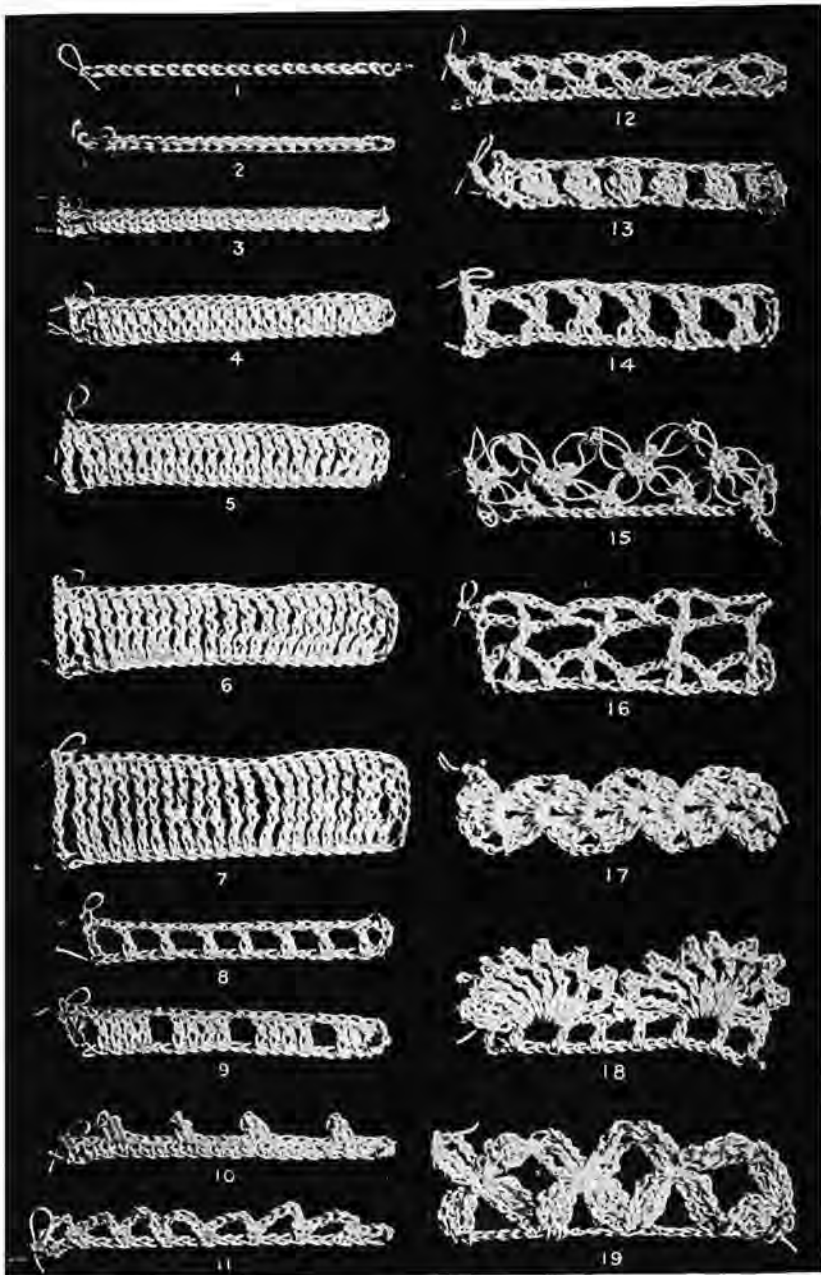

Abbreviations of Crochet Stitches



No. 1, Chain Stitch, ch st: make a loop on hook, pull another loop through it, forming 1 ch st, repeat for length required.

No. 2, Slip Stitch, sl st: make a ch, skip 1 st, insert hook into ch st, thread over hook, draw through ch st and loop together.

No. 3, Single Crochet, s c: make a ch, skip 1 st, insert hook into next st, thread over hook and through ch st, forming 2 loops on hook, thread over hook, through both loops.

No. 4, Double Crochet, d c: make a ch, thread over hook, skip 3 sts, insert hook into next st, draw thread through ch, thread over hook, through 2 loops, thread over hook, through 2 loops.

No. 5, Treble Crochet, t c: make a ch, thread over hook twice, skip 4 sts, insert hook into next st, draw thread through ch, thread over hook, through 2 loops, thread over hook, through 2 loops, thread over hook, through 2 loops.

No. 6, Double Treble Crochet, d t c: make a ch, thread over hook 3 times, skip 5 sts, insert hook into next st, continue as for t c.

No. 7, Treble, Treble Crochet, t t c: make a ch, thread over hook 4 times, skip 6 sts, insert hook into the next st, continue as for t c.

No. 8, Space, sp: make a ch, thread over hook, skip 7 sts for turn, insert hook into next st, * 1 d c, 2 ch sts, skip 2 sts, from * forms 1 sp. For filet crochet to count ch sts, to start allow 3 sts for each sp, 5 sts to turn. Thus 52 sps, require 161 ch sts.

