## **IS YOURS FOR THE MAKING**

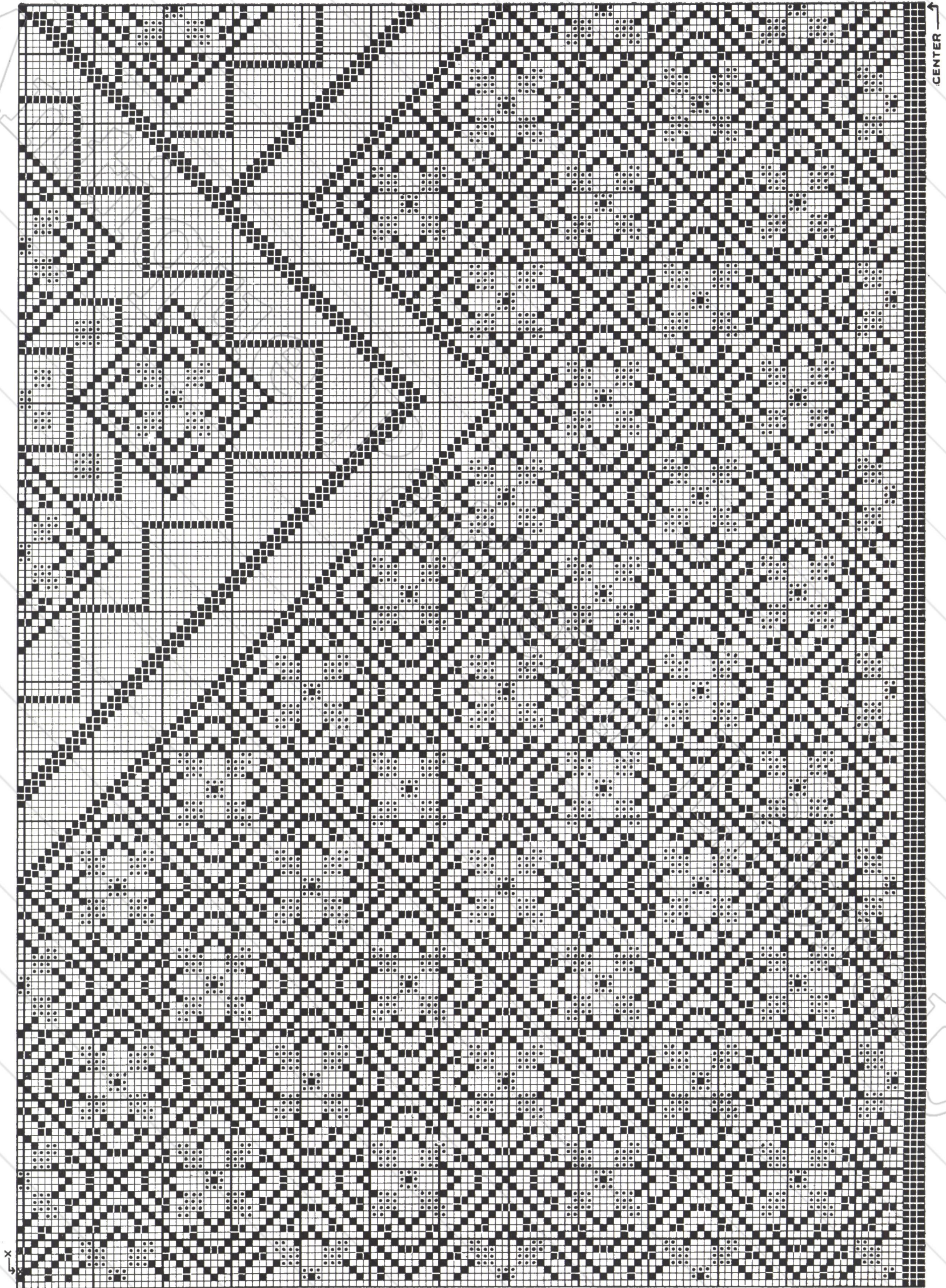

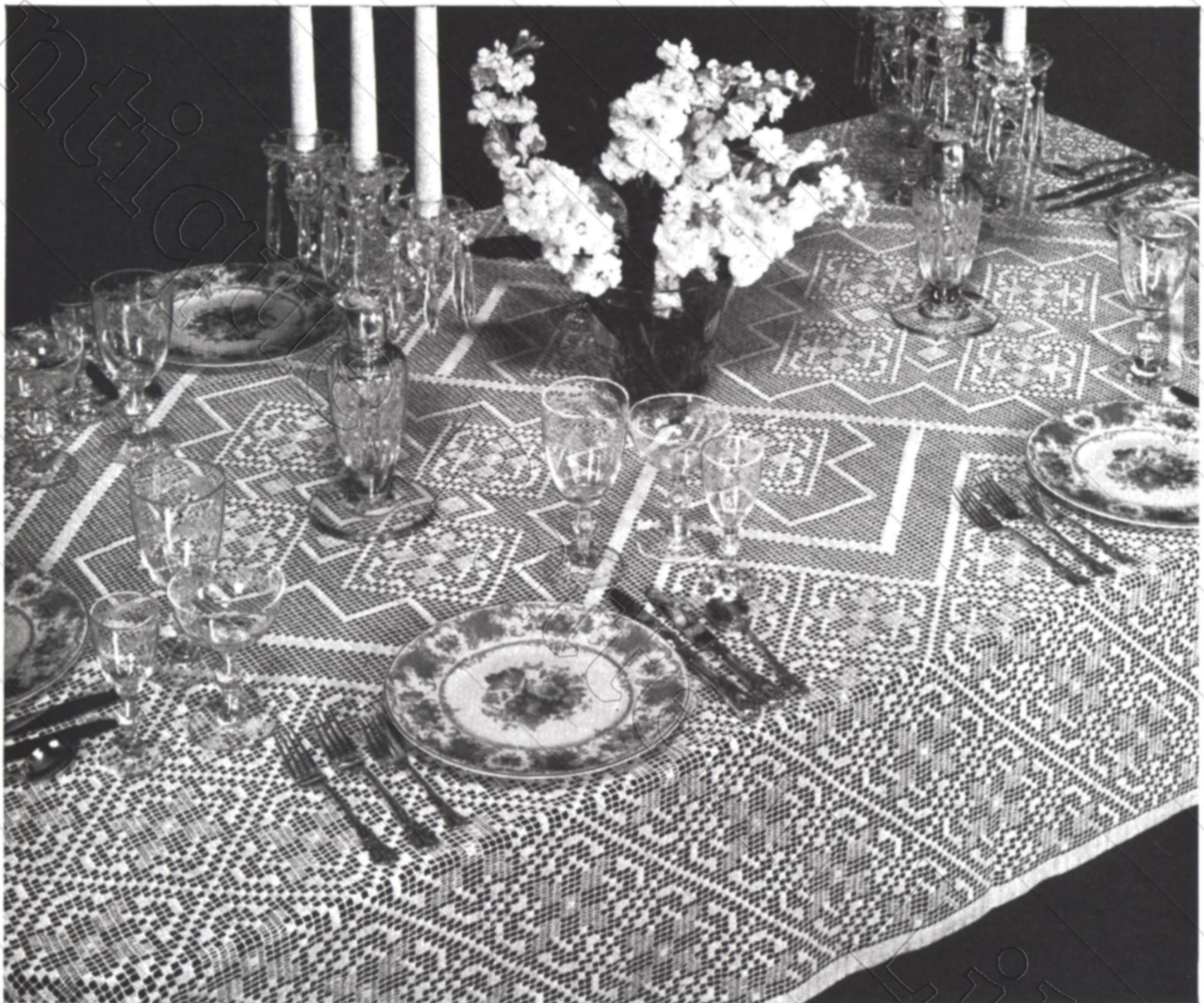

**MATERIALS:**

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BIG BALL  
BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, *size 30*,

CLARK'S O.N.T.—32 balls of *White or Ecreu*,

OR

J. & P. COATS—32 balls of *White or Ecreu*, or 43 balls  
of *any color*.

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook *No. 11*.

