert hook into first chain stitch made, and work off as single crochet.

### MESH



Mesh (M.) used in filet crochet, chain 2 stitches, skip 2 stitches, 1 D. C. into next stitch.

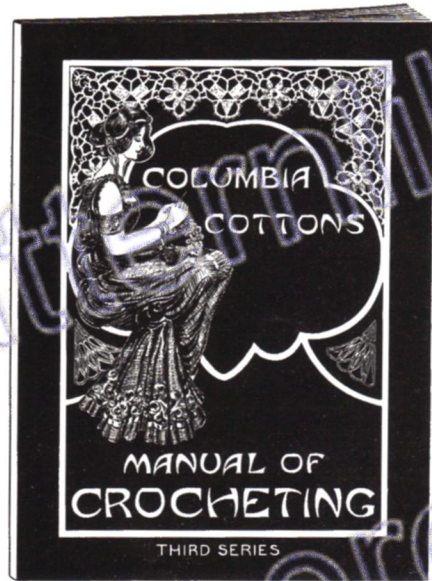
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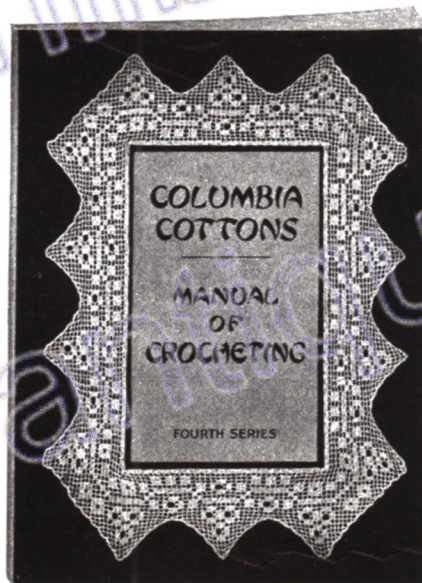
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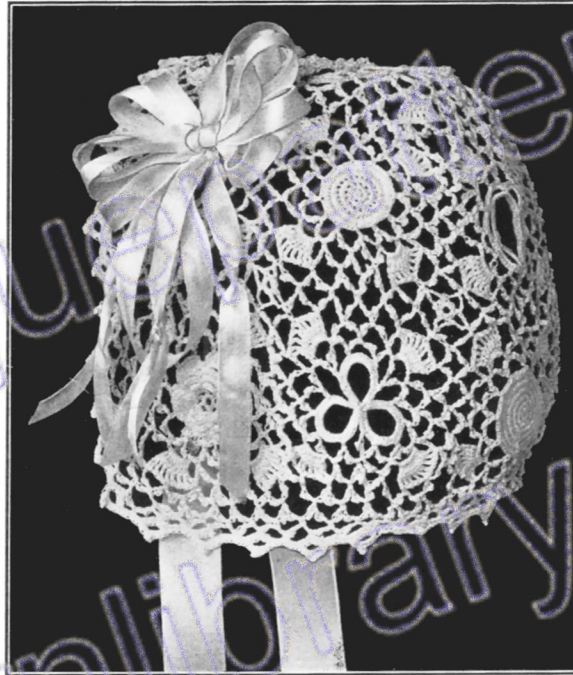
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## Columbia Infant's Cap

### IRISH CROCHET



#### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Crochet (Art. 200), 1 ball  
No. 60

Columbia Steel Crochet Hook No. 12

#### INSTRUCTIONS

This Cap is set together of 12 squares, in 4 different patterns. Make 3 squares of each pattern.

**ROSE**—5 Ch. join 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into ring, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. repeat until you have 6 spaces.

**ROUND 2**—1 Sg. C. 5 D. C. 1 Sg. C. into first space, 1 Sg. C. 5 D. C. 1 Sg. C. into each following space, join with Sl. St.

**ROUND 3**—Turn work, 4 Ch. 1 Sl. St. around spoke between each leaf, 6 times, turn.

**ROUND 4**—1 Sg. C. 7 D. C. 1 Sg. C. into first loop of 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 7 D. C. 1 Sg. C. over each following loop join.

**ROUND 5**—Turn work, 5 Ch. 1 Sl. St. around spoke between each leaf, 6 times, turn.

**ROUND 6**—1 Sg. C. 9 D. C. 1 Sg. C. over each loop.

**ROUND 7**—Turn work, 6 Ch. 1 Sl. St. around spoke between leaves, turn.

**ROUND 8**—1 Sg. C. 11 D. C. 1 Sg. C. over each loop, join.

**ROUND 9**—Sl. St. first 3 stitches on leaf, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. back into second Ch. from hook. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. back into second Ch. 1 Ch. You now have 1 P. L. (picot loop) 1 Sg. C. into fourth from last stitch on leaf. 1 P. L. 1 Sg. C. into fourth stitch on next leaf, 1 P. L. 1 Sg. C. into fourth from last stitch on same leaf, 1 P. L. into fourth stitch of third leaf. Repeat around 6 leaves of rose having 12 P. L. around.

**ROUND 10**—1 P. L. 1 Sg. C. over centre of first P. L. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over centre of next P. L. 3 Ch. turn \* 7 D. C. over the loop of 5 Ch. 4 Ch. turn, 1 D. C. 1 Ch. into each D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into same space where the loop of 5 Ch. is fastened. 1 P. L. in centre of next loop 1 P. L. in centre of next loop, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of next loop 3 Ch. turn and repeat from \* all around having 4 shells in the 4 corners with 2 P. L. between.

**ROUND 11**—1 P. L. into point of shell, 1 P. L. in centre of shell, 1 P. L. into second point of shell. 2 P. L. over next 2 P. L. 1 P. L. into point of next shell. Repeat all around join with Sl. St. break thread.

**WILD ROSE**—Double 1 yard of your thread and over this work 80 Sg. C. make a ring out of 20 Sg. C. in such way that you have the chain of work on outside. Join with Sl. St. to inside of the 20th stitch. Work over cord 10 Sg. C. 1 Sl. St. into 12th stitch from last Sl. St. 10 Sg. C. over cord, leave 12 stitches join with Sl. St. Repeat until you have 6 open spaces. Join this again into a large ring, fasten the padding cord and cut this away but do not cut the thread you are working with.

**ROUND 2**—Sl. St. 3 stitches on first space. 1 P. L. 1 Sg. C. into 4th stitch from end. 1 P. L. into 4th stitch on next space. 1 P. L. into 4th stitch from end repeat all around having 12 P. L. in round.

**ROUND 3**—1 P. L. 1 Sg. C. into centre of first loop, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over centre of second loop. 3 Ch. turn \* 7 D. C. over 5 Ch. 4 Ch. turn 1 D. C. 1 Ch. into each D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into same space, where the 5 Ch. is fastened. 1 P. L. in centre of next loop, 1 P. L. into centre of next loop, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next loop, 3 Ch. turn and repeat from \* all around having 4 shells in the 4 corners with 2 P. L. between.

**ROUND 4**—1 P. L. into point of shell 1 P. L. in centre of shell, 1 P. L. into second point of shell, 2 P. L. over next 2 P. L. 1 P. L. into next point of shell, 1 P. L. into centre of shell. 1 half P. L. join on to corresponding P. L. of first square. Half P. L. back into second point of shell, half P. L. in next P. L. of first square, half P. L. back in P. L. of wild rose square. Repeat joining square in four spaces. Finish round with P. L. fasten with Sl. St. break thread. Work one more Rose Square and join on to wild rose square, having 3 squares joined in length.

**CLOVER LEAF**—24 Ch. join in ring, 24 Ch. join in same space, 24 Ch. join again in same place. Work 35 Sg. C. over each loop, join.

**ROUND 2**—Sl. St. 7 stitches over first ring \* 1 P. L. into 14th stitch on ring, 1 P. L. into 21st stitch on ring. 1 P. L. into 28th stitch on ring. 1 P. L. into 7th stitch on 2nd ring, repeat from \* all around having 12 P. L. in round.

**ROUNDS 3 AND 4**—Work same as in first two squares, join in last row on to 2nd rose. Work one more rose, join on to clover leaf, (5 squares in length).

**COIN SQUARE**—Double 1 yard of your thread, work 4 Sg. C. over this, join into a very close circle.

**ROUND 2**—2 Sg. C. into each stitch, but carry the padding between, do not join but work around and around, 8 stitches in this round.

**ROUND 3**—2 Sg. C. in each of 16 stitches.

**ROUND 4**—1 Sg. C. in each of 32 stitches.

**ROUND 5**—1 Sg. C. in first stitch, \* 2 Sg. C. into next stitch, 1 Sg. C. into next, repeat from \* all around having 48 stitches in round, join with Sl. St. cut padding but do not cut thread you are working with.