No. 9, Group, gr: make a ch, 1 d c into 4th ch st, 1 d c into each of next 2 sts, forms 1 gr at turn of row, otherwise 4 d c into 4 sts, form 1 gr. Where 2 or more grs, join, 3 d c form each gr after first. For 2 grs, 7 d c, for 3 grs, 10 d c.

No. 10, Picot, p: make 4 ch sts, insert hook into 4th ch st from hook, thread over hook, draw through both loops, forming 1 p.

No. 11, Loop, L: make a ch, 1 s c, into

7th st, * 5 ch sts, skip 2 sts, 1 s c, from * forms 1 L.

No. 12, Triangle, tri: make a ch, skip 5 sts, * 1 d c, 3 ch sts, 1 d c in same st, from * forms 1 tri.

No. 13, Cluster, cl: make ch, skip 3 sts, start a d c, draw thread through 2 sts, * thread over hook, insert hook into same st, thread over hook, draw through 2 sts, repeat * having 4 loops on hook, thread over hook, draw through all 4 loops, 1 ch st, to fasten cl. When longer cl is required make of t c instead of d c.

No. 14, Cross Treble, c t: make ch, skip 5 ch sts, * thread twice over hook, insert hook into ch st, draw thread through, thread over hook, through 2 loops, thread over hook, skip 1 ch st, insert hook, draw thread through, thread over hook, through 2 loops, thread over hook through 2 loops, 1 d c, 1 ch st, insert hook into 2 sts at joining of 2 lower sections, make 1 d c, from * forms 1 c t.

No. 15, Knot Stitch, kn: make ch, * draw loop on hook out to 1/4 of an inch, thread over hook, draw through loop, insert hook back through 1 long loop, thread through, making 2 loops on hook, thread over through both. Repeat *, skip 3 ch sts, 1 s c, repeat for length required.

Next row, make 2 knots, 1 s c into 2nd kn of 1st row, 1 s c, next to this st, catching 2 threads of long loop, 1 kn.

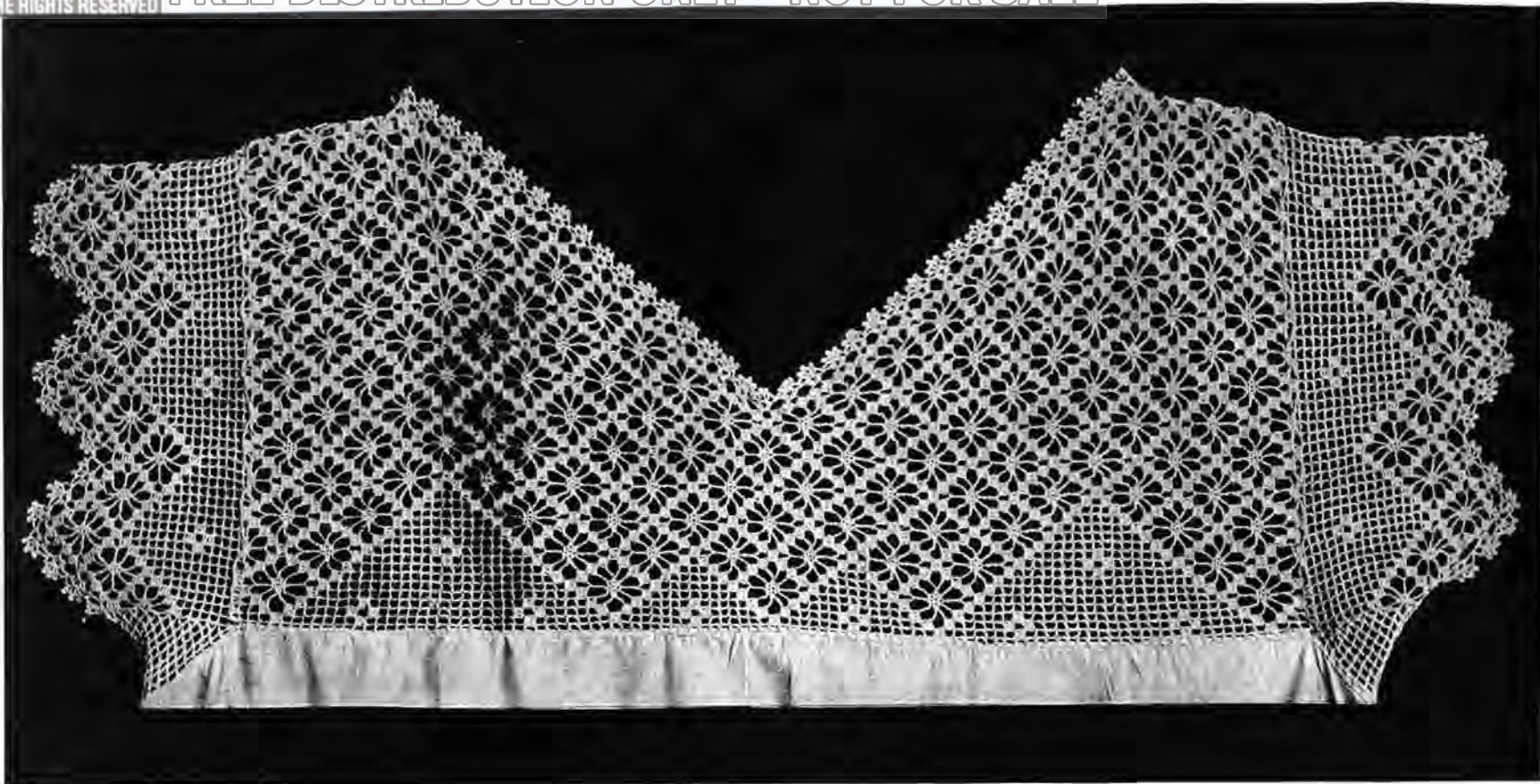
No. 16, Lacet, La: make a ch, skip 5 sts, * 1 d c, 3 ch sts, skip 2 sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, skip 2 sts, from * forms 1 La.