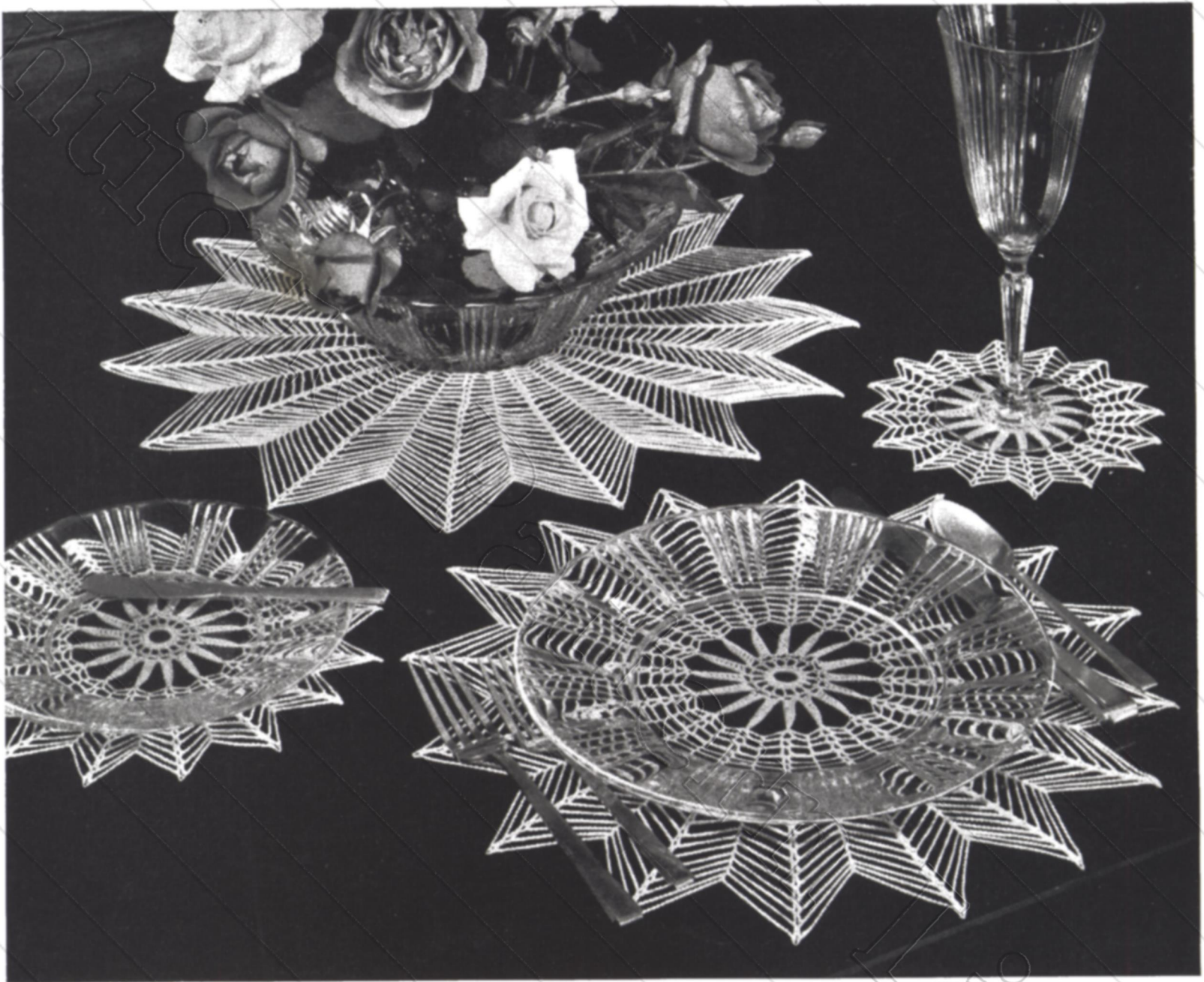
**GAUGE:** 4 sps make 1 inch; 4 rows make 1 inch. Completed tablecloth measures 65 x 93 inches.

Starting at bottom of chart, make a chain 2 yards long (16 ch sts to 1 inch). **1st row:** Tr in 5th ch from hook and in next 11 ch (13 tr counting the turning ch as 1 tr), \* ch 3, skip 3 ch, tr in next ch (sp made).

Repeat from \* across, until there are 255 sps in all. Mark every 25th sp with a safety pin as an aid in counting. Work tr in next 12 ch, then cut off remaining chain. Ch 4, turn. **2nd row:** Tr in next 12 tr (3 bls made). Ch 3, tr in next tr (sp made over sp); 3 tr in next sp, tr in next tr (bl made over sp); ch 1, skip 1 ch, tr in next ch, ch 1, tr in next tr (shadow sp made over sp). Ch 3, tr in next tr (another sp made). Make 4 more sps, 3 tr in next sp, tr in next tr (another bl made); 2 sps, 1 bl, 3 sps, 1 bl, 3 sps, 1 bl, 2 sps, 1 bl, 5 sps, then ch 1, skip 1 ch, tr in next ch, ch 1, tr in next tr (another shadow sp made). Make \* 1 bl, 1 shadow sp, 5 sps, 1 bl, 2 sps, 1 bl, 3 sps, 1 bl, 3 sps, 1 bl, 2 sps, 1 bl, 5 sps, 1 shadow sp. Repeat from \* 7 more times. Make 1 bl, 1 sp, tr in next 11 tr, tr in top of turning ch. Ch 4, turn. **3rd row:** 3 bls, 1 sp, then

## MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS  
BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, *size 20,*

### SMALL BALL:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—14 balls of *White or Ecreu,*  
OR

J. & P. COATS—10 balls of *White or Ecreu.*

### BIG BALL:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—6 balls of *White or Ecreu,*  
OR

J. & P. COATS—6 balls of *White or Ecreu,* or 7 balls  
of *any color.*

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook *No. 9 or 10.*

The above materials are sufficient for a set consisting  
of centerpiece 16 inches in diameter from point to

point; 4 place doilies 13½ inches in diameter from  
point to point; 4 bread and butter plate doilies 8  
inches in diameter from point to point, and 4 glass  
doilies 6 inches in diameter from point to point.

**PLACE DOILY . . .** Starting at center, wind thread 10  
times around forefinger. Slip strands off finger. **1st  
rnd:** 32 s c in ring. Sl st in 1st s c made. **2nd rnd:**  
Ch 5, skip 1 s c, d c in next s c, \* ch 2, skip 1 s c,  
d c in next s c. Repeat from \* around, ending with  
ch 2, sl st in 3rd st of ch-5. **3rd rnd:** Ch 10, s c in  
2nd ch from hook, half d c in next ch, d c in next  
7 ch, s c in next d c of 2nd rnd (a spoke made).  
Repeat from beginning of rnd, ending with s c at  
base of ch-10 first made (16 spokes in all). **4th rnd:**  
Sl st to tip of 1st spoke, s c in tip of same spoke,  
\* ch 7, s c in tip of next spoke. Repeat from \* around,

**MATERIALS:**

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS

BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, *size 50,*

SMALL BALL:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—17 balls of *White or Ecru,* or  
24 balls of *any color,*

OR

J. & P. COATS—12 balls of *White or Ecru,* or 17 balls  
of *any color.*

BIG BALL:

CLARK'S O.N.T. OR J. & P. COATS—7 balls of *White*  
or *Ecru.*

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook *No. 12.*

This amount is sufficient for a luncheon set, consisting

of 4 place mats, each 10½ x 16½ inches; and a center  
mat, 13½ x 29 inches.

**GAUGE:** Each motif measures (before blocking) 2½  
inches from point to opposite point across center.

**PLACE MATS (Make 4) . . . First Motif . . .** Starting at  
center, ch 8. Join with sl st. **1st rnd:** Ch 3, 23 dc in  
ring. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. **2nd rnd:** Ch 4, tr  
in next 3 sts holding back on hook the last loop of  
each tr, thread over and draw through all loops on  
hook (a cluster made); \* ch 6, tr in same place as last  
tr of previous cluster and in next 3 sts holding back on  
hook the last loop of each tr and complete cluster as  
before. Repeat from \* around, making last tr of last  
cluster at base of ch-4 first made and ending with  
ch 6, sl st at tip of 1st cluster. **3rd rnd:** Sl st to 3rd st

# Princess Charming

No. 7386

## MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BIG BALL  
BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 20,  
CLARK'S O.N.T.—30 balls of White or Ecru,

OR

J. & P. COATS—30 balls of White or Ecru, or 36 balls  
of any color.

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook No. 9.

**GAUGE:** Each motif measures about  $3\frac{3}{4}$  inches in diameter. For a tablecloth 60 x 80 inches, make 16 x 22 motifs.

**FIRST MOTIF . . .** Starting at center, ch 8, join with sl st. **1st rnd:** Ch 5, (d c in ring, ch 2) 7 times; sl st in 3rd ch of ch-5. **2nd rnd:** Sl st in next sp, ch 4, 4 tr in same sp as sl st, (ch 2, 5 tr in next sp) 7 times; ch 2, sl st in 4th ch of ch-4. **3rd rnd:** Ch 4, tr in next 4 tr, holding back the last loop of each tr on hook, thread over and draw through all loops on hook, ch 1 to fasten (a cluster made), \* ch 8, 5 tr in next 5 tr, holding back the last loop of each tr on hook, thread over and finish as for a cluster. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-8 to tip of 1st cluster. **4th rnd:** In each ch-8 loop make 6 s c, ch 3, and 6 s c. Join. **5th rnd:** Sl st in each st and in 1st ch-3 loop, ch 4, 3 tr in same ch-3 loop, holding back the last loop of each tr on

hook, finish as for a cluster. (Ch 6, 4 tr cluster in same ch-3 loop) twice. \* Ch 3, in next ch-3 loop make three 4 tr-clusters with ch-6 between clusters. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-3 to tip of 1st cluster. **6th rnd:** \* In next ch-6 loop make 4 s c, ch 3, sl st in last s c made (a picot), 4 s c in same loop, in tip of next cluster make s c, p and s c; in next ch-6 loop make 4 s c, p and 4 s c; in next ch-3 loop make 3 s c. Repeat from \* around. Join. Fasten off.

**SECOND MOTIF . . .** Like First Motif to 5th rnd incl. **6th rnd:** \* In next ch-6 loop make 4 s c, p and 4 s c; in tip of next cluster make s c, ch 1, sl st in corresponding p on First Motif, ch 1, s c in tip of same cluster on Second Motif; in next ch-6 loop make 4 s c, p and 4 s c; in next ch-3 loop make 3 s c. Repeat from \* once more. Then complete Second Motif (no more joinings). Fasten off. Make necessary number of motifs, joining to adjacent motifs as Second was joined to First.

**FILL-IN LACE . . .** Ch 8, join. **1st rnd:** 16 s c in ring. Join. **2nd rnd:** S c in next s c, ch 8, sl st in any free p between joinings, \* ch 8, s c in next 2 s c in ring, ch 8, sl st in next free p. Repeat from \* around, ending with sl st in base of first ch-8 made. Join and fasten off. Fill in all sps between joinings in same manner.

## MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS  
BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 30,  
SMALL BALL:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—52 balls of White or Ecru, and  
15 balls of any color,

OR

J. & P. COATS—43 balls of White or Ecru, and 12 balls  
of any color.

BIG BALL:

J. & P. COATS—22 balls of White or Ecru, and 6 balls  
of any color.

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook No. 11.

**GAUGE:** Each motif measures about 5 inches in diameter from point to point. When completed, tablecloth measures about 60 x 80 inches.