**ROUND 6**—1 P. L. into 4th stitch, 1 P. L. in 8th stitch 1 P. L. into 12th stitch, repeat all around, making 12 P. L. around coin.

**ROUNDS 7 AND 8**—Same as last two rounds in squares previously made, join and break thread.

**TO SET CAP TOGETHER**—Front of Cap 1 rose square, 1 clover, 1 rose, 1 wild rose, 1 rose. 2nd Row: 1 clover, 1 coin, 1 clover, 1 coin, and 1 wild rose. Now fold this in half and join 1 wild rose on to coin on left hand side, on to clover in centre and on to coin square on right hand side join and break thread. Work 1 more coin square and join on to clover on right hand side, on to coin in centre and on to wild rose square on left hand side, break thread.

**EDGE**—Beginning at right hand corner work 1 P. L. into centre of each P. L. across front of cap, half of P. L. in back of cap, join.

**ROUND 2**—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into P. L. before the first picot, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of P. L. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. before first picot on next loop, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of loop, repeat across front, on back of cap work 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over each half P. L. join.

**ROUND 3**—7 Sg. C. over first loop 3 Sg. C. over second loop, 5 Ch. \* 1 Sl. St. back into centre of 7 Sg. C. 4 Sg. C. 1 picot (made of 4 Ch.) 4 Sg. C. over 5 Ch. just made 3 Sg. C. over unfinished loop. 7 Sg. C. over next loop, 3 Sg. C. over next loop, 5 Ch. repeat from \* all around cap, break thread.

After cap is finished you will find large openings between the squares, to fill these in, work 5 Ch. join, 8 Sg. C. into ring. Now set this into open space. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of space over shell, 3 Ch. skip 1 stitch on the ring, 1 Sg. C. into next stitch 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of next space above shell, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. back into 4th stitch on ring, 3 Ch. repeat until 4 sides are caught, join on to ring, break thread and finish.

## Columbia Infant's Cap



### SPIDER PATTERN

#### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Crochet (Art. 200), 1 ball No. 60

Columbia Steel Crochet Hook No. 12

#### INSTRUCTIONS

Chain 46 stitches 1 Sg. C. into second Ch. from hook, 1 Sg. C. into next stitch, 1 Sg. C. into next stitch \* 5 Ch. skip 4 stitches 1 D. C. into next stitch, skip 4 stitches 5 Sg. C. into next 5 stitches, repeat from \* to end of row, finishing with 3 Sg. C. 1 Ch. turn.

Row 2—1 Sg. C. into first stitch 1 Sg. C. into second stitch 5 Ch. \* 1 Sg. C. under 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into D. C. 1 Sg. C. under next 5 Ch. 5 Ch. 3 Sg. C. over centre of 5 Sg. C. 5 Ch. repeat from \* ending with 2 Sg. C. 8 Ch. turn.

Row 3—\* 1 Sg. C. under loop of 5 Ch. 3 Sg. C. over 3 Sg. C. 1 Sg. C. over loop, 5 Ch. 1 D. C. in centre of 3 Sg. C. 5 Ch. repeat from \* ending with 1 D. C. 1 Ch. turn.

Row 4—1 Sg. C. over D. C. 1 Sg. C. over loop 5 Ch. \* 3 Sg. C. over centre of 5 Sg. C. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over loop 1 Sg. C. over D. C. 1 Sg. C. over loop 5 Ch. repeat from \* ending with 2 Sg. C. over loop of 8 Ch. 1 Ch. turn.

Row 5—1 Sg. C. over first Sg. C. 1 Sg. C. over second Sg. C. 1 Sg. C. over loop 5 Ch. \* 1 D. C. into centre of spider, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over loop 3 Sg. C. over 3 Sg. C. 1 Sg. C. over loop 5 Ch. repeat from \* ending with 3 Sg. C. 1 Ch. turn.

Row 6—2 Sg. C. over first 2 stitches \* 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over loop, 1 Sg. C. over D. C. 1 Sg. C. over loop 5 Ch. 3 Sg. C. over centre of 5 Sg. C. 5 Ch. repeat from \* ending with 2 Sg. C. 8 Ch. turn. Repeat these rows until 8 spiders are finished,

having the row of 5 Ch. 3 Sg. C. 5 Ch. 3 Sg. C. as the last row, break thread.

Insert hook on side at beginning of the piece just made, work 3 Sg. C. over the first half spider, 5 Ch. \* 1 D. C. in centre of next space 5 Ch. 5 Sg. C. over next space, 5 Ch. repeat from \* on three sides of the oblong finished piece, this part will form the centre of cap in front, work the spider pattern back and forth on the three sides until 9 spiders are finished.

BEADING—6 Ch. now work toward front of cap, 1 Tr. in first row of half spider, 1 Ch. 1 Tr. in second row, 1 Ch. 1 Tr. in 3rd row, 2 Ch. 3 Tr. with 1 Ch. between over next half spider, repeat on face of cap, in corner work 6 Tr. with 1 Ch. between, 2 Ch. 3 Tr. with 1 Ch. between over first spider around neck part of cap, 3 Tr. with 1 Ch. between over D. C. 3 Tr. 1 Ch. between over next spider thus leaving out the 2 Ch. to gather up bottom of cap, 6 Tr. 1 Ch. between into corner and join.

EDGING—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in centre of 2 Ch. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in 2nd Tr. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in centre of next 2 Ch. repeat around front. Around neck work 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of each cluster of Tr. join.

Row 2—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in centre of each loop all around cap.

Row 3—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. all around join and break thread.

## Columbia Child's Cap

PINWHEEL PATTERN. (Age 1 year)



### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Crochet (Art. 200), 1 ball  
No. 50  
Columbia Steel Crochet Hook No. 10

### INSTRUCTIONS

ROUND 1—Ch. 4 stitches join, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into ring 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. repeat until you have 6 spaces.

ROUND 2—3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over first loop, 1 Sg. C. over Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next loop, 1 Sg. C. over the Sg. C. repeat all around, do not join but work around and around.

ROUND 3—3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over first loop 1 Sg. C. over first Sg. C. 1 Sg. C. over second Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next loop, 1 Sg. C. over each of next 2 Sg. C. repeat all around.

ROUND 4—3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over each of next 3 Sg. C. 3 Ch. repeat these rounds until you have 18 rounds or 18 Sg. C. in each section.

ROUND 19—3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over centre of loop 3 Ch. skip the first Sg. C. \* and work 17 Sg. C. over next 17 stitches, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over loop, 3 Ch. skip first Sg. C. and repeat from \* all around.

ROUND 20—3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over first loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over second loop 3 Ch. skip first Sg. C. work 16 Sg. C. over next 16 stitches, repeat these rounds until pinwheel or star is finished, which should be done in 18 rounds. Finishing with 3 Ch. and 1 Sg. C. all around in last row.

ROUND 39—5 Ch. 1 D. C. into centre of first loop, 2 Ch. 1 D. C. into each following loop all around, join on to 3rd of 5 Chs. made at beginning of round.

ROUND 40—3 Ch. 2 D. C. into first M. 3 D. C. into next M. 3 D. C. into each following M. all around, join.

ROUND 41—5 Ch. skip 2 D. C. 1 D. C. into next D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. into 3rd D. C. repeat M. all around join. This finishes centre of cap. There should be 109 M.

FACE—3 Ch. 1 D. C. into first stitch; 5 Ch. skip 2 M. 3 D. C. into each of next 3 M. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. over next D. C. 2 Ch. 3 D. C. into each of next 3 M. 5 Ch. skip 2 M. \* 1 D. C. into D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in same D. C. 5 Ch. skip 2 M. 3 D. C. into each of next 3 M. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. skip 1 M. 1 D. C. over next D. C. 2 Ch. skip 1 D. C. 3 D. C. over each of next 3 M. 5 Ch. skip 2 M. 1 D. C. into D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in same space, 5 Ch. skip 2 M. and repeat from \* until you have 8 patterns started ending with 5 Ch. skip 2 M. 2 D. C. into next D. C. there should be 13 M. left for back of cap, 3 Ch. turn.

Row 2—1 D. C. over second D. C. 5 Ch. \* skip 1 D. C. 7 D. C. over next 7 D. C. 2 Ch. 3 D. C. into D. C. between the 2 M. 2 Ch. skip first of 9 D. C. 7 D. C. over next 7 D. C. 5 Ch. 1 D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. between the 2 D. C. this finishes 1 pattern, 5 Ch. and repeat from \* to end of row, ending with 5 Ch. 2 D. C. into last stitch 3 Ch. turn.