On next row, 1 d c over d c, 5 ch sts, over La, forms 1 sp.

No. 17, Fan, f: make 5 ch sts, 3 t c, 2 ch sts, 3 t c, all over 4th ch st, forms 1 f. Small fan of d c, large fan of d t c.

No. 18, Scallop, sc: make ch, then row of sps, * 1 s c over 1st sp, ** 1 d t c, into next sp, 1 p, repeat ** for 9 d t c, repeat *.

No. 19, Block Stitch, bl: make ch, * skip 5 sts, 2 t c form a cl, 5 ch sts, 2 t c, form cl, 3 ch sts, repeat * for row, 12 ch sts, turn, catch into connecting st of 2 cls, 2 t c into 6th ch st, continue. 2 rows form 1 bl.



Night-gown Yoke No. 1



MATERIALS: Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Art. 65, 7 spools No. 60. Make 307 ch sts.

1st Row: 5 sps, * 1 gr, 5 ch sts, skip 5 sts, 5 s c, 5 ch sts, skip 5 sts, repeat *, 5 sps, 5 ch sts, turn.

2nd Row: 4 sps, * 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, skip 1 s c, 3 s c, 5 ch sts, repeat *, 4 sps, 5 ch sts, turn.

3rd Row: 3 sps, * 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 d t c, into center s c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 t c, over sp, 5 ch sts, repeat *, 3 sps, 5 ch sts, turn.

4th Row: 2 sps, * 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 3 s c, 1 s c into last ch st, 1 s c, into t c, 1 s c, into 1st st of next ch, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 1 sp, repeat *, 2 sps, 5 ch sts, turn.

5th Row: 1 sp, repeat 1st row, completing $\frac{1}{2}$ a spider, repeat backward until spider is completed. Continue increasing 1 sp at start and 1 sp at the finish of each row, until you have made 17 rows.