**FIRST MOTIF . . .** Starting at center with main color, ch 10, and join with sl st. **1st rnd:** Ch 3, 23 d c in ring, sl st in top of ch-3. **2nd rnd:** S c in same place as sl st, \* ch 7, skip 2 d c, s c in next d c. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3, d c in 1st s c. **3rd rnd:** 4 s c in loop just made, (9 s c in next loop) 7 times; 5 s c in incompleting loop. Join. **4th rnd:** Ch 4, 3 tr in same place as sl st, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (a cluster made). Ch 6, 4-tr cluster in same place, \* ch 6, in 5th s c of next loop make two 4-tr clusters with ch-5 between. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3, d c in tip of 1st cluster. **5th rnd:** S c in loop just made, \* ch 8, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3, tr in 1st s c made. **6th rnd:** Ch 9 (to count as d c and 6 ch), \* 3 d c in next loop, ch 6. Repeat from \* around, ending with 2 d c

**MATERIALS:**

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BIG BALL  
BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, *size 30,*

CLARK'S O.N.T.—8 balls of *White or Ecru,*  
OR

J. & P. COATS—8 balls of *White or Ecru,* or 11 balls  
of *any color.*

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook No. 10.

1 yard linen, 36 inches wide.

**GAUGE:** 5 sps make 1 inch; 5 rows make 1 inch.  
When completed, tea cloth measures about 44 inches  
square.

Starting at bottom of chart, make a chain about 60 inches long. **1st row:** D c in 4th ch from hook and in next 26 ch (28 d c, counting the turning ch as 1 d c)—9 bls made; \* (ch 2, skip 2 ch, d c in next ch) 5 times—5 sps made; d c in next 15 ch—5 bls made. Repeat from \* 8 more times; then make 5 sps, d c in next 48 ch—16 bls made. Make (5 sps, 5 bls) 9 times; 5 sps, then make d c in next 27 ch. Ch 3, turn. Cut off remaining ch. **2nd row:** D c in next 3 d c—bl made; ch 2, skip 2 d c, d c in next d c—sp made over bl. Make 3 more sps, d c in next 12 d c, then 2 d c in next sp, d c in next d c—bl made over sp. Make 5 more bls; then make (3 sps, 7 bls) 9

# Spring Song

**MATERIALS:**

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS

BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, *size 30,*  
SMALL BALL:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—4 balls of *White or Ecru, or 5 balls*  
*of any color,*

OR

J. & P. COATS—3 balls of *White or Ecru, or 4 balls*  
*of any color.*

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook *No. 10 or 11.*

**GAUGE:** Each motif measures  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches square before blocking. Completed tray cloth measures  $12\frac{1}{2}$  x  $17\frac{1}{2}$  inches.

**MOTIF . . .** Starting at center, ch 9. **1st rnd:** In 9th ch from hook make d c, ch 5, d c, ch 5 and d c, (ch 2, skip 2 ch, in next ch make d c, ch 5 and d c) twice, (ch 2, skip 2 ch, d c in next st) twice. **2nd rnd:** Ch 9, 3-d tr cluster in 9th ch from hook—to make a cluster, make 3 d tr holding back the last loop of each d tr on hook; thread over and draw through all loops on hook, ch 1 tightly; ch 3, sl st in tip of cluster (p made); ch 8,

sl st at base of cluster, ch 12, turn. S c in p, ch 12, sl st at base of cluster, ch 1, turn. Over half of last ch-12 make 2 s c, 2 half d c and 6 d c; ch 8, s c in 4th ch from hook (p); ch 4, ch-4 p, ch 1, ch-4 p, \* ch 7, 2-d c cluster in 5th ch from hook, ch-4 p in tip of cluster, ch 4, sl st at base of cluster, ch 1, ch-4 p, ch 1, ch-4 p, ch 1, sl st in last d c made over ch-12; 6 d c over remaining half of same ch-12; ch 1, make 3 ch-4 p's with ch-1 between; ch 1, over next ch-12 make 12 d c, 2 half d c and 2 s c. Sl st at base of cluster (a flower made); 2 s c in corner sp of center; in next sp make s c, ch-4 p and s c; 2 s c in corner ch-5, ch 9, 3-d tr cluster in 9th ch from hook, ch 4, sl st in tip of cluster, ch 8, sl st at base of cluster, ch 12, turn. S c in p, ch 12, sl st at base of cluster, ch 1, turn. Over half of last ch-12 make 2 s c, 2 half d c and 6 d c; ch 4, ch-4 p, ch 4, s c in 7th d c down from top on last flower; ch 1, make 2 ch-4 p's with ch-1 between, ch 1. Repeat from \* around, but after the first 6 d c on 2nd ch-12 of last flower are made, make a sl st in ch preceding 2nd p made (thus joining last flower to first loop); complete flower. Fasten off.

Make another motif to within 3 p's between d c groups of flower; ch 1, make a ch-4 p, ch 2, sl st in

**MATERIALS:**

**J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN,** 19 balls of White or Ecru, or 31 balls of any color.

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook No. 7.

**GAUGE:** Each motif measures 4½ inches in diameter. Completed tablecloth measures about 70 x 90 inches.

**FIRST MOTIF . . .** Starting at center, wind thread 10 times around little finger of left hand. **1st rnd:** Slip strands off finger; 24 s c in ring. Join with sl st to 1st s c made. **2nd rnd:** Ch 5 (to count as d tr); \* d tr in next 3 s c, in next s c make d tr, ch 5 and d tr. Repeat from \* around, ending with d tr at base of ch-5 first made, ch 5, sl st in 5th st of starting ch-5 (6 d tr-groups). **3rd rnd:** Ch 5, d tr in next 4 d tr, holding back on hook the last loop of each d tr, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (a cluster made). \* Ch 5, in center st of next ch-5 make d c,

**No. 7387 . . . A maze of petals . . . twisting, turning, in ever-opening blossoms. Delicately joined, a cloth beguilingly filmy that is really a joy to crochet.**

**MATERIALS:**

**CLARK'S BIG BALL MERCERIZED CROCHET,**  
*size 20, 13 balls of White or Ecrú.*

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook *No. 10.*

**GAUGE:** Each motif measures 5 inches in diameter.  
For a tablecloth 60 x 80 inches, make 12 x 16 motifs.

**FIRST MOTIF . . .** Starting at center, ch 6. Join with sl st. **1st rnd:** Ch 3, 19 d c in ring. Sl st in top of ch-3. **2nd rnd:** \* Ch 5, s c in next d c. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 2, d c at base of ch-5 first made (20 loops). **3rd, 4th and 5th rnds:** \* Ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* around ending with ch 2, d c in d c of previous rnd. **6th rnd:** Make ch-6 loops around ending with ch 3, d c in d c. **7th rnd:** Make ch-7 loops around ending with ch 3, tr in d c. **8th rnd:** Make ch-8 loops around ending with ch 8, sl st in tr. **9th rnd:** 9 s c in each loop around. **10th rnd:** Sl st in

# Family Affair No. 7416

**MATERIALS:**

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BIG BALL BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 20, 25 balls of White or Ecreu.

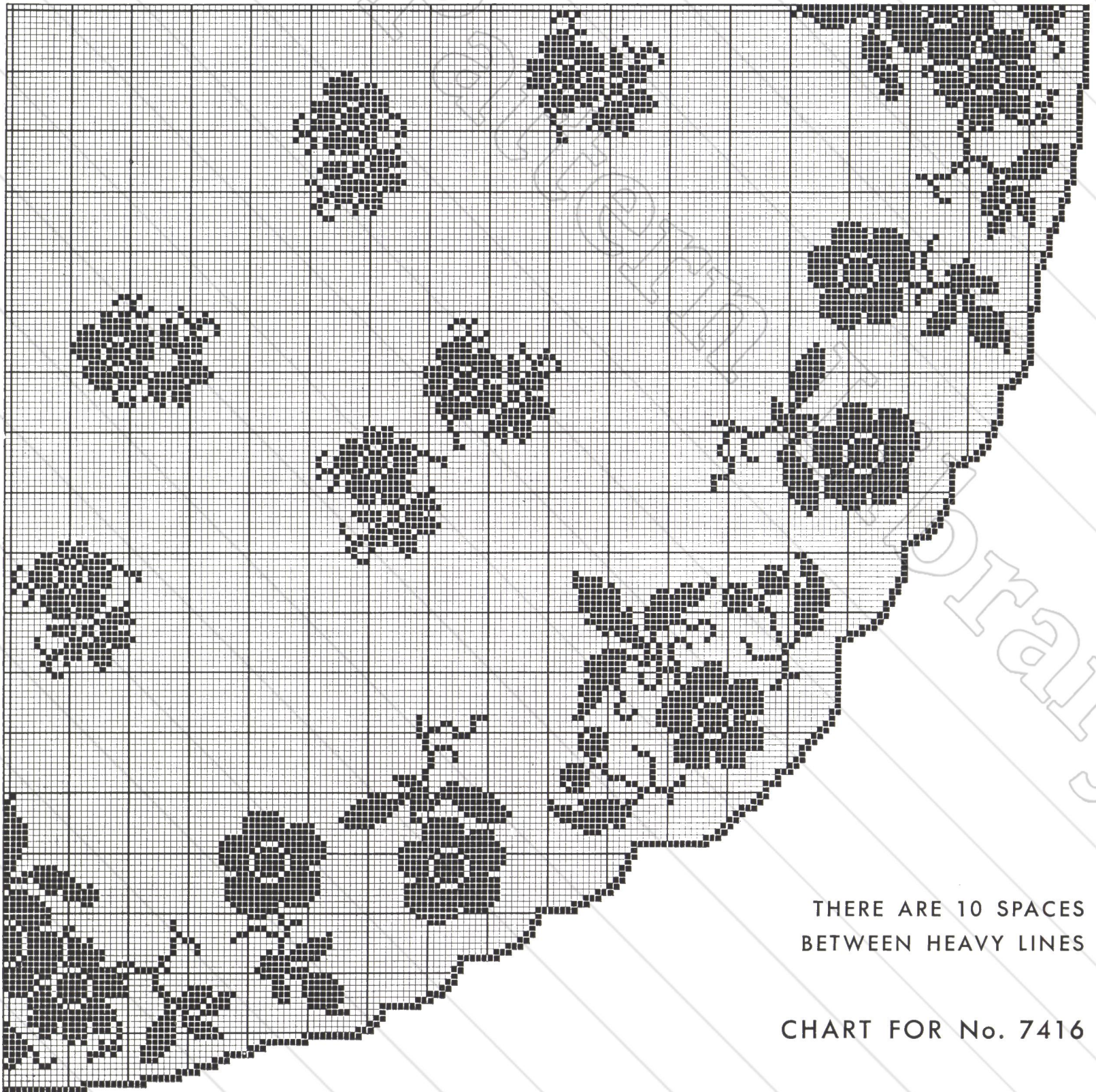
Milward's Steel Crochet Hook No. 7 or 8.