Row 3—1 D. C. in second D. C. 5 Ch. \* skip first of 7 D. C. 5 D. C. over next 5 D. C. 2 Ch. 3 D. C. into first of 3 D. C. 2 Ch. 3 D. C. into last of 3 D. C. 2 Ch. skip first of 7 D. C. 5 D. C. over next 5 D. C. 5 Ch. 1 D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. between the 2 D. C. this finishes pattern. 5 Ch. repeat from \* across ending with 5 Ch. 2 D. C. in last 2 D. C. 3 Ch. turn.

Row 4—1 D. C. over D. C. 5 Ch. \* skip first of 5 D. C. 3 D. C. over next 3 D. C. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. in first of 3 D. C. 1 D. C. over next D. C. 2 D. C. over last D. C. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. over first D. C. 1 D. C. over D. C. 2 D. C. over last D. C. 2 Ch. skip

first of 5 D. C. 3 D. C. over next 3 D. C. 5 Ch. 1 D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. between next 2 D. C. this finishes pattern 5 Ch. and repeat from \* ending with 5 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. turn.

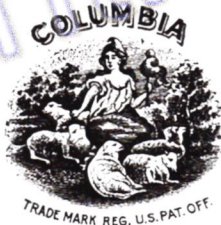
Row 5—1 D. C. over D. C. 5 Ch. \* 1 D. C. in centre of 3 D. C. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. in first of 5 D. C. 3 D. C. over next 3 D. C. 2 D. C. in last D. C. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. in first of 5 D. C. 3 D. C. over 3 D. C. 2 D. C. in last D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in centre of 3 D. C. 5 Ch. 1 D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. between 2 D. C. this finishes pattern. 5 Ch. repeat from \* ending with 5 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. turn.

Row 6—1 D. C. 5 Ch. \* 2 D. C. in first of 7 D. C. 5 D. C. over 5 D. C. 2 D. C. in last stitch, 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in centre of 2 Ch. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. in first of 7 D. C. 5 D. C. over 5 D. C. 2 D. C. in last D. C. 5 Ch. 1 D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. between 2 D. C. this finishes pattern, 5 Ch. repeat from \* ending with 5 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. turn.

Row 7—1 D. C. 5 Ch. skip first of 9 D. C. 7 D. C. over next 7 D. C. 2 Ch. 3 D. C. into D. C. between pattern, 2 Ch. skip first of 9 D. C. 7 D. C. over 7 D. C. 5 Ch. 1 D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. this finishes pattern, repeat from third row until 21 rows are made.

Row 22—Work one row of 2 Ch. 1 D. C. all around cap, skipping 2 stitches across face, 2 Ch. 1 D. C. over sides working same into each row.

Row 23—2 D. C. 3 Ch. 2 D. C. in first M. skip 1 M. \* 2 D. C. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. into next M. skip 1 M. and repeat from \* all around cap, join, break thread, and finish.



## Columbia Infant's Cap

STAR PATTERN. (Age 6 months)



### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Crochet (Art. 200) 1 ball  
No. 50.

Columbia Steel Crochet Hook No. 10.

### INSTRUCTIONS

Ch. 12 join, 7 Ch. thread around hook 4 times draw through 2-2-2-2 thus making a D. Tr. (double treble) thread around hook 4 times and repeat until you have 6 D. Tr. counting the 7 Ch. first made as one D. Tr. 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into ring. 7 Ch. 5 D. Tr. 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. repeat until you have 4 clusters of D. Tr. ending with 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 6 Sl. St. up the first 7 Ch.

ROUND 2—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of cluster 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into point of same cluster \* 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into point of next cluster, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into point, repeat from \* over the four clusters, 7 Ch. join.

ROUND 3—5 Sg. C. over first 5 Ch. 5 Sg. C. over next 5 Ch. 7 Sg. C. over 7 Ch. repeat all around, join

ROUND 4—Sl. St. over first 3 Sg. C. 4 Ch. thread around hook twice draw up a loop in

same stitch where Ch. is made \* draw through 2-2 thread over hook twice, draw up loop in same space draw through 2-2 and last 3 stitches on hook, thus making one petal 5 Ch. thread around hook twice draw up loop in same space, draw through 2-2, thread over hook twice and repeat from \* until 3 petals are made in same space. Thread over hook twice, draw up loop in centre of next 5 Sg. C. work 3 petals with 5 Ch. between into same space, thread over hook twice draw up loop in centre of 7 Sg. C. work 3 petals with 5 Ch. between into same space repeat all around, join.

ROUND 5—5 Sg. C. over each loop between petals, there should be 24 loops.

ROUND 6—Sl. St. over first 3 stitches, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of next loop, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. all around, join.

ROUND 7—5 Sg. C. over each of 24 loops.

ROUND 8—Sl. St. over first 3 stitches, 4 Ch. thread over hook twice draw up loop where Ch. starts, draw through 2-2 and last two stitches on hook, Ch. 4 thread over hook twice insert hook into space where you just joined the petal \* draw through 2-2 and last 2 stitches, thread over hook twice draw up loop into space where first petal is made, draw through 2-2 thread over hook draw up loop in same space, draw through 2-2 and last 3 stitches on hook, thread over hook twice draw up loop in centre of next 5 Sg. C. draw through 2-2, thread over hook twice, draw up loop in same space, draw through 2-2, and last 3 stitches on hook, 4 Ch. thread over hook twice insert hook into space where last petal is joined and repeat from \* all around, join.

ROUND 9—5 Ch. thread around hook 3 times, draw up loop in same space where chains start, draw through 2-2-2 and last 2 stitches on hook \* thread over 3 times, draw up loop in space where the 4 petals meet, draw through 2-2-2 thread over hook 3 times, draw up loop in same space draw through 2-2-2 and last 3 stitches, Ch. 7, thread around hook 3 times draw up loop in same space where last petal is made draw through 2-2-2 thread around hook 3 times draw up loop in same space, draw through 2-2-2 and last 3 stitches, and repeat from \* all around, 7 Ch. and join on to first petal made.

ROUND 10—11 Sg. C. over each loop of 7 Ch.

ROUND 11—Sl. St. over first 6 Sg. C. 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of each loop, join.

ROUND 12—11 Sg. C. over each loop, join.

ROUND 13—7 Ch. thread around hook 4 times, draw up loop in same space where chains are made, draw through 2-2-2-2 and last 2 stitches on hook. Thread around hook 4 times, draw up a loop in last of 11 Sg. C. \* draw through 2-2-2-2, thread over hook 4 times draw up loop in same space, draw through 2-2-2-2 and last 3 loops on hook, 7 Ch. thread around hook 4 times draw up loop in space where petal is joined, draw through 2-2-2-2 and last 2 stitches, thread over hook 4 times draw up loop in same space where 2nd petal is made draw through 2-2-2-2, thread over hook

4 times draw up loop in same space, draw through 2-2-2-2 and last 3 stitches on hook, thread over hook 4 times draw up loop in last of next 11 Sg. C. and repeat from \* all around, join.

ROUND 14—7 Ch. thread around hook 4 times draw up loop in same space where chain starts and finish this petal same as in previous row, work on petal into space where the next 4 petals meet 7 Ch., thread around hook 4 times, draw up loop in space where this last petal is joined finish petal, work 1 more petal in same space where second petal is made, 1 petal into next space where 4 petals meet, repeat all around and join. This finishes back of cap.

FACE—Turn cap and work back, starting with 7 Ch., thread over hook 4 times finish petal in same space 1 petal into next space, 1 petal across, 1 petal in same space on bottom, repeat this across front of cap leaving 3 patterns for back 7 Ch. turn.

Row 2—Thread around hook 4 times, finish petal in first space, 1 petal into next space 7 Ch., thread around hook 4 times finish petal across top, 1 petal in same space at bottom, repeat to end of row leaving off the 3 patterns for back of cap, 7 Ch. turn.

Row 3—Same as second row, repeat these rows until 5 rows are made, work 6th row in same way, but all around cap, care being taken to work the petals on side and bottom into the right spaces in order not to spoil pattern, join.

Row 7—11 Sg. C. over each loop on face of cap only, 7 Ch. turn.

Row 8—Same as round 13, working pattern in front only.

Row 9—Work petals in same way, but work only the 7 Ch. across top leaving off the long D. Tr.

Row 10—5 Sg. C. 4 Ch. to form picot 5 Sg. C. over first loop, 5 Sg. C. 1 picot, 5 Sg. C. over each loop all around cap, join, break thread and finish.





## Columbia Baby Cap

MEDALLION DESIGN. (Age 6 months)

### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Crochet (Art. 200), 1 ball  
No. 60

Columbia Steel Crochet Hook, No. 12

### INSTRUCTIONS

Chain 10, join into ring, 5 Ch. thread around hook twice, 1 Tr. into ring, 1 Ch. 1 Tr. Repeat until you have 18 Tr. with 1 Ch. between in ring counting the first chain as 1 Tr. 1 Ch. and join into 4th Ch. at beginning.

ROUND 2—3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. between each Tr. having 18 loops, do not join but work around and around.