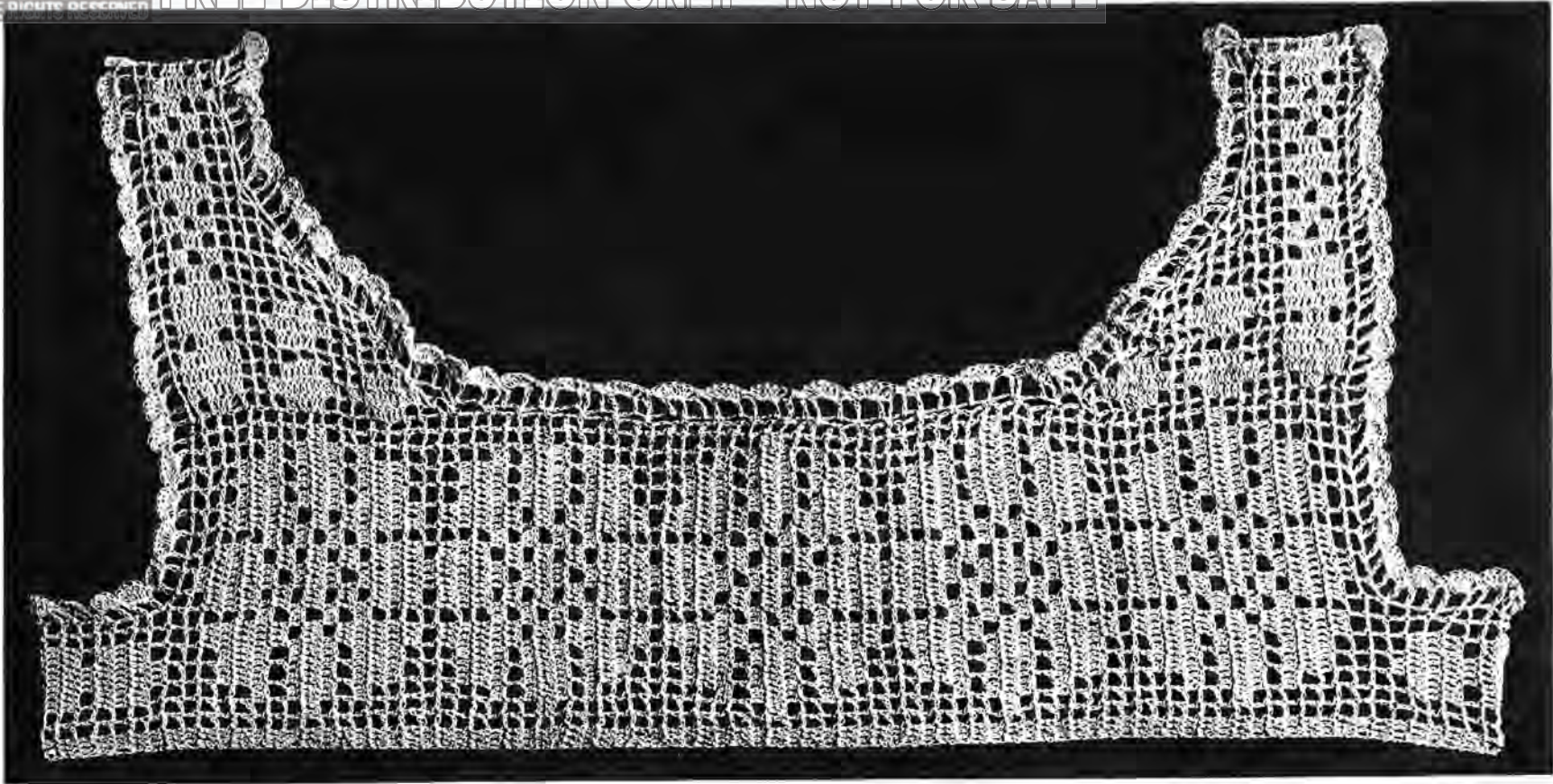
18th Row: Make 6 spiders, 5 ch sts, turn, continue decreasing 1 gr on each row until you have but 3 spiders for the center front. Then increase by making 10 ch sts, at the upper turn, on these add 1 gr each row:

Continue until you reach the shoulder, break thread Repeat for the back, then join and complete the remaining shoulder. For the sleeves, make 41 ch sts.

1st Row: 7 sps, 1 spider, continue as for the yoke. Connect the ends of spiders by 1 sp, then allow the lace to separate and fill this v shape with rows of sps, to form underarm.

For the edges of sleeves and neck, fasten thread, * 2 d c, 2 ch sts, 2 d c, over the 5 ch sts, 3 ch sts, repeat *.

Last Row: * 3 ch sts, ** 1 d c, 1 p, repeat ** for 3 p, 4 d c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, over sp, repeat *.



Filet Yoke No. 2



MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Special No. 20. Make 59 ch sts, 1st row: 17 sp, 1 gr, 3 ch sts, turn.

2nd Row: 1 gr, 8 sp, 1 gr, 8 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

3rd Row: 5 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 5 sp, 1 gr, 3 ch sts, turn.

4th Row: 1 gr, 3 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 3 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

5th Row: 2 sp, 5 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 5 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 3 ch sts, turn.

6th Row: 1 gr, 5 sp, * 1 gr, 1 sp, repeat * for 4 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

7th Row: 2 sp, 3 gr, * 1 sp, 1 gr, repeat * for 3 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 3 ch sts, turn.

8th Row: 1 gr, 1 sp, 5 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 5 gr, 1 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

9th Row: 2 sp, 3 gr, * 1 sp, 1 gr, repeat * for 3 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 3 ch sts, turn.

10th Row: 1 gr, 5 sp, * 1 gr, 1 sp, repeat * for 4 gr, 5 sp, 3 ch sts, completes 1/2 the pattern, repeat backward to start.