**GAUGE:** 5 sps make 1 inch; 5 rows make 1 inch. When completed, tablecloth measures about 72 inches in diameter.

Starting at bottom, ch 87. **1st row:** D c in 4th ch from hook and in each ch across (85 d c, counting turning ch as 1 d c). Ch 32, turn. **2nd row:** D c in 4th ch from hook, d c in 28 ch, d c in next d c (10 bls increased),

d c in 3 d c (bl over bl), ch 2, skip 2 d c, d c in next d c (sp over bl), make 25 more sps, d c in next 2 d c, then make a foundation d c as follows: Thread over hook, insert hook in 3rd st of turning ch-3, thread over and draw through 1 loop (thus a chain st is made), complete as for a d c; make another foundation d c by inserting hook in the chain st of previous d c. Continue in this manner until 29 d c in all are increased; then make 1 more d c in usual way (10 bls increased). Ch 20, turn. **3rd row:** D c in 4th ch from hook, d c in 16 d c, d c in next d c (6 bls increased), bl over bl, 46 sps, d c in 2 d c, a foundation d c in 3rd st of turning ch-3; make 17 more foundation d c; then make one more d c in the usual way (6 bls increased). Ch 11, turn. **4th row:** D c in 4th ch from hook, d c in 7 ch, d c in next d c (3 bls increased), bl over bl, 58 sps, d c in 2 d c, a foundation d c in 3rd st of turning ch-3; make 8 more foundation d c; then

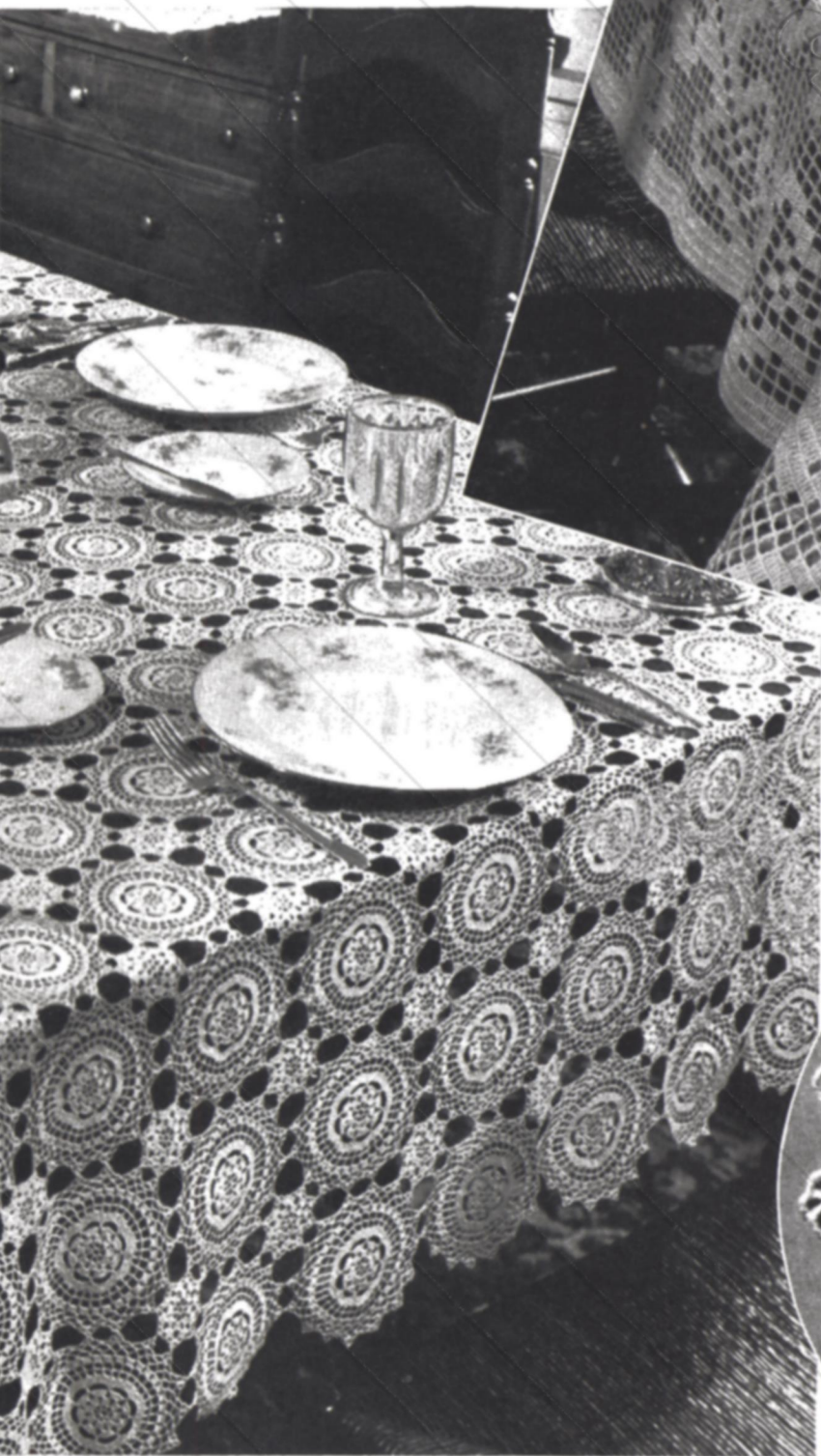

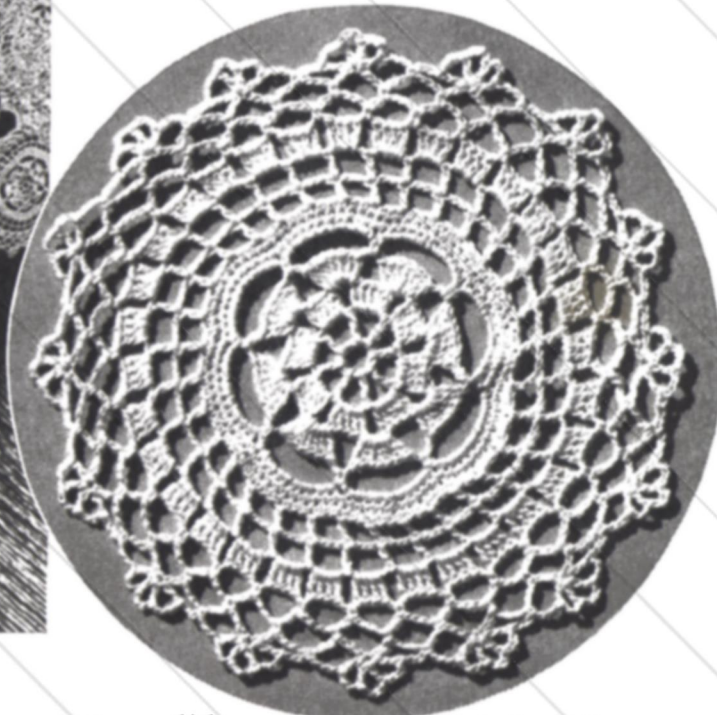

# True Love

## MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. "BRITA-SHEEN," 17 balls.

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook No. 7.

**GAUGE:** Each motif measures 3 inches from p to opposite p across center. Completed cloth measures 60 x 80 inches.

**FIRST MOTIF . . . 1st rnd:** Starting at center, ch 4, 11 d c in 4th ch from hook. Sl st in top st of ch-4 first made. **2nd rnd:** Ch 6, d c in same place as sl st, \* ch 4, skip 2 d c, in next d c make d c, ch 3 and d c. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 4, sl st in 3rd st of ch-6 first made. **3rd rnd:** Sl st in next ch, s c in next sp, ch 4, 3 tr in same sp, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (a cluster made), ch 5, 4 tr in same sp, holding back the last loop of each tr on hook, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (another cluster made); \* ch 5, skip next ch-4, in next ch-3 sp make two 4-tr clusters with ch 5 between. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 5, sl st in tip of 1st cluster made. **4th rnd:** S c in same place as sl st, \* ch 7, in

next sp make a 5-tr cluster, ch 7, s c in tip of next cluster, ch 7, s c in tip of next cluster. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 7, sl st in 1st s c made. **5th rnd:** 5 s c in next ch-7 loop, ch 4, s c in 4th ch from hook (p made), 5 s c in same loop, \* p, in each of next 3 loops make 5 s c, p and 5 s c. Repeat from \* around, ending with 5 s c, p and 5 s c in last loop, sl st in 1st s c made. Fasten off.

**SECOND MOTIF . . .** Work as for First Motif to 4th rnd incl. **5th rnd:** Work as for First Motif to within 3rd p, ch 2, s c in corresponding p of First Motif, ch 2, s c in 2nd ch from joining, 5 s c in same loop on motif in work, and continue around as for First Motif, joining next 2 p's as before.

Make 20 x 27 motifs, joining adjacent sides as Second Motif was joined to First (do not join corner p's).

**FILL-IN LACE . . .** Ch 5. Join with sl st. \* 2 s c in ring, ch 2, s c in free corner p, ch 2. Repeat from \* around. Join with sl st to 1st s c made. Fasten off. Fill in all spaces between joinings in same way.

**GAUGE:** Each motif measures about  $4\frac{1}{4}$  inches in diameter after blocking. For a tablecloth about 55 x 72 inches, make 13 x 17 motifs.