ROUND 3—4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in each loop.

ROUND 4—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in each loop.

ROUND 5—6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in each loop.

Join and break thread. Use this Medallion for centre of cap, work 6 more Medallions in same way, but in last row join three loops onto centre Medallion, and three loops to each succeeding Medallion, thus forming the round centre for back of cap.

MEDALLIONS FOR 2ND ROW—Ch. 8, join, 6 Ch. 15 Tr. with 1 Ch. between each, join.

ROUND 2—3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. between each Tr. 16 loops in round.

ROUND 3—4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. between.

ROUND 4—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. between.

ROUND 5—6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. between, join onto 3 loops of Medallions made before work 10 more Medallions in same way and join each to 3 loops on large and 3 loops on each side of the smaller Medallion, the 11 Medallions when joined around the 6 large Medallions will leave a space of 3 loops for back of cap.

FACE OF CAP—Insert hook into 4th loop of small Medallion, leaving the 3 loops on large and 3 loops on each side of the small Medallion for back of cap, Ch. 6, 1 Sg. C. into second loop working toward left, 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into third loop, 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into 4th loop, 1 Sg. C. into first loop on next Medallion, 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in 2nd loop, 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into each following loop, 1 Sg. C. into first loop of third Medallion, 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into each loop, repeat over each of 11



Medallions, making 4 loops over last Medallion, 6 Ch. turn.

Row 2—6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into each loop.

ROWS 3, 4, 5, 6 AND 7—Ch. 6, 1 Sg. C. into each loop, break thread, there should be 48 loops.

MEDALLIONS FOR FACE OF CAP—5 Ch. join into ring, 6 Ch. 11 Tr. join.

ROUND 2—3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. between each Tr. 12 loops around.

ROUND 3—4 Ch. 1 Sg. C.

ROUND 4—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C.

ROUND 5—6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. join onto first 3 loops on face of cap, work 11 more Medallions in same way, join three loops onto side of one just made, skip 1 loop on cap, join onto next three loops, break thread. Join each succeeding Medallion in same way skipping 1 loop between.

Work 1 row of loops of 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. all around cap.

EDGE—7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into 3rd Ch. for picot, 2 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into next loop, 7 Ch. 1 picot, 2 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into each following loop all around cap. Break thread and finish.

## Columbia Child's Cap

CONVENTIONAL DESIGN. (Age 1 year)



### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Crochet (Art. 200), 1 ball  
No. 50

Columbia Steel Crochet Hook, No. 10

### INSTRUCTIONS

Chain 74 stitches 1 D. C. into 4th Ch. from hook. 5 Ch. skip 4 stitches 1 Sg. C. into next stitch \* 5 Ch. skip 4 stitches 3 Sg. C. into next 3 stitches. 5 Ch. skip 4 stitches 1 Sg. C. into next stitch, repeat from \* until you have 5 times 3 Sg. C. spaces. 5 Ch. skip 4 stitches 1 Sg. C. into next stitch 5 Ch. skip 4 stitches 2 D. C. into last 2 stitches 3 Ch. turn.

Row 2—1 D. C. into second D. C. 7 Ch. \* 1 Sg. C. into first of 3 Sg. C. 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into same Sg. C. 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into second Sg. C. 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into third Sg. C. 7 Ch. skip to next cluster of 3 Sg. C. and repeat from \* to end of row ending with 7 Ch. 2 D. C. into last 2 D. C. 3 Ch. turn.

Row 3—1 D. C. into second D. C. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over centre of 7 Ch. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over centre of first loop, 1 Sg. C. over second loop, 1 Sg. C. over third loop, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over centre of next 7 Ch. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over each of 3 loops, repeat to end of row, finishing same with 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 5 Ch. 2 D. C. into last 2 stitches 3 Ch. turn.

Row 4—Same as 2nd row. Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows until 12 patterns or 24 rows are made. Work one more piece in same way, this forms the two sides of cap, which should be connected with a long stripe in the same pattern.

FOR CENTRE STRIPE—Ch. 37, work pattern in same way but making only 2 clusters of 3 Sg. C. and 3 open spaces, ending with 2 D. C. on each side, work 27 patterns for length.

TO JOIN CAP—Have the beginning of the 3 pieces for face of cap and take care to have all the parts right side up.

Insert hook into first row of short piece for left side Ch. 7, 1 Sg. C. into first row of the long piece, 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. back in same place on short piece, 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into same space on long piece, 3 Sg. C. over the D. C. on side of long piece, 7 Ch. skip 1 space on short piece, 1 Sg. C. over the D. C. 7 Ch. back over D. C. on long piece, 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over same space on short piece, 3 Sg. C. over next D. C. on short piece 7 Ch. skip 1 space on long piece 1 Sg. C. 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. back on short piece 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. on long piece, 3 Sg. C. over next D. C. on long piece, repeat these bars to point. In turning point, work three clusters of bars into point without skipping space, but skip the spaces on the long piece, thus rounding the corner, join in same way down the back. Join other short piece in same way to right side of cap, break thread.

Insert hook into first space on bottom of cap 3 Ch. 1 D. C. into first space, 1 Ch. 1 D. C. into each space to gather up for neck of cap.

EDGE—1 D. C. 3 Ch. for P. 1 D. C. 1 P. 1 D. C. 1 P. 1 D. C. into corner 1 Sg. C. into 3rd Ch. on face of cap. 1 D. C. 1 P. 1 D. C. 1 P. 1 D. C. 1 P. 1 D. C. into Sg. C. skip 2 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into next stitch. 1 shell into centre of 3 Sg. C. skip 2 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into next stitch. 1 shell in Sg. C. repeat shells all around face of cap, on bottom of same work shell into first space, Sg. C. into third space shell into 5th space, repeat to end and join.

Draw ribbon through beading on the two sides of cap.

## Columbia Girl's Dutch Cap

(Age 3-4 years)



### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Knitting and Crochet Perle  
(Art. 611A)

No. 3 Pink or any desirable color, 2 balls

Ribbon to match, No. 12, 4 yards.

Columbia Bone Crochet Hook, No. 2

### INSTRUCTIONS

Do not work this cap tight. Chain 4 join, 2 Sg. C. into each stitch.

ROUND 2—1 Sg. C. into first stitch 2 Sg. C. into next stitch, 1 Sg. C. into the third stitch, 2 Sg. C. into fourth stitch repeat all around, do not join but work around and around.

ROUND 3—1 Sg. C. into first stitch, 1 Sg. C. into second stitch, 2 Sg. C. into third stitch, repeat all around, there should be 7 sections in round.

ROUND 4—1 Sg. C. in each of 3 stitches 2 Sg. C. into 4th stitch, repeat all around.

ROUND 5—1 Sg. C. into each of 4 stitches 2 Sg. C. into 5th stitch, repeat all around, repeat these rounds having one stitch more in each section of every round, until there are 30 stitches between sections or 30 rounds.

ROUND 31—1 Sg. C. into first stitch, skip 1 stitch \* 1 Sg. C. into next stitch skip 1 stitch repeat from \* all around.

ROUND 32—1 Sg. C. into each stitch, work 10 more rounds in same way.

FOR TURN BACK OR SHIELD OF CAP—Turn cap from you and work 1 Sg. C. into first stitch taking back of stitch only. 1 D. C. into next back of stitch, 1 Sg. C. into third stitch, 1 D. C. into fourth stitch, repeat within 15 stitches from end of row leaving these for back of cap, work 2 stitches into last stitch 2 Ch. turn.

Row 2—Work 1 D. C. over the Sg. C. and the Sg. C. over D. C. to end of row taking both sides of stitch in all succeeding rows. 2 stitches into last stitch 2 Ch. turn.

Row 3—1 Sg. C. over each D. C. 1 D. C. over each Sg. C. to end of row. 2 stitches into last stitch, repeat these rows until 14 rows are made.

EDGE—3 Ch. 1 D. C. in same space skip 1 stitch 1 Sg. C. into next stitch 3 Ch. 1 D. C. in same space skip 1 stitch 1 D. C. into next stitch, repeat the edge all around cap, join and break thread.

Turn the shield away back on the two ends but only about 6 rows in front. Fasten the sides of shield with ribbon bows, as indicated in cut.

(Age 2-3 years)



### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Knitting and Crochet Perle (Art. 611A)

No. 3 Light Blue or any desirable color, 2 balls

1 button Mould  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch in diameter

Columbia Bone Crochet Hook, No. 2

### INSTRUCTIONS

Do not work this cap tight. Chain 3 stitches join 5 Sg. C. into ring.

ROUND 2—2 Sg. C. into each stitch.

ROUND 3—1 Sg. C. into each of 10 stitches, do not join but work around and around.