For underarm, 1st row: 1 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

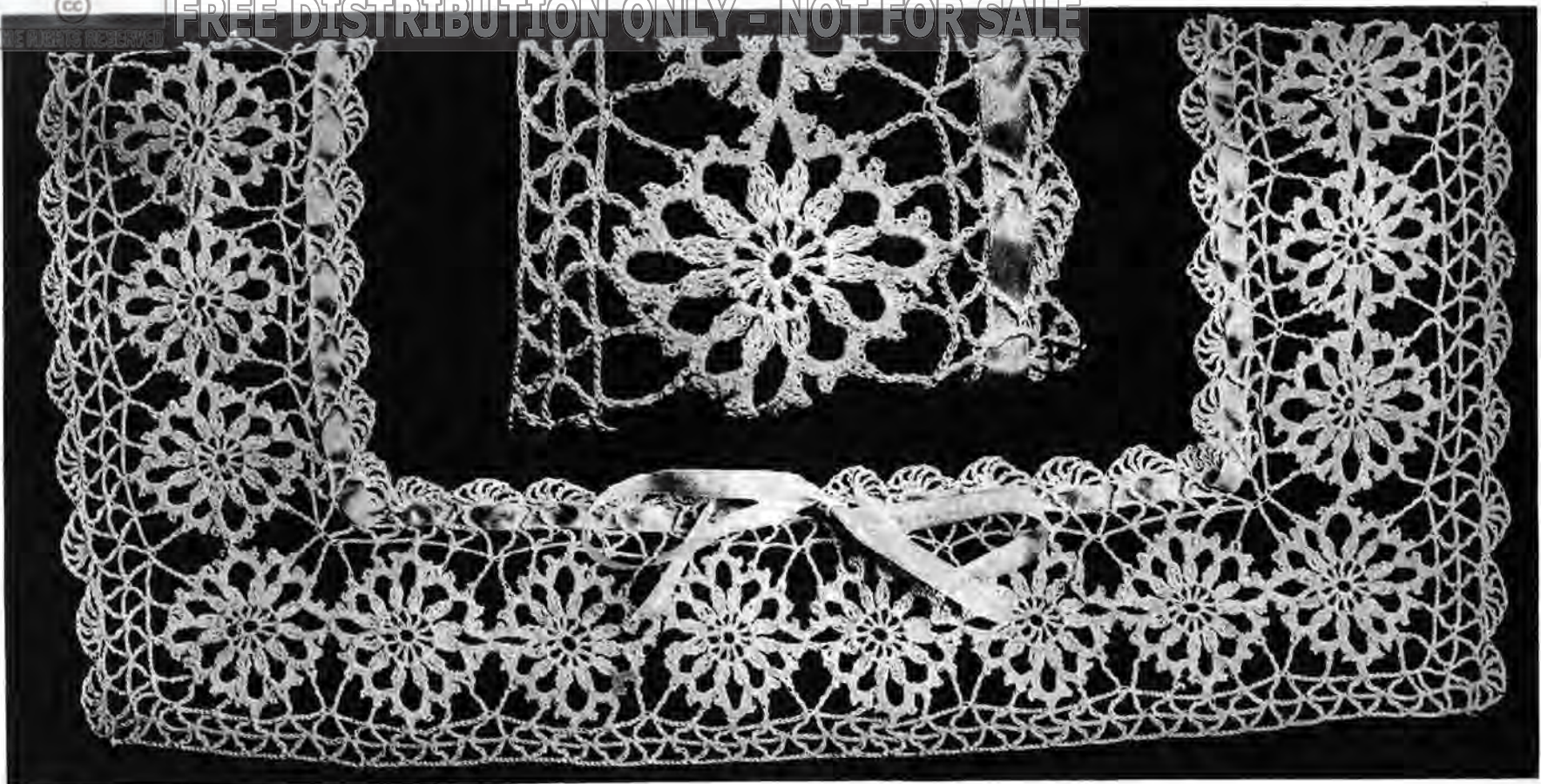
2nd Row: 2 sp, 3 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 3 ch sts, turn, make length required then add 35 ch sts, for the back. Continue pattern.

For shoulder strap, join to top of front.

1st Row: 2 sp, 1 gr, 4 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 3 ch sts, turn.

2nd Row: Skip 1st sp, 2 a c, 2 ch sts, 4 gr, 1 sp, 4 gr, 2 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

3rd Row: 1 sp, 3 gr, 3 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 2 gr, 1 sp, 3 ch sts, turn, continue omitting 1 sp, on each inner turn, until you have 5 sp, across shoulder. Make same for back and seam across shoulder. Make 5 ch sts, 1 a c, along the top edge to straighten, then row of sp, scallop, 1 * c, 5 d c, repeat around neck and sleeves.



Night-gown Yoke No. 3



MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 40. A No. 9 hook.

For the medallion which forms the yoke begin with a ch of 8 joined to form a ring. Ch 5, 11 d c in the ring with 2 ch between, join last 2 ch to 3rd of 5 ch by sl st. S c in 1st 2 ch, ch 4, make 2 t c in same space leaving last st of each t c on the hook and work off last 3 sts together, ch 7, * group of 3 t c worked as in 1st group and repeat from * until 12 groups are made with 2 ch between, join last 7 ch to 1st group by sl st. Let every

3rd ch be of 9 sts for the corners and the rest 7 ch. In each 7 ch make (3 s c, p, 2 s c, p, 3 s c) and in each 9 ch (3 s c, 3 p with 3 s c between, 3 s c).

Make the required number of medallions joining to each other by sl st in center of the corner scallop (see illustration), 8 for front, 7 for back and 5 for each shoulder. For edge at neck fasten in center of corner of the medallion, ch 6, skip 1 p, d t c (over 3 times) in next p, ch 6, skip a p, 1 d t c (over 4 times) in next p, skip 4 p, 1 d t c in next, ch 6, skip a p, d t c in next and

repeat around the inside of the yoke. Make 4 1 d t c in corner as seen in the illustration. For the next row ch 9, t c in 1st st of the row, t c in same d t c, and repeat. Next row same as the last. For the edge make a shell of 6 d t c with 2 ch between in 5 ch, and fasten by sl st in next 5 ch.