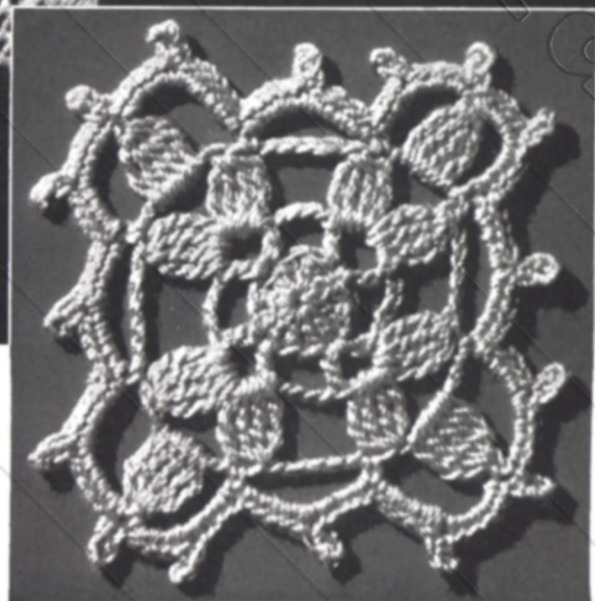

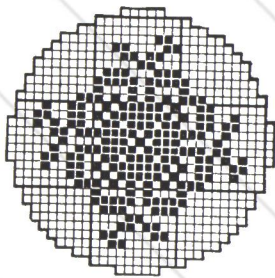

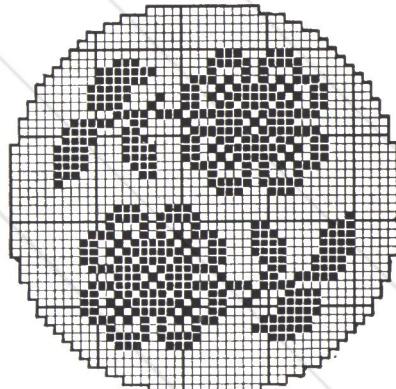

Ch 10, turn. **7th row:** Inc. 2 sps, work 5 more sps, 1 bl, 4 sps, 2 bls, then make d c in next 3 d c, (bl made over bl). Make 27 sps, 3 bls, 4 sps, 1 bl, 5 sps; inc. 2 sps. Ch 7, turn. **8th row:** D c in last d c (1 sp increased), make 7 sps, 2 bls, 2 sps, 4 bls, 27 sps, 4 bls, 2 sps, 2 bls, 7 sps, ch 5, d c in same place as last d c (1 sp increased), turn; sl st to 3rd st of ch-5. Ch 7, turn. Starting with 9th row, follow chart until 56th row is completed (when there are no increases, ch 5 to turn). Do not chain at end of 56th row. Turn. **57th row:** Sl st across 1st sp and in next d c, ch 5, d c in next d c and follow chart across to within last sp of previous row (1 sp decreased at each end). Ch 5, turn and follow chart to top. Do not break off, but work s c all around, keeping work flat. Fasten off.

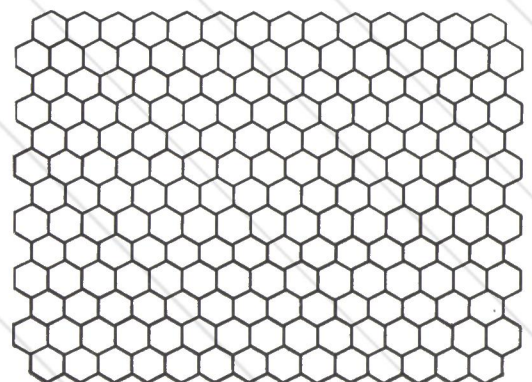

**J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN**, 6 balls of *Ecrú* to be referred to as "A," 5 balls of *Blue* to be referred to as "B," and 2 balls of *Orange* to be referred to as "C."

**Milward's Steel Crochet Hook No. 8 or 9.**

The above amount of materials is sufficient for a luncheon set consisting of 4 place mats, each about 10½ x 15½ inches (7 x 5 patterns); and a center mat about 10½ x 25 inches (7 x 16 patterns).

**GAUGE:** 11 sts make 1 inch; 4 rows make 1 inch.

**PLACE MATS (Make 4) . . .** Starting at long side, with color A ch 173 (to measure about 16 inches). **1st row:** D c in 4th ch from hook, d c in next ch, leaving the last 2 loops on hook, drop A, attach color C and draw through 2 loops. Then, holding A along top of foundation chain, make d c in next 2 ch (thus concealing A); d c in next ch, leaving the last 2 loops on hook, \* drop C, pick up A and draw through 2 loops, d c in next 20 ch (concealing C along top of ch), d c in next ch, leaving the last 2 loops on hook, drop A, pick up C and draw through 2 loops, d c in next 2 ch, d c in next ch, leaving the last 2 loops on hook. Repeat

from \* across, ending with 21 A d c in last 21 ch (171 d c, counting turning ch-3 as 1 d c). Ch 3, turn. Hereafter work as follows, changing colors and concealing unused color, or colors along top of previous rows. Any color not to be used on entire row can be broken off and attached again on rows where pattern calls for same.

**2nd row:** 5 A d c, \* 15 B d c, 9 A d c. Repeat from \* across, ending with 6 A d c. Ch 3, turn. **3rd row:** 2 A d c, \* 6 B d c, 9 A d c, 6 B d c, 3 A d c. Repeat from \* across, ending with 3 A d c. Ch 3, turn. **4th row:** 2 A d c, \* 3 B d c, 3 A d c, 3 C d c, 9 A d c, 3 B d c, 3 A d c. Repeat from \* across, ending with 3 A d c. Ch 3, turn. **5th row:** 2 A d c, \* 3 B d c, 6 A d c, 9 C d c, 3 B d c, 3 A d c. Repeat from \* across, ending with 3 A d c. Ch 3, turn. **6th row:** Same as 4th row. **7th row:** Same as 3rd row. **8th row:** Same as 2nd row. **9th row:** 2 A d c, \* 3 C d c, 21 A d c. Repeat from \* across, ending with 21 A d c. The 2nd to 9th rows inclusive constitute the pattern. Repeat pattern 4 more times. Fasten off.

**CENTER MAT . . .** Starting at short side, with A ch 173. Work exactly as for Place Mats, until 16 patterns have been completed. Fasten off. Block to measurements given.



## Rusticana No. 7433

Illustrated on page 16

### MATERIALS:

J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN, 5 balls each of Yellow, Brown and Green (any 3 colors may be substituted).

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook No. 2/0 (double zero).

This amount is sufficient for a set, consisting of a centerpiece, about 15 inches in diameter; 4 place mats, about 11½ inches in diameter; 4 bread and butter plate mats, about 7½ inches in diameter; and 4 glass mats, about 5 inches in diameter.

**CENTERPIECE . . .** Using 1 strand each of the 3 colors as one, ch 2. **1st rnd:** 8 s c in 2nd ch from hook. Join with sl st to 1st s c made. **2nd rnd:** Ch 4, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook and draw loop through, (insert hook in next ch and draw loop through) twice; insert hook in same place as sl st and draw loop through, thread over and draw through all loops on hook, ch 1 loosely to fasten (a star st made). \* Insert hook in fastening ch just made and draw loop through, insert hook in last loop of previous star st and draw loop through, insert hook in st where last loop of previous star st was drawn through, and draw loop through, insert hook in next s c and draw loop through, thread over and draw through all loops on hook. Ch 1 loosely to fasten (another star st made). Repeat from \* around (8 star sts in rnd). Do not join rnds, but work as follows:

**3rd rnd:** \* Draw up first 3 loops of next star st as before, draw up last loop in top of next star st (not in fastening ch); complete star st as before (an increase made). Make another star st, drawing up last loop through fastening ch (star st made over star st). Repeat from \* around (8 increases made—16 star sts in rnd). Continue to work in rnds, making star st over star st and increasing as necessary to keep work flat, until piece measures about 15 inches in diameter—when NOT INCREASING, work into the fastening ch's only; when INCREASING, work into the top of the star sts as well as into fastening ch's. Sl st in fastening ch of next star st of last rnd. Fasten off.

**PLACE MATS (Make 4) . . .** Work as for Centerpiece until piece measures about 11½ inches in diameter. Fasten off.

**BREAD and BUTTER PLATE MATS (Make 4) . . .** Work as for Centerpiece until piece measures about 7½ inches in diameter. Fasten off.

**GLASS MATS (Make 4) . . .** Work as for Centerpiece until piece measures about 5 inches in diameter. Fasten off.

### MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BIG BALL BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 30, CLARK'S O.N.T.—33 balls of White or Ecru,

OR

J. & P. COATS—33 balls of White or Ecru, or 44 balls of any color.

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook No. 10 or 11.

**GAUGE:** Each motif measures about 4 inches in diameter before blocking. For tablecloth 72 x 108 inches, make 16 x 25 motifs.

**FIRST MOTIF . . .** Starting at center, ch 8. Join with sl st. **1st rnd:** Ch 6 (to count as d c and ch-3), \* d c in ring, ch 3. Repeat from \* 6 more times. Sl st in 3rd st of ch-6. **2nd rnd:** Sl st in sp, ch 3, 4 d c in same sp, \* ch 2, 5 d c in next sp. Repeat from \* around ending with ch 2, sl st in top of ch-3. **3rd rnd:** Ch 6 (to count as d c and 3 ch); \* 7 d c in next sp, ch 3. Repeat from \* around ending with 6 d c in last sp, sl st in 3rd st of ch-6. **4th rnd:** Sl st in next ch, s c in sp, \* ch 10, s c in next sp. Repeat from \* around ending with sl st in 1st s c made. **5th rnd:** 12 s c in each ch-10 loop around. **6th and 7th rnds:** S c in each s c around. **8th rnd:** Sl st in next s c, ch 6, \* skip 2 s c, d c in next s c, ch 3. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-3 with sl st in 3rd st of ch-6 (32 sps). **9th rnd:** Ch 7, \* d c in next d c, ch 4. Repeat from \* around. Sl st in 3rd st of ch-7.