ROUND 4—1 Sg. C. into first stitch 2 Sg. C. into second stitch 1 Sg. C. into third stitch, 2 Sg. C. into fourth stitch, repeat all around.

ROUND 5—1 Sg. C. in each stitch.

ROUND 6—1 Sg. C. in each of two stitches, 2 Sg. C. into next stitch, repeat all around.

ROUND 7—1 Sg. C. into each stitch.

ROUND 8—1 Sg. C. into each of 3 stitches 2 Sg. C. into next stitch, repeat all around.

ROUND 9—1 Sg. C. in each stitch.

ROUND 10—1 Sg. C. into each of next 4 stitches 2 Sg. C. into next stitch repeat all around, continue these two rounds until there are 16 stitches between each of the 5 sections, which should be done in 30 rounds.

ROUND 31—1 Sg. C. into each stitch, work 18 rounds in same way.

FOR TURN BACK—Holding Cap from you work 1 Sg. C. into back of each stitch.

ROUND 2—1 Sg. C. into first stitch, always

taking both sides of stitch draw up a loop in next stitch work 4 Ch. on this loop and draw through both stitches on hook, 1 Sg. C. into next stitch draw up loop in next stitch, 4 on this loop, draw through both stitches on hook, 1 Sg. C. in next stitch, repeat all around.

ROUND 3—1 Sg. C. taking both sides of stitch into each stitch.

ROUND 4—Same as Round 2, repeat these two rounds until there are 6 rows of fancy stitches ending with 1 row of Sg. C.

TO FINISH CAP—Turn down point to meet the turn over and finish with button.

BUTTON—3 Ch. join 6 Sg. C. into ring.

ROUND 2—2 Sg. C. into each stitch, do not join, work around and around.

ROUND 3—1 Sg. C. in first stitch, 2 Sg. C. into next stitch, repeat all around.

ROUND 4—1 Sg. C. into each of next 2 stitches 2 Sg. C. into third stitch, repeat all around.

ROUND 5—1 Sg. C. into each of 3 stitches, 2 Sg. C. into next stitch repeat these rounds until large enough to cover the mould, insert mould, work 1 Sg. C. skip 1 stitch 1 Sg. C. in next stitch, skip 1 stitch, repeat until closed.

ROUND 5—5 Ch. 1 D. C. in same stitch where Ch. is made, 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in next D. C. \* 2 Ch. 1 D. C. into next D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in same stitch, 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in next D. C. repeat from \* all around widening in every other M. join 36 M. in round.

ROUND 6—3 Ch. 2 D. C. into first space 1 D. C. over D. C. 2 M. 4 D. C. 2 M. 4 D. C. all around, join.

ROUND 7—1 D. C. into last of 4 D. C. \* 2 D. C. over space 1 D. C. into D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in same D. C. 2 D. C. over next space. 1 D. C. over D. C. 2 Ch. skip 2 D. C. 1 D. C. into last D. C. repeat from \* all around join.

ROUND 8—3 Ch. 2 D. C. into space 1 D. C. over first of 4 D. C. 3 M. 4 D. C. 3 M. 4 D. C. all around, join.

ROUND 9—5 Ch. 1 D. C. into same space where Ch. is, 4 M. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in same space, 4 M. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in same space repeat all around. There should be 60 M. in round.

ROUND 10—3 Ch. 2 D. C. in space, 1 D. C. over D. C. 4 M. 4 D. C. 4 M. 4 D. C. all around, join.

ROUND 11—5 Ch. 1 D. C. in last of 4 D. C. 1 M. 4 D. C. 1 M. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in same stitch \* 1 M. 4 D. C. 1 M. 4 D. C. 1 M. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in same stitch repeat from \* all around, join.

ROUND 12—3 Ch. 2 D. C. over M. 1 D. C. in D. C. 5 M. 4 D. C. 5 M. 4 D. C. all around, join.

ROUND 13—5 Ch. 1 D. C. in last of 4 D. C. 3 M. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in same stitch, 6 M. \* 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in same stitch, 6 M. repeat from \* all around join. There should be 84 M. in round.

ROUND 14—3 Ch. 2 D. C. in each space 1 D. C. over each D. C. join.

ROUND 15—84 M. in round, join.

ROUND 16—84 M. in round, join, this finishes back of cap.

FACE—Row 1—2 M. 4 D. C. 1 M. 4 D. C. \* 5 M. 4 D. C. 1 M. 4 D. C. repeat from \* until 8 flowers are started, ending with 2 M. leaves 13 M. for back of cap, 5 Ch. turn.

Row 2—1 M. 7 D. C. 1 M. 7 D. C. 3 M. \* 7 D.



C. 1 M. 7 D. C. 3 M. repeat from \* to end of row, ending with 1 M. 5 Ch. turn.

Row 3—71 M. in row, 5 Ch. turn.

Row 4—1 M. 7 D. C. 1 M. 7 D. C. 3 M. \* 7 D. C. 1 M. 7 D. C. 3 M. repeat from \* to end of row 5 Ch. turn.

Row 5—2 M. 4 D. C. 1 M. 4 D. C. 5 M. \* 4 D. C. 1 M. 4 D. C. 5 M. repeat from \* to end of row, 5 Ch. turn.

Row 6—6 M. 4 D. C. 1 M. 4 D. C. 5 M. \* 4 D. C. 1 M. 4 D. C. 5 M. repeat from \* to end, 5 Ch. turn.

Row 10—2 D. C. in each space 1 D. C. over each D. C. 5 Ch. turn.

Row 11—71 M. 5 Ch. turn.

Row 12—2 M. 4 D. C. 1 M. 4 D. C. 5 M. \* 4 D. C. 1 M. 4 D. C. 5 M. repeat from \* to end, 5 Ch. turn.

Row 13—Same as row 2.

Row 14—71 M.

Row 15—Same as row 4.

Row 16—Same as row 5.

Row 17—71 M. 3 Ch. turn.

EDGE—2 D. C. in first M. 1 D. C. over D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sl. St. back into first Ch. to form P. 2 D. C. in next M. 1 D. C. over D. C. 3 Ch. for P. Repeat all around cap, join and break thread.

ROUND 2—2 Sg. C. into each stitch, 16 stitches in round, do not join work around and around.

ROUND 3—2 Sg. C. in first stitch 1 Sg. C. into next stitch, repeat all around, 24 stitches in round.

ROUND 4—2 Sg. C. in first stitch 1 Sg. C. into each of two stitches, 2 Sg. C. into next, repeat all around, 32 stitches in round.

ROUND 5—2 Sg. C. in first stitch 1 Sg. C. into each of 3 stitches, 2 Sg. C. into next stitch, repeat all around, 40 stitches in round.

ROUND 6—2 Sg. C. in first stitch, 1 Sg. C. into each of 4 stitches, 2 Sg. C. into next stitch, repeat all around, 48 stitches in round. Close round with a Sl. St.

ROUND 7—3 Ch. 1 D. C. into next stitch, 2 Ch. 1 D. C. into same stitch, 1 D. C. into next stitch \* skip 1 stitch, 1 D. C. into next stitch, 1 D. C. into next stitch, 2 Ch. 1 D. C. into same stitch, 1 D. C. into next stitch, repeat from \* all around join. There should be 12 spaces with 2 Ch. between in round.

ROUND 8—Sl. St. first 2 stitches 1 Sl. St. under 2 Ch. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. over 2 Ch. \* 10 Tr. over next 2 Ch. 2 D. C. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. over next two Ch. repeat from \* all around join.

ROUND 9—Sl. St. into centre of shell, 3 Ch. 1 D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. in centre of shell, 1 Sg. C. over 10 Tr. shell over shell, repeat all around join.

ROUND 10—Shell over shell, 1 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into first Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over each following Sg. C. 1 Ch. shell over shell, repeat all around, join.

ROUND 11—Shell 2 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in first loop of 3 Ch. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into each following loop, 2 Ch. shell over shell, repeat all around, join.

ROUND 13—Shell 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over first loop 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over each following loop 4 Ch. shell.

ROUND 14—Shell 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over first loop 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over each following loop, 5 Ch. shell.

ROUND 15—2 D. C. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. over first shell, 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in first loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in each following loop, 6 Ch. 2 D. C. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. 2 Ch. 2 D. C. into next shell, repeat all around.

ROUND 16—Shell over first 2 Ch. 3 Ch. shell over next 2 Ch. 7 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over first loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over each following loop, 7 Ch. shell 3 Ch. shell, repeat all around.

ROUND 17—Shell 3 Ch. 2 D. C. over loop, 3 Ch. shell 8 Ch. work pineapple as before, 8 Ch. shell 3 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. shell, repeat all around.

ROUND 18—Shell 3 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. shell 9 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over loop 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next loop 9 Ch. shell 3 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. shell, repeat all around.