For the outer edge make first 3 rows like the inner edge and finish front and back with the scallop. If desired, a sleeve may be crocheted on, or extend the shell all around the outer edge.



Daisy Yoke No. 4



MATERIALS: 3 Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 40 and No. 9 hook.

For the daisy ch 7 and join to form a ring. Ch 6, 7 d c in the r with 3 ch between, join by sl st. Ch 3, 5 d c in each 3 ch and 1 d c in d c, join. Ch 3, 5 d c in 5 d c, (ch 5, 6 d c in next 6 d c) 7 times, ch 5, join. Ch 4, t c in each of the next 5 d c leaving last st of each on the hook and draw thread through the 6 on the hook together, ch 7, s c in 5 ch, ch 7, group over next 6 d c and repeat joining last 7 ch to first group by sl st. For last row sl st to center of 1st 7 ch, ch 9, sl st in next 7 ch, ch 9, sl st in tip of the group and repeat. Make

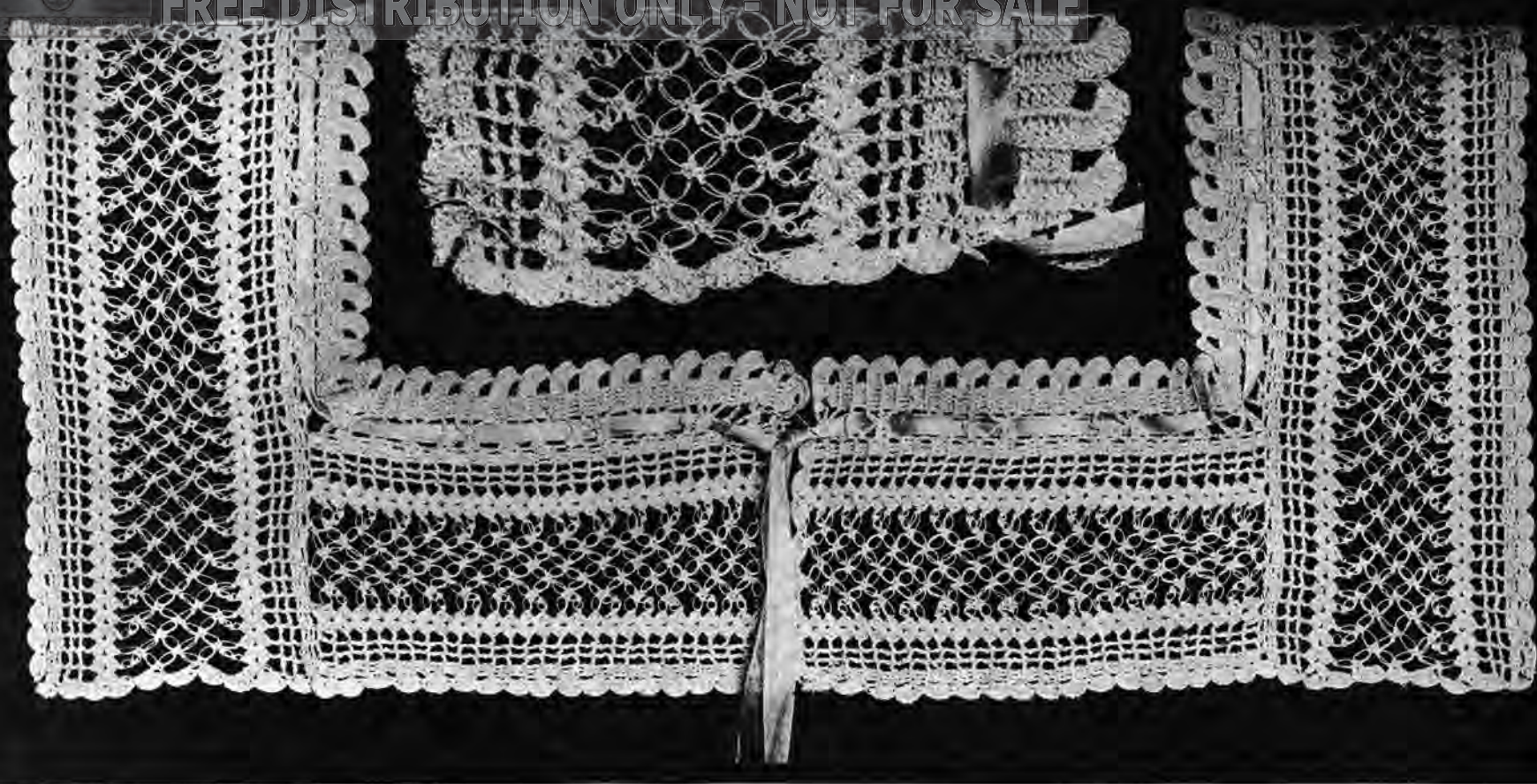
enough daisies for the yoke—7 across the front and back, 4 on each shoulder. To join daisies instead of the last 3 of the 9 ch make (4 ch, sl st in 9 ch of 1st daisy, ch 4, sl st in next 9 ch) 3 times. There will be 5 of the 9 ch between joinings.