**10th rnd:** Sl st in sp, ch 3, 3 d c in same sp, \* ch 2, 4 d c in next sp. Repeat from \* around ending with half d c in top of ch-3. **11th rnd:** S c in sp, \* ch 6, s c in next sp. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 2, d c in 1st s c made. **12th rnd:** S c in loop just formed, \* ch 7, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 2, tr in 1st s c made. **13th rnd:** S c in sp, \* ch 3, in center st of next loop make (d c, ch 3) 3 times and d c; ch 3, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3, sl st in 1st s c made. Fasten off. This completes one motif.

**SECOND MOTIF . . .** Work as for First Motif to 12th rnd incl. **13th rnd:** S c in sp, ch 3, in center st of next loop make d c, ch 3, d c and ch 1. Make s c in corresponding point of First Motif, ch 1, make d c, ch 3 and d c in same place as last d c was made. Continue around, joining next point to corresponding point of First Motif as before. Complete as for First Motif (no more joinings).

Make necessary number of motifs, joining them as Second Motif was joined to First, having 2 free points between joinings on each motif.

**FILL-IN MOTIF . . .** Work as for Large Motif to 3rd rnd incl. **4th rnd:** Sl st in next sp, ch 6, d c in same sp, \* ch 1, s c in free point of motif, ch 1, make d c, ch 3 and d c in same place as last d c was made; ch 3, s c in 4th d c of next d c-group, ch 3, in next sp make d c, ch 3 and d c. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3, sl st in 3rd st of ch-6. Fill in all spaces between joinings in same manner.

# A Square-a-Day No. 7388

## MATERIALS:

J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN, 20 balls of White or Ecru, or 32 balls of any color.

Milward's Steel Crochet Hook No. 7.

**GAUGE:** 3 sps make 1 1/4 inches; 3 rows make 1 1/4 inches. Each block measures about 17 inches square after blocking. Completed tablecloth measures about 70 x 87 inches.

**BLOCK . . .** Starting at center, ch 11, tr in 11th ch from hook. Now work in rnds as follows: **1st rnd:** Ch 4, 3 tr over bar of last tr, tr in same ch where first tr of ring was made, ch 7, tr in same place as last tr, 3 tr in ring, tr in 4th ch of ring, ch 7, tr in same place as last tr, 3 tr in ring (under next 3 ch of ring). Tr in next ch, ch 7, tr in same place as last tr, 3 tr in ring, tr in 1st tr made (at base of ch-4). Ch 7, sl st in 4th ch of ch-4. **2nd rnd:** Ch 4, tr in next 4 tr, \* 4 tr in corner space, ch 7, 4 tr in same corner space, tr in next 5 tr. Repeat from \* around. Join with sl st in top of ch-4. **3rd rnd:** Ch 4, tr in next 8 tr, \* in corner space make 4 tr, ch 7 and 4 tr; tr in next 13 tr. Repeat from \* around, ending with tr in 4 tr. Join as before. **4th rnd:** Ch 4, tr in next 4 tr, ch 3, skip 3 tr, tr in next 5 tr, \* in corner space make 4 tr, ch 7 and 4 tr; tr in next 5 tr, (ch 3, skip 3 tr, tr in next 5 tr) twice. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3 and sl st. **5th rnd:** Ch 7 (to count as tr and 3 ch), skip 3 tr, tr in next tr, ch 3, tr in next tr, \* ch 3, skip 3 tr, tr in next 5 tr, in corner space make 4 tr, ch 7 and 4 tr; tr in next 5 tr, (ch 3, skip 3 tr, tr in next tr, ch 3, tr in next tr) twice. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-3 to 4th st of ch-7 first made. Starting at 6th rnd (indicated by "X" on chart), follow chart until block is completed. Fasten off.

Make 4 x 5 blocks and sew them together on wrong side with neat over-and-over stitches.

**EDGING . . . 1st rnd:** Attach thread to a tr, ch 4, and

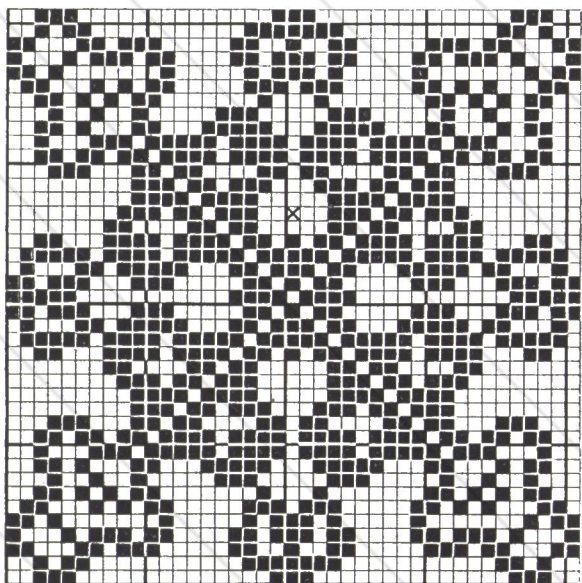

of next ch-6, s c in sp, \* ch 7, make a 4-tr cluster in tip of next cluster, ch 7, s c in next sp. Repeat from \* around ending with ch 3, tr in 1st s c made. **4th rnd:** S c in sp, \* ch 5, s c in next sp, ch 10, s c in next sp. Repeat from \* around ending with ch 10, sl st in 1st s c made. **5th rnd:** \* 5 s c in next sp, in next ch-10 loop make (5 s c, ch 5) 3 times and 5 s c. Repeat from \* around. Sl st in 1st s c made. Fasten off.

**Second Motif . . .** Work as for First Motif to 4th rnd incl. **5th rnd:** 5 s c in next sp, in next sp make 5 s c, ch 5, 5 s c and ch 2; s c in corresponding p of previous motif, ch 2, make 5 s c, ch 5 and 5 s c in same sp on motif in work and complete rnd as for First Motif. Make 5 x 8 motifs in all, joining adjacent motifs as Second Motif was joined to First, having 1 free ch-10 loop between joinings on each motif.

**FILL-IN MOTIF . . .** Work as for Motif, until 1st cluster on 2nd rnd is completed. \* Ch 5, s c in free p on motif preceding joining, ch 5, s c in 1st free p on next motif (following joining), ch 5 and make next cluster on Fill-In Motif, ch 2, skip 1 free p on motif, s c in next (center) free p, ch 2, work next cluster on Fill-In Motif. Repeat from \* around ending with sl st in tip of 1st cluster made. Fasten off. Fill in all spaces between motifs in this manner.

**RUNNER . . .** Make 6 x 13 motifs, joining them as for Place Mats.

in last loop. Join to 3rd st of ch-9. **7th rnd:** Sl st in next 4 ch, ch 3, d c in next ch, \* d c in 3 d c, d c in next 2 ch, ch 3, skip 2 ch, d c in next 2 ch. Repeat from \* around, ending with d c in first 2 sl sts, ch 3, sl st in top of ch-3. **8th rnd:** Ch 4, tr in next 6 d c, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr, finish as for a cluster, \* ch 7, s c in ch-3 loop, ch 7, make a 7-tr cluster over next 7 d c. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3, tr in tip of 1st cluster. **9th rnd:** \* Ch 8, 5 s c in each of next 2 loops. Repeat from \* around. Join to top of tr. **10th rnd:** Sl st in loop, make 5 s c, ch 5 and 5 s c in same loop, \* ch 6, make 5 s c, ch 5 and 5 s c in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join and fasten off.

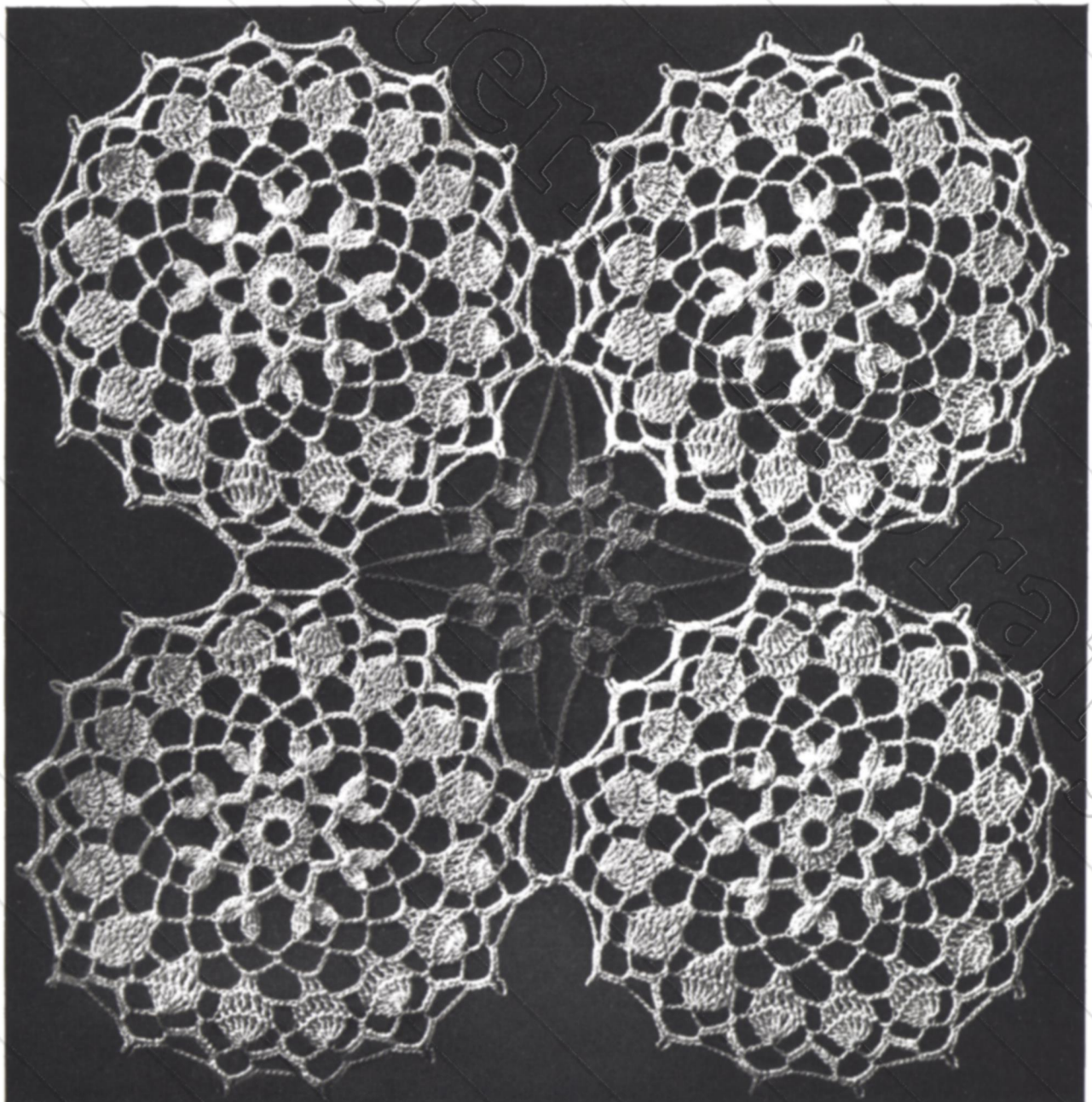
**SECOND MOTIF . . .** Work 9 rnds as for First Motif.