ROUND 19—Shell 3 Ch. 2 D. C. over each space shell 10 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into top of pineapple, 10 Ch. shell, repeat all around.

**ROUND 20**—Shell 3 Ch. 2 D. C. over each space shell 6 Ch. skip the pineapple, shell over shell 3 Ch. 2 D. C. over each space repeat all around.

**ROUND 21**—2 D. C. into centre of shell \* 3 Ch. 2 D. C. over each space 3 Ch. 2 D. C. in centre of next shell 3 Ch. 2 D. C. into first 2 of 6 Ch. 3 Ch. 2 D. C. into the last 2 of 6 Ch. 3 Ch. 2 D. C. in centre of shell, repeat from \* all around.

**ROUND 22**—2 D. C. 3 Ch. into each space join, this finishes back of cap, turn cap.

**FACE**—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of each space making 47 loops and leaving the 7 spaces for back of cap, 5 Ch. turn.

**Row 2**—1 Sg. C. in first loop 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into following 4 loops, 3 Ch. 5 D. C. into next loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into next or 7th loop \* 5 loops of 5 Ch. each into next 5 loops, 3 Ch. 6 D. C. into next loop 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into next loop repeat from \* until 6 patterns are started, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into next loop 4 loops into last 4 loops, 5 Ch. turn.

**Row 3**—1 Sg. C. into first loop 4 loops over next 4 loops \* 1 loop over 3 Ch. skip the 5 D. C. 1 loop into next 3 Ch. 5 loops over next 5 loops repeat from \* to end of row, 5 Ch. turn.

**Row 4**—1 Sg. C. over first loop 3 loops over 3 loops \* 3 Ch. 5 D. C. over next loop 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next loop 3 Ch. 5 D. C. over next loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next loop, 3 loops over 3 loops repeat from \* to end of row 5 Ch. turn.

**Row 5**—1 Sg. C. over first loop, 3 loops over next 3 loops 1 loop over 3 Ch. skip shell, 1 loop over next 3 Ch. 3 loops over next 3 loops repeat to end of row, 5 Ch. turn.

**Row 6**—1 Sg. C. over first loop 2 loops over next 2 loops \* 3 Ch. 5 D. C. over next loop 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next loop, 3 Ch. 5 D. C. over next loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next loop, 3 Ch. 5 D. C. over next loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next loop, 1 loop over next loop 3 Ch. repeat from \* to end of row, 5 Ch. turn.

**Row 7**—1 Sg. C. over first loop 2 loops over next 2 loops 1 loop over first 3 Ch. 1 loop over each following 3 Ch. skipping the shells repeat to end of row, 5 Ch. turn.

**Row 8**—1 Sg. C. over first loop, 3 loops over next 3 loops, 3 Ch. 1 shell over next loop 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next loop, 3 Ch. 1 shell over next loop 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next shell 3 loops over next 3 loops, repeat to end of row, 5 Ch. turn.

**Row 9**—1 Sg. C. over first loop 1 loop over each loop skipping the shell, 5 Ch. turn.

**Row 10**—1 Sg. C. over first loop, 4 loops over next 4 loops, 3 Ch. shell 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 5 loops, 3 Ch. shell, repeat to end of row, 5 Ch. turn.

**Row 11**—1 Sg. C. into first loop, loop over each loop skipping shell, this finishes one pattern. Repeat these 11 rows for one more pattern, but work loops in 21st and 22nd rows all around cap.

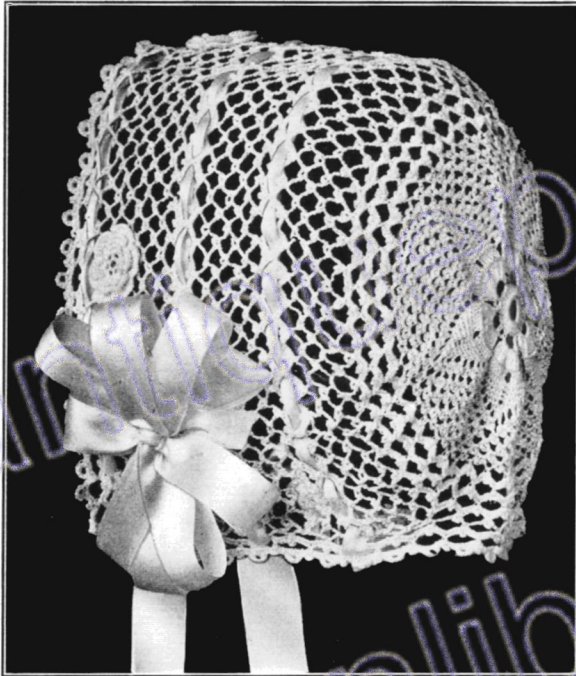
**Row 23**—5 Ch. 1 Tr. in first loop in corner of cap, 3 Ch. 2 Tr. in same loop, 3 Ch. 2 Tr. in each following loop making 4 Tr. with 3 Ch. between into next corner of cap, 3 Ch. 2 Tr. around bottom join.

**EDGE**—5 Ch. 1 Tr. in same space where Ch. is made 1 Sg. C. into first of the two Tr. in next space, 5 Ch. 1 Tr. in same space, 1 Sg. C. into first of next 2 Tr. 5 Ch. 1 Tr. and repeat all around, join, break thread and finish.



## Columbia Child's Cap

IN BABY IRISH. (Age 1-2 years)



### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Crochet (Art. 200) No. 60  
1 ball

Columbia Steel Crochet Hook, No. 12

### INSTRUCTIONS

Ch. 12 stitches join, 3 Ch. 35 D. C. into ring, counting the 3 Ch. as 1 D. C. join.

ROUND 2—6 Ch. skip 3 stitches, 1 Sg. C. into 4th stitch 3 Ch. skip 1 stitch 1 Sg. C. into next stitch, 6 Ch. skip 3 stitches 1 Sg. C. into next stitch, 3 Ch. skip 1 stitch 1 Sg. C. into next stitch, repeat these loops until you have 6 large and 6 small loops ending with the small loop, which should be joined on to the first Ch. made.

ROUND 3—4 Ch. 17 Tr. into large loop, 18 Tr. into each of following large loops, join.

ROUND 4—Sl. St. first Tr. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. into each of 6 following stitches, 2 Ch. skip 2 Tr. in centre 7 D. C. over next 7 Tr. \* 3 Ch. skip last and first Tr. 7 D. C. into next 7 D. C. 2 Ch. skip 2 Tr. in centre, 7 D. C. over 7 Tr. and repeat from \* all around, ending with 7 D. C.

ROUND 5—3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over same loop, 3 Ch. \* skip first D. C. 6 Sg. C. over 6 D. C. 2 Ch. 6 Sg. C. over 6 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over same loop, 3 Ch. and repeat from \* all around ending with 6 Sg. C.

ROUND 6—3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over first large loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over same loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over next large loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over same loop (these loops are called baby Irish and will be mentioned only as loops, the small loop must always be skipped) 3 Ch. skip first Sg. C. 5 Sg. C. over next 5 Sg. C. 2 Ch. 5 Sg. C. over 5 Sg. C. 3 loops and repeat all around ending with 5 Sg. C.

ROUND 7—4 loops 4 Sg. C. 2 Ch. 4 Sg. C. repeat all around.

ROUND 8—5 loops 3 Sg. C. 2 Ch. 3 Sg. C. all around.

ROUND 9—6 loops, 2 Sg. C. 2 Ch. 2 Sg. C. all around.

ROUND 10—7 loops 1 Sg. C. over second Sg. C. 2 Sg. C. over Ch. in centre, 1 Sg. C. over next Sg. C. 7 loops, repeat all around.

ROUND 11—8 loops 2 Sg. C. in centre of 4 Sg. C. 8 loops repeat all around.

ROUND 12—Baby Irish loop all around, work 3 more rounds of same, join with Sl. St.

ROUND 16—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into each loop all around, join.

ROUND 17—6 Sg. C. over loop \* 1 Sg. C. into Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into same Sg. C. 6 Sg. C. over next loop repeat from \* all around ending with 1 Sg. C. in Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in same Sg. C.

ROUND 18—Sl. St. 3 stitches, 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of next 7 Sg. C. all around.

ROUND 19—Same as 17.

ROUND 20—Same as 18.

ROUND 21—Same as 17.

ROUND 22—Same as 18.

ROUND 23—Sl. St. 3 Ch. 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of next loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into same stitch, 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of next loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into same stitch, repeat the Baby Irish all around, join, this finishes back of cap.



**FACE**—Row 1—Turn cap, 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in centre of first loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in same, 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in centre of next stitch, repeat to within 6 loops of round, leaving these for back of cap, 6 Ch. turn.

Row 2—1 Sg. C. in first loop, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in same loop, 6 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in next loop, repeat to end of row, leaving off the 6 loops in back, turn.