For the inner edge fasten in the 1st sl st to the left of the joining, ch 8, d c in 1st 9 ch, ch 4, t c in sl st, ch 4, d c in next 9 ch, ch 4, t c in sl st and repeat to last 9 ch of the daisy, ch 4, t c in center of 9 ch, 1 t c in the joining, t c in next 9 ch, and repeat all around. For next row make t c in each d c and t c of last row with

4 ch between. Finish with a shell of (2 ch, 4 t c with 1 ch between, 2 ch) in t c and fasten by sl st in next t c. For the sleeve make 8 daisies joining 6 of them to the shoulders. To fill spaces between the 4 daisies ch 5, to form a ring (ch 3, sl st in the loose 9 ch of the daisy, ch 3, sl st in r, ch 6 sl st in joining of 2 daisies, ch 6, sl st in r), 4 times, fasten off the threads.

Finish the edge of sleeve same as the inside of the yoke and on the lower edge make 2 rows like in inner edge and finish with a s c in each st.

This yoke may be without sleeves, or if for a night dress make a deeper sleeve.



Simple Yoke of Knot Stitch No. 5



MATERIALS: Two Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Special No. 50. Make 52 ch sts, 1st row: skip 3 sts, 3 d c, 3 sp, 1 fan, * 1 knot stitch, kn, draw loop on hook out to 1/4 of an inch, ** thread over hook, draw through loop, insert hook back through 1 long loop, thread through, making 2 loops on hook, thread over through both, repeat **, skip 5 ch sts, 1 s c, repeat * until you have 5 kn, 1 fan, 3 sp, 4 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

2nd Row: 3 d c, 3 sp, 1 fan, 1 kn, small loop, * 2 kn, 1 s c, into kn of first row, 1 s c, next to this st, catching

2 threads of long loop, repeat * across kn, 1 fan, 3 sp, 4 d c, 3 ch sts, turn, repeat for length required. For this yoke make the sleeves first, use side of 16 rows as foundation for fronts and back. Make one seam joining back to second sleeve.

For the beading and scallops, attach thread at the front, make 19 ch sts, turn, 1st row: 1 d c, into 4th st, 14 d c, over ch, 7 ch sts, 1 s c, into top of next row, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, into top of next row, turn.

2nd Row: 7 ch sts, 5 d c into first 5 d c, of first row, 5 ch sts, skip 3 sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, turn.

3rd Row: 9 d c, over ch, 5 d c over d c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, over center of chs of both 1st and 2nd rows, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, into foundation, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, into top of next row, continue for top edge.

For all remaining edges make * 1 s c over sp, 5 d c over next sp, repeat *.



Combination Yoke, Aster and Diamond Patterns No. 6



MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Special No. 50.

Make 80 ch sts, 1st row: 1 d c into 4th st, 5 ch sts, skip 5 sts, 1 sp, 1 gr, 8 sp, 1 gr, 8 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 5 ch sts, skip 5 sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

2nd Row: 1 d c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, into center ch of first row, 3 ch sts, 1 sp, 1 gr, 7 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 6 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

3rd Row: 1 d c, 5 ch sts, 1 sp, 1 gr, 6 sp, 1 gr, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 1 p, 3 ch sts, 1 gr, 5 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 5 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

4th Row: 1 d c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 1 sp, 1 gr, 5 sp, 1 gr, * 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 1 p, repeat * 3 ch sts, 1 gr, 6 sp, 1 gr, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

5th Row: 1 d c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 5 sp, 1 gr, * 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 1 p, repeat * for 3 p, 3 ch sts, 1 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 5 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

6th Row: 1 d c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 1 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, * 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 1 p, repeat * for 4 p, 3 ch sts, 1 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

7th Row: 1 d c, 5 ch sts, 2 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, * 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 1 p, repeat * for 5 p, 3 ch sts, 1 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn, completing 1/2 of diamond, repeat backward to start.

For the aster, 1st Row: 1 d c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 1 sp, 1 gr, 6 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 7 sp, 1 gr, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

2nd Row: 1 d c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 6 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 4 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 5 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

3rd Row: 1 d c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 1 sp, 1 gr, 5 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 5 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