**10th rnd:** Sl st in loop, 5 s c in same loop, ch 2, sl st in corresponding picot on First Motif, ch 2, 5 s c in same loop as last 5 s c on Second Motif; ch 6 and

continue as for 10th rnd of First Motif, joining next loop to next p of First Motif, as 1st loop was joined. Complete as for First Motif. Make 12 x 16 motifs, joining to adjacent motifs as Second Motif was joined to First, leaving 2 points free between joinings.

**FILL-IN MOTIF . . .** (Worked in contrasting color.)

Work first 3 rnds as for large Motif. **4th rnd:** Ch 4, and complete a cluster as for 4th rnd of Large Motif, \* ch 3, sl st in 1st free p after joining of a Large Motif, ch 3, cluster in same place as last cluster was made, ch 3, cluster in center s c on next loop of Fill-In Motif, ch 3, sl st in next free p of Large Motif, ch 3, cluster in same place as last cluster, ch 12, sl st in joining of 2 Large Motifs, ch 12, cluster in center s c on next loop of Fill-In Motif. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 12, sl st at tip of 1st cluster made. Fasten off. Fill in all spaces between joinings of Large Motifs in this manner.

times; 3 sps, 8 bls, (3 sps, 7 bls) 9 times; 3 sps, 10 bls, 4 sps, d c in next 2 d c and in top of turning ch. Ch 3, turn.

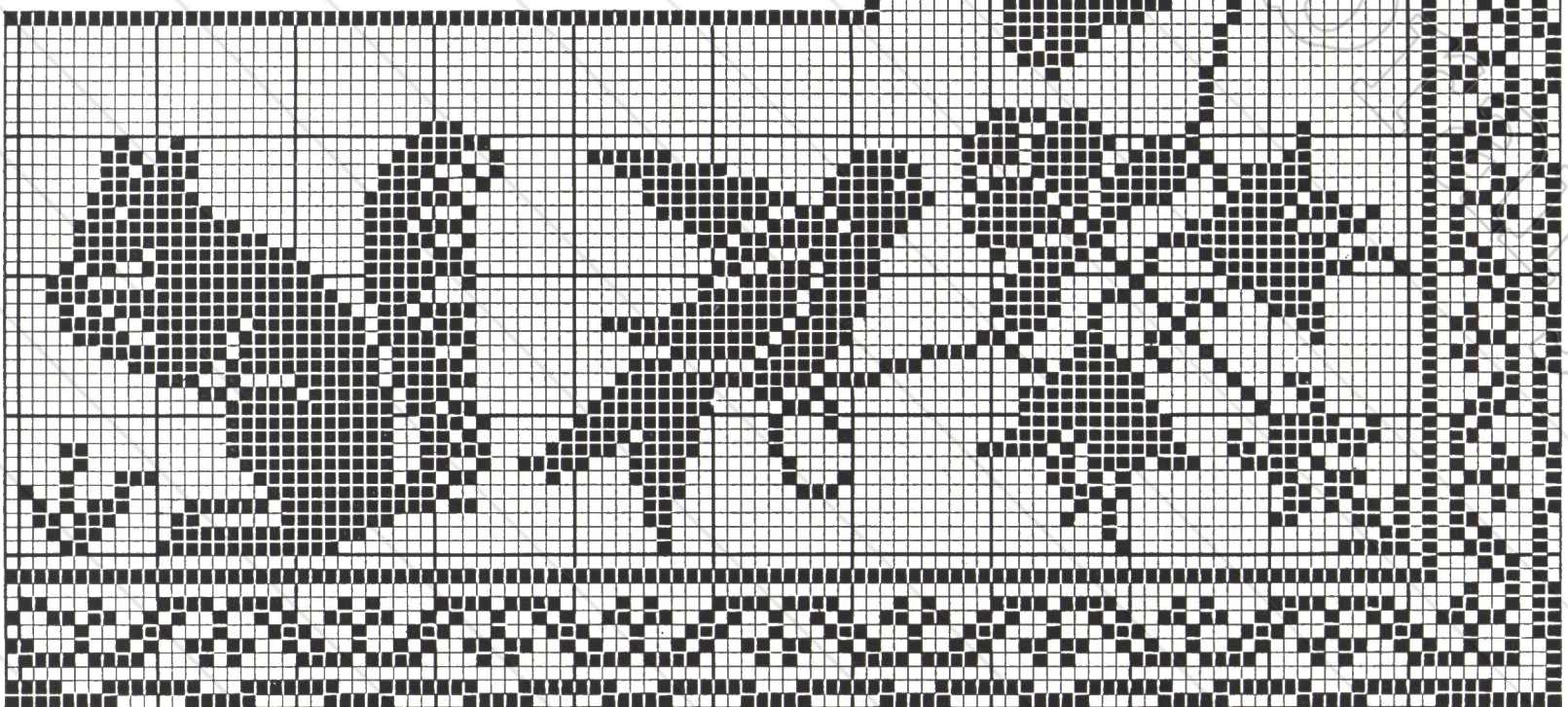
**NOTE:** Chart shows  $\frac{1}{4}$  of design. To make second half of each row, repeat the first half, starting from center and working back.

Starting with 3rd row, follow chart until 9th row is completed. Ch 5, turn. **10th row:** Skip 2 d c, d c in next 4 d c, and continue to follow chart across, ending with ch 2, skip 2 d c, d c in top of turning ch. Ch 5, turn. **11th row:** D c in next 4 d c, and continue to follow chart across, ending with ch 2, d c in 3rd st of turning ch. Ch 5, turn. Continue to follow chart until 50th row is completed. Ch 5, turn. **51st row:** (1 sp, 1 bl) 3 times; 3 sps, 1 bl, 13 sps, 1 bl, 4 sps, 12 bls, 9 sps, 1 bl. Ch 3, turn. Starting with 52nd row, follow chart to top; then reverse chart and work back to 52nd row incl. (123 short rows). Fasten off. Count 49 bls and sps in from opposite side, attach thread to 4th d c of next bl, and work to correspond, working back to 51st row (not 52nd) incl. (124 short rows). Do not fasten off, but ch 401 and complete 51st row at opposite side. Then follow chart to 1st row, working across chain. Fasten off.

Cut linen into a square to fit in center of lace, allowing for narrow hem. Hem linen and sew to lace.

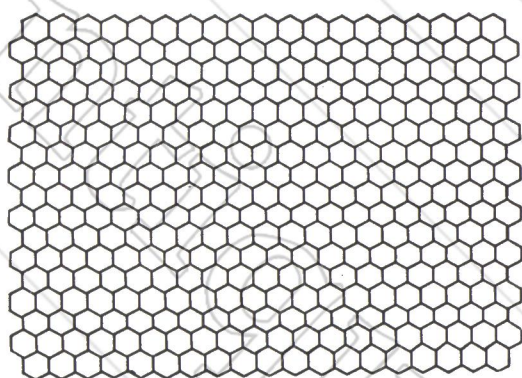

Ch 8, turn. Starting with the 6th row, follow chart to top. Chart shows  $\frac{1}{4}$  of design. To make second half of each row, repeat 1st half, starting from center and working back. When work reaches top row, reverse chart and work back to the 1st row. Fasten off.

Repeat from \* around, ending with s c in last d tr. Sl st in 1st s c made. Fasten off.

**SECOND MOTIF . . .** Work as for First Motif to 4th rnd incl. **5th rnd:** S c in same place as sl st, in next loop make 3 s c, ch 2, s c in corresponding p of First Motif, ch 2, s c in 2nd ch from joining (thus joining 2 p's), and continue as for First Motif, joining next 5 p's as before. Complete rnd as for First Motif.

Make 331 motifs in all, joining adjacent picots as Second Motif was joined to First (see diagram).

Then make \*\* 1 bl, 2 sps, 1 bl, 3 sps, 1 bl, 4 sps, 3 shadow sps, 4 sps, 1 bl, 3 sps, 1 bl, 2 sps, 1 bl, 1 sp. Repeat from \*\* 3 more times; make 1 bl, 2 sps, 1 bl, 3 sps, 1 bl, 4 sps, 2 shadow sps, 1 sp, 3 bls. Ch 4, turn. Now follow chart, starting with the 4th row from bottom. The chart shows  $\frac{1}{4}$  of design. To make 2nd half of each row, repeat the 1st half, starting from center and working back—but do not repeat the exact center mesh. Follow chart to top; then reverse design by working back to 1st row—but do not repeat top row of chart. **Next row:** Tr in each tr and 3 tr in each sp across. Ch 4, turn. **Following row:** Tr in each tr, ch 4, turn. Repeat the last row once more. Fasten off. Attach thread at one end of starting ch and work 3 rows of tr at other end of cloth to correspond. Fasten off. Block to measure 65 x 93 inches.