Rows 3, 4 AND 5—Same as 2nd row.

Row 6—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in centre of each loop, turn.

Row 7—6 Sg. C. over each loop, 1 Sg. C. into Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in same stitch, 6 Sg. C. over next loop, repeat to end of row, turn.

Row 8—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in centre of 7 Sg. C. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in centre of next 7 Sg. C. repeat to end of row, turn.

Row 9—6 Sg. C. over loop, 1 Sg. C. over Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over same Sg. C. 6 Sg. C. over next loop, repeat to end of row.

Rows 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 AND 15—Same as rows 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, making one more row in same way.

Rows 16, 17, 18 AND 19—Same as rows 6, 7, 8 and 9.

Rows 20 to 30—Baby Irish same as rows 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, making 10 rows Baby Irish.

Row 31—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. all around cap.

Row 32—6 Sg. C. over each loop, 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into each Sg. C. all around cap.

Row 33—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in centre of 7 Sg. C. all around cap.

Row 34—5 Sg. C. over first loop, 5 Ch. 1 Sl. St. back into 2nd Sg. C. just made, 5 Sg. C. over this small loop, 2 Sg. C. over unfinished loop \* 1 Sg. C. into Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in same space, 5 Sg. C. over next loop, 5 Ch. 1 Sl. St. back into 2nd Sg. C. just made, 5 Sg. C. over small loop 2 Sg. C. over unfinished loop and repeat from \* all around cap, join and break thread.

Cap can be used as it is now, but if liked the roses can be sewed to the front of cap as indicated in cut.

**ROSES**—Ch. 5 stitches join, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into ring, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. repeat until you have 6 loops in ring.

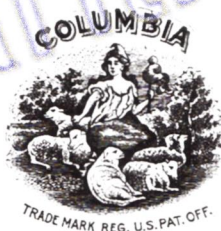
**ROUND 2**—1 Sg. C. 5 D. C. 1 Sg. C. into each of 6 loops join.

**ROUND 3**—Ch. 4, turn rose and catch around first spoke of second round with a Sl. St. 3 Ch. 1 Sl. St. around 2nd spoke, repeat all around turn.

**ROUND 4**—1 Sg. C. in first loop, 7 D. C. 1 Sg. C. in same loop, 1 Sg. C. 7 D. C. 1 Sg. C. in next loop, repeat in all the loops, 5 Ch. turn.

**ROUND 5**—Catch around first spoke of 4th round with Sl. St. 5 Ch. 1 Sl. St. around second spoke, repeat all around turn.

**ROUND 6**—1 Sg. C. 9 D. C. 1 Sg. C. in each loop join and break thread.



## Columbia Child's Cap

IRISH CROCHET WITH FAN DESIGN. (Age 1 to 2 years)



### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Crochet (Art. 200) 1 ball No. 60  
Columbia Steel Crochet Hook, No. 12

### INSTRUCTIONS

Chain 10 stitches join, 12 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into ring turn, 10 Sg. C. over half of 12 Ch. just made, 10 Ch. \* turn 1 Sg. C. into ring turn, 10 Sg. C. over 10 Ch. first made 10 Ch. repeat from \* until there are 15 bars covered with Sg. C. including the first one 3 Ch. join onto the last Sg. C. of first bar.

ROUND 2—5 Sg. C. over each space between bars, join.

ROUND 3—Sl. St. over first 3 Sg. C. 5 Ch. 1 Sl. St. back into 2nd Ch. 5 Ch. 1 Sl. St. back into second Ch. 1 Ch. this makes 1 P. L. (picot loop) 1 Sg. C. into centre of next 5 Sg. C. work 1 P. L. into centre of each 5 Sg. C. making 15 P. L. around.

ROUND 4—1 P. L. into centre of first P. L. 1 P. L. into each following P. L. 15 P. L. around, join

by making only half picot loop and catching same into centre of first P. L.

ROUND 5—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into same stitch where Ch. starts 12 Ch. \* turn 1 Sg. C. into ring just made, turn 10 Sg. C. over half of 12 Ch. first made, 10 Ch. turn 1 Sg. C. into ring turn, 10 Sg. C. over chains 10 Ch. repeat until 6 bars are made 3 Ch. turn, 1 Sg. C. into centre of picot on right hand side next to fan, turn, 5 Sg. C. over each space between bars making 6 times 5 Sg. C. do not work over last Chs. 1 Sg. C. into centre of next P. L. on left hand side of fan, 1 P. L. into centre of next P. L. 5 Ch. in same space to form ring. 12 Ch. and repeat from \* all around having 7 fans in round, join.

ROUND 6—Sl. St. over first 3 Sg. C. on fan, 1 P. L. in centre of each 5 Sg. C. across fan making 5 P. L. over fan, 1 P. L. into centre of first 5 Sg. C. on 2nd fan, 5 P. L. over fan, repeat all around, join.

ROUNDS 7, 8 AND 9—1 P. L. in centre of each P. L.

ROUND 10—3 P. L. over first 3 P. L. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into next P. L. turn, 7 Sg. C. over 5 Ch. just made, 4 Ch. turn, 1 D. C. into first Sg. C. 1 Ch. 1 D. C. into each following Sg. C. 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into same last Sg. C. this forms shell, 3 P. L. into centre of next P. L. 3 P. L. 1 shell repeat all around, there should be 10 shells with 3 P. L. between.

ROUND 11—1 P. L. over each P. L. 3 times, 1 P. L. into point of shell, 1 P. L. into centre of shell, 1 P. L. into next point 3 P. L. over next 3 P. L. repeat all around.

ROUND 12—P. L. all around, this finishes back of cap.

FACE—Turn cap and work P. L. around to within 6 P. L. these are for back of cap, 1 P. L. turn.

Row 2—1 Sg. C. in centre of first P. L. 1 P. L. in centre of each following P. L. leaving 6 in back, 1 P. L. turn.

Row 3—1 P. L. in centre of each P. L. 1 P. L. turn.

Row 4—3 P. L. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into next P. L. \* 12 Ch. turn 1 Sg. C. over the 5 Ch. turn, 10 Sg. C. over 12 Ch. 10 Ch. repeat fan same as before when 6 bars are finished work 3 Ch. skip 1 P. L. on right hand side 1 Sg. C. in centre of next P. L.

5 Sg. C. between each bar, 6 times, skip 1 P. L. on left hand side 1 Sg. C. into next P. L. 1 P. L. over next P. L. 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into next P. L. repeat from \* to end of row, there should be 9 fans with 1 P. L. between each and three P. L. at each end 1 P. L. turn.

Row 5—1 Sg. C. in first P. L. \* 1 P. L. skip first 5 Sg. C. 1 Sg. C. in centre of next 5 Sg. C. 1 P. L. over centre of next 3 spaces of 5 Sg. C. 1 P. L. skip the last space of 5 Sg. C. 1 Sg. C. into P. L. between first and second fan, repeat from \* to end of row 1 P. L. turn.

ROWS 6, 7, 8 AND 9—1 P. L. in each P. L. 1 P. L. turn.

Row 10—4 P. L. 5 Ch. \* 1 Sg. C. into next P. L. turn, 7 Sg. C. over 5 Ch. 4 Ch. turn, 1 D. C. with 1 Ch. between each, over each Sg. C. 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. in last stitch, 4 P. L. 5 Ch. repeat from \* to end of row, 9 shells in row, 1 P. L. turn.

Row 11—2 P. L. over first 2 P. L. 1 P. L. into second D. C. on shell, 1 P. L. into 6th D. C. on shell, 1 P. L. into next P. L. repeat to end of row 1 P. L. turn.

ROWS 12 AND 13—Repeat P. L. in each P. L.

Row 14—Repeat row of fans same as Row 4. 9 fans in row.

Row 15—Same as row 5, but work the P. L. around bottom of cap, join.

Row 16—Turn 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of each P. L. all around cap, join.

Row 17—3 Sg. C. 4 Ch. to form picot 3 Sg. C. over each loop all around cap, join, break thread and finish.

## Columbia Infant's Cap



### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Crochet (Art. 200), No. 70  
1 ball

Columbia Steel Crochet Hook, No. 12

### INSTRUCTIONS

Wind cotton around finger about 12 times to form a ring, work 60 Tr. into ring, join.

ROUND 2—10 Ch. skip 6 Tr. 1 Sg. C. into seventh Tr. 4 Ch. skip 3 Tr. 1 Sg. C. into next, 10 Ch. skip 6 Tr. 1 Sg. C. into next 4 Ch. skip 3 Tr. 1 Sg. C. into next, repeat until you have 6 large and 6 small loops all around and join.

ROUND 3—3 Ch. 24 Tr. into first large loop, skip small loop and work \* 24 Tr. into next lace loop \* repeat all around.

ROUND 4—3 Ch. skip 1 Tr. work 21 D. C. into next 21 Tr. on first loop, leaving 1 Tr. at end, 4 Ch., skip 1 Tr. on next loop \* work 22 D. C. into next 22 stitches, 4 Ch. and \* repeat all around.

ROUND 5—Do not join, make 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of 4 Ch. in previous row, 4 Ch., skip first D. C., work \* 20 Sg. C. into next 20 D. C., 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of 4 Ch. 4 Ch. 20 Sg. C. \* repeat all around.

ROUND 6—4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of 4 Ch. \* 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of next 4 Ch. 4 Ch. 18 Sg. C. over next 18 Sg. C. 4 Ch., repeat all around.

ROUND 7—\* 4 times 4 Ch. with 1 Sg. C. between 16 Sg. C. over next 16 Sg. C. \* repeat all around.

ROUND 8—\* 5 times 4 Ch. with 1 Sg. C. between 14 Sg. C. over next 14 Sg. C. \* repeat all around.

ROUND 9—\* 6 times 4 Ch. with 1 Sg. C. between 12 Sg. C. over next 12 Sg. C. \* repeat all around.

ROUND 10—\* 7 times 4 Ch. with 1 Sg. C. between 10 Sg. C. over next 10 Sg. C. \* repeat all around.

ROUND 11—\* 8 times 4 Ch. with 1 Sg. C. between 8 Sg. C. over next 8 Sg. C. \* repeat all around.

ROUND 12—\* 9 times 4 Ch. with 1 Sg. C. between 6 Sg. C. over next 6 Sg. C. \* repeat all around.

ROUND 13—\* 10 times 4 Ch. with 1 Sg. C. between 4 Sg. C. over next 4 Sg. C. \*

ROUND 14—\* 11 times 4 Ch. with 1 Sg. C. between 2 Sg. C. over next 2 Sg. C. \*

ROUND 15—\* loops of 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. all around, skip the 2 Sg. C. over star, and work the Sg. C. into next loop, all around.

ROUND 16—2 Ch. 8 D. C. into loop over point of star, 2 Ch. \* 1 Sg. C. into next loop 9 times 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. between 2 Ch. 8 D. C. into next loop over star 2 Ch. repeat all around.

ROUND 17—4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over the 2 Ch. 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of 8 D. C. 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. over centre of next 2 Ch. continue making 4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. all around.

ROUND 18—4 Ch. 1 Sg. C. all around.

ROUND 19—6 D. C. into every loop all around cap, join.

Row 20—2 Ch. skip 4 stitches, 1 D. C. 2 Ch. skip 4 stitches, 1 D. C., work these from first point of star to the sixth point leaving the last space between two points for back of cap.

Row 21—Turn 2 Ch. 1 D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. front of cap.

Row 22—5 Ch. 4 D. C. in same space, skip 1 mesh, 1 Sg. C. into next mesh, \* 5 Ch. 4 D. C. in same space, skip 1 mesh, 1 Sg. C. into next mesh, \* repeat for row.

Row 23—5 Ch. 4 D. C. in same space 1 Sg. C. into the point formed by 5 Ch. of previous row, \* 5 Ch. 4 D. C. in same space 1 Sg. C. into next point \* repeat for whole row.

Row 24—5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into point, \* 5 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into next point, \* repeat for row.

Row 25—2 Ch. 1 D. C. into Sg. C. \* 2 Ch. 1 D. C. over centre of 5 Ch. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. into Sg. C. \* repeat for row.

Row 26—2 Ch. 1 D. C. in each space.

Row 27—2 Ch. skip 1 space, 4 D. C. into next space, \* 2 Ch. skip 1 space, 4 D. C. into next \* repeat.

Row 28—4 D. C. 2 Ch. 4 D. C. 2 Ch. repeat.

Row 29—2 Ch. 4 D. C. \* 2 Ch. 4 D. C. \* repeat.

Row 30—4 D. C. 2 Ch. \* 4 D. C. 2 Ch. \* repeat.

Row 31—2 Ch. 1 D. C. into first D. C. \* 2 Ch. 1 D. C. into last D. C. 2 Ch. 1 D. C. into first D. C. \* repeat.

Row 32—2 Ch. 1 D. C. into each space.

Row 33—Same as 22d row.

Row 34—Same as 23d row.

Row 35—Same as 24th row.

Row 36—Same as 25th row but making the mesh on bottom of cap.

Row 37—Same as 26th row, working all around cap, make two meshes into each corner.

Row 38—3 D. C. 4 Ch. for picot, 3 D. C. into first space, \* skip one space, 3 D. C. 4 Ch. for P. 3 D. C. into next space \* repeat all around cap.

Row 39—2 Ch. 1 D. C. into centre of scallop between the 6 D. C. catching down into 36th row, \* 2 Ch. 1 D. C. into space between scallops, 2 Ch. 1 D. C. into centre of scallop; repeat all around.

Row 40—Same as 37th row.

Row 41—Same as 38th row.

Row 42—Same as 37th row.



## Columbia Infant's Cap

### MATERIAL

Columbia Mercerized Crochet (Art. 200), No. 30, 1 ball white  
 Columbia Mercerized Crochet (Art. 571), No. 70, 2 balls pink or blue  
 Columbia Sylvia, 1 ball yellow  
 Columbia Steel Crochet Hook No. 9

### INSTRUCTIONS

This cap is made in three parts. Start on 70 Ch. turn, 1 D. C. into fourth Ch. from hook, 1 D. C. into next stitch, 3 Ch. skip 3 stitches 1 Sg. C. into fourth, 3 Ch. skip 3 stitches 1 D. C. into fourth stitch, 3 Ch. Repeat to end, when you will have 9 sections, make 2 D. C. into last two stitches having two D. C. on each end through the whole work.

Row 2—3 Ch. 1 D. C. on end, 7 Ch. 1 D. C. \* into D. C. of previous row, 7 Ch. 1 D. C. \* repeat for whole row, 2 D. C. on end, 3 Ch., turn.

Row 3—1 D. C. into D. C. on end, 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of 7 Ch. in previous row, 3 Ch. 1 D. C. into D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of next 7 Ch. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. into D. C. \* 7 D. C. on 7 Ch. 1 D. C. into D. C. 7 D. C. on next 7 Ch. 1 D. C. in D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of 7 Ch. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. into D. C. Repeat from \* 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of 7 Ch. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. repeat to end of row, Ch. 3, turn.

Row 4—1 D. C. into D. C. 7 Ch. 1 D. C. into D. C. 7 Ch. 17 D. C. over 17 D. C. over 17 D. C. in previous row, 7 Ch. 17 D. C. 7 Ch. 1 D. C. 7 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. turn.

Row 5—1 D. C. into D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. into centre of 7 Ch. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. into D. C. 7 D. C. into 7 Ch. 1 D. C. into D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 9 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 9 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. turn.

Row 6—1 D. C. 7 Ch. 9 D. C. 7 Ch. 1 D. C. 7 Ch. 9 D. C. 7 Ch. 1 D. C. 7 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. turn.

Row 7—1 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 9 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 9 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 9 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. turn.



Row 8—Same as sixth row.

Row 9—1 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. into D. C. 7 D. C. over 7 Ch. 1 D. C. into D. C. 7 D. C. over 7 Ch. 1 D. C. into D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 17 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 1 D. C. 3 Ch. 1 Sg. C. 3 Ch. 2 D. C. 3 Ch. turn.

Row 10—Same as fourth row—this concludes one pattern. Make two patterns, break thread. Make one more piece the same as first made, then make one piece with 7 patterns.

To make the little roses, these should be made out of the No. 70 Crochet in pink or blue, make a Ch. of 5 and join into this work 1 Sg. C. 4 D. C. 1 Sg. C. 4 D. C. 1 Sg. C. 4 D. C. 1 Sg. C. 4 D. C. 1 Sg. C. or to form 5 petals, break thread and finish on back.

To JOIN CAP—The long piece forms the centre of cap—the short pieces go on the sides, sew one short piece to side of long piece, bend the short end and sew it toward the front of the short piece; sew opposite side the same way, holding in the centre in order to give it a curved effect. Crochet a picot edge all around cap, hold in the back a little. Now make enough of the small roses to go all around cap, and around the two seams on sides, sew these to the cap with a little French knot made out of the yellow Sylvia Cotton. Trim with ribbon rosettes on sides.

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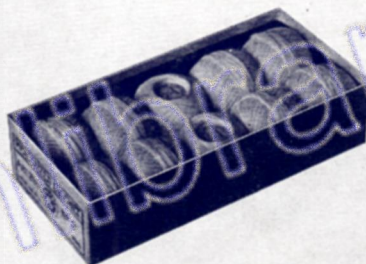
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