Repeat from \* 2 more times. Now complete rnd as for First Motif (no more joinings). Make necessary number of motifs, joining adjacent sides as Second Motif was joined to First. There are 2 free p's between joinings on each motif.

**FILL-IN LACE . . . 1st rnd:** Ch 4, 15 d c in 4th ch from hook. Join with sl st to top of ch-4. **2nd rnd:** Ch 8, s c in a free p between joinings on any motif, \* ch 8, skip 1 d c on fill-in lace, make s c in next d c, ch 8, s c in next free p. Repeat from \* around ending with ch 8, s c at base of ch-8 first made. Fasten off. Fill in all spaces between motifs in this manner.

**FILL-IN LACE . . .** Ch 14, join with sl st to form ring. \* 2 s c in ring, ch 12, s c in sp along side of free cluster-p on motif, sl st in each ch back to ring, 2 s c in ring, ch 12, s c in sp on other side of same cluster-p on motif, sl st in each ch back to ring, 2 s c in ring, ch 18, skip 2 p's on motif, s c in next sp on motif, sl st in each ch back to ring, 2 s c in ring, ch 18, s c in free sp after joining on next motif, sl st in each ch back to ring. Repeat from \* around (16 spokes). Fasten off. Fill in all sps between joinings in same way.

ending with sl st in 1st s c made. **5th rnd:** Ch 5, d c in same place as sl st, \* ch 3, s c in next sp, ch 3, in next s c make d c, ch 2 and d c (shell made). Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3, sl st in 3rd st of ch-5. **6th rnd:** Sl st in sp, ch 5, d c in same sp, \* ch 4, s c in next s c, ch 4, make a shell in sp of next shell. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 4, sl st in 3rd st of ch-5 first made.

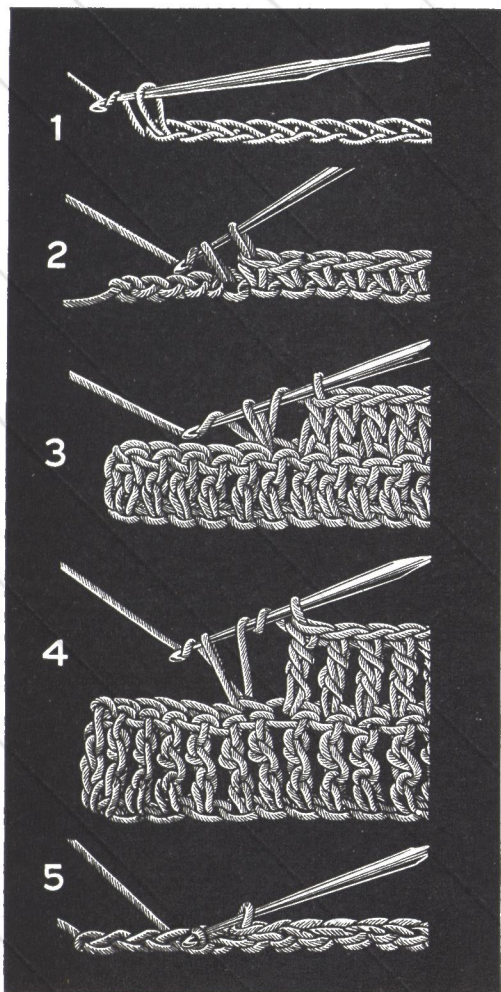
Work in this manner, making shell over shell and s c over s c, having 1 additional st in chain between s c's and shells on each successive rnd, until there are 20 ch between s c's and shells. Fasten off.

**CENTERPIECE . . .** Work as for Place Doily, but omitting increases in ch's on 10th and 12th rnds. When there are 18 ch's work 7 rnds more, making 2 extra ch's between s c's and shells on each successive rnd (32 ch's). Fasten off.

**BREAD and BUTTER PLATE DOILY . . .** Work as for Place Doily to 13th rnd incl. Fasten off.

**GLASS DOILY . . .** Work as for Place Doily to 9th rnd incl. Fasten off.

## Simple Crochet Stitches



**1 . . . Chain (ch):** Make a loop on hook, thread over and draw main length of thread through. Continue to draw thread through each new loop for length desired.

**2 . . . Single Crochet (s c):** Insert hook under 2 loops of st, draw thread through (2 loops on hook), thread over, draw through both loops on hook.

**3 . . . Double Crochet (d c):** Thread over, insert hook in st and draw thread through (3 loops on hook); thread over, draw through 2 loops, thread over, draw through 2 remaining loops. Work **Half Double Crochet (half**

**d c)** like d c, but draw thread through all 3 loops at once.

**4 . . . Treble (tr):** Thread over twice, insert hook in st and draw thread through (4 loops on hook); thread over and work off 2 loops at a time as for a d c. For a **Double Treble (d tr)**, thread over 3 times; and for a **Triple Treble (tr tr)**, thread over 4 times, working off 2 loops at a time as in the tr.

**5 . . . Slip Stitch (sl st):** Insert hook in st, catch thread and, with one motion, draw thread through both the st and the 1 loop on hook.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

**IMPORTANT . . .** Be sure to buy at one time sufficient material of the **same dye lot** to complete the article you wish to make, as it is impossible to avoid slight variations in color in different dye lots.

**GAUGE . . .** Before starting your article, make a small sample of the stitch or motif. If your working tension is too tight or too loose, use a finer or coarser needle, to obtain the correct gauge.

**BLOCKING DIRECTIONS . . .** Following measurements given, with rust-proof pins pin article right side down on a well padded flat surface. *If article*

*is too large for pressing table, block in sections of convenient size.* Be sure to pin out all picots, loops, scallops, etc., along outside edges. Press through a damp cloth with a moderately hot iron (do not rest iron on decorative raised stitches). When thoroughly dry, remove pins.

**TO LAUNDER COTTON ARTICLES . . .** Before laundering, record all important measurements. Launder article in warm water, using a good neutral soap or soap flakes. Allow to dry thoroughly on a flat surface. Then block article, following **Blocking Directions**.

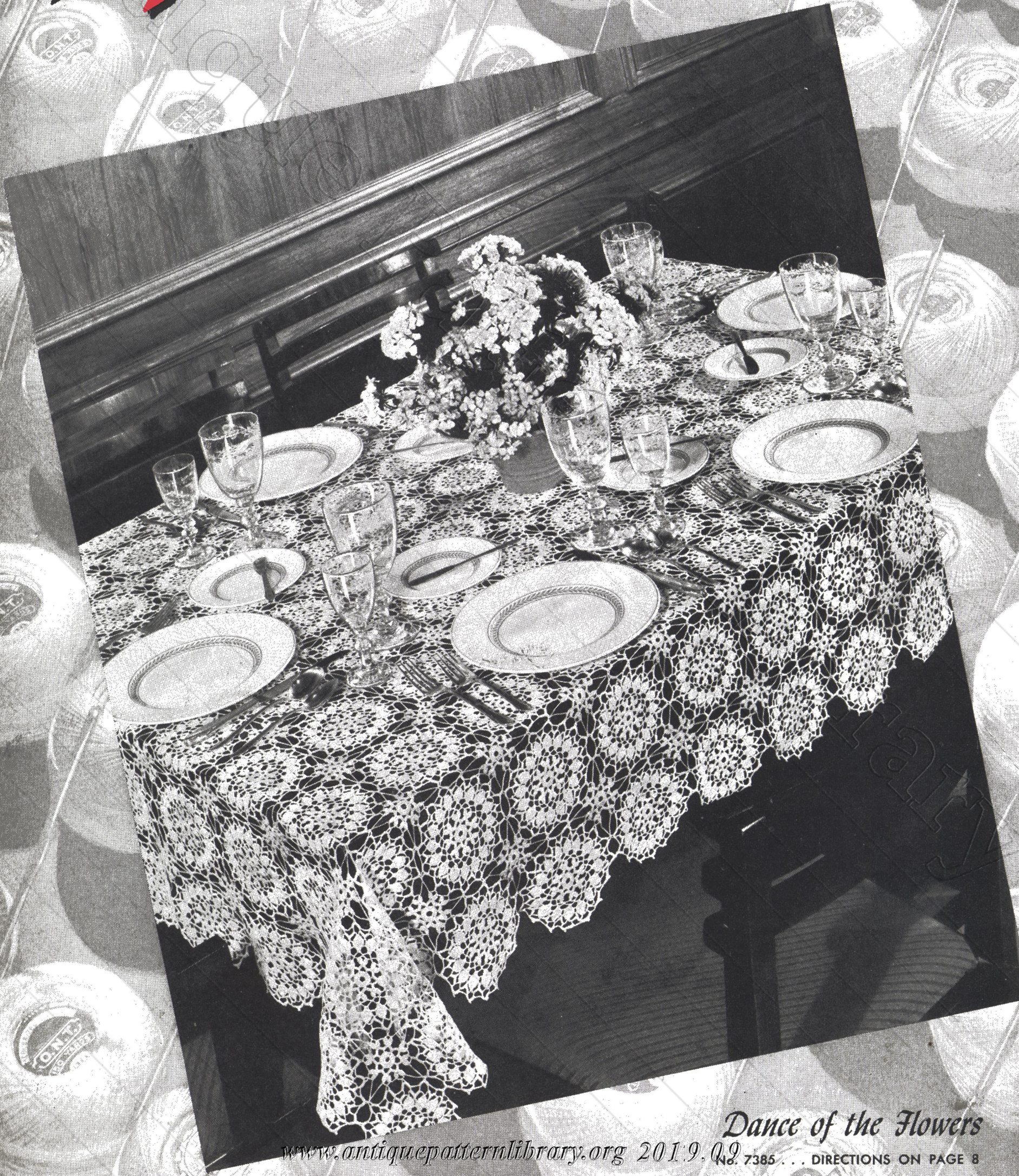