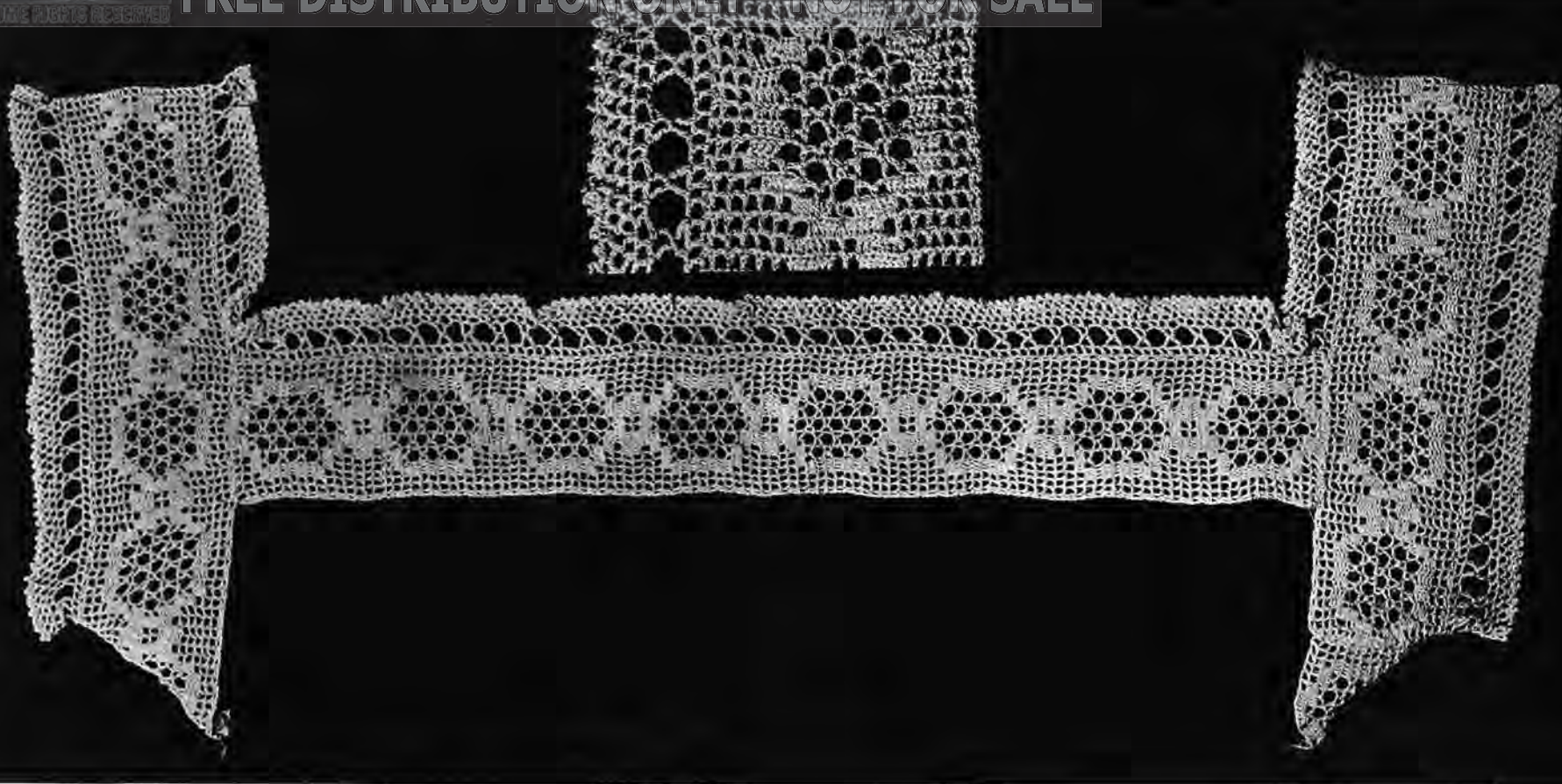
4th Row: 1 d c, 5 ch sts, 2 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, * 1 sp, 1 gr, repeat *, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 4 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

5th Row: 1 d c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 1 gr, 3 sp, 3 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 3 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

6th Row: 1 d c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 3 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 5 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

7th Row: 1 d c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 2 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, * 5 ch sts, 1 s c, repeat *, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 4 sp, 1 gr, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

8th Row: 1 d c, 5 ch sts, 1 sp, 1 gr, 4 sp, 1 gr, * 5 ch sts, 1 s c, repeat * twice, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 4 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 5 ch sts, 2 d c, 3 ch sts, turn, completes 1/2 of pattern.



Practical Yoke No. 7

MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Special, No. 50. Make 53 ch sts, 1st row: 1 d c into 4th st, 6 sp, 4 gr, 6 sp, 1 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

2nd Row: 1 d c, into d c, 5 sp, 2 gr, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, into next d c, 3 ch sts, 2 gr, 5 sp, 1 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

3rd Row: 1 d c, 3 sp, 2 gr, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, into 4th st, 3 ch sts, 1 d c, into d c, 5 ch sts, 1 d c, into next d c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 2 gr, 3 sp, 1 d c, 3 ch sts, turn.

4th Row: 1 d c, 2 sp, 1 gr, * 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch

sts, 1 d c, 5 ch sts, 1 d c, repeat * 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 1 d c, 5 ch sts, 1 d c, repeat * 3 ch sts, 1 s c, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 d c, 3 ch sts, turn, repeat for next 6 rows, making lacet over sp, and sp, over lacet.

14th Row: 1 d c, 5 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 2 gr, 5 sp, 1 d c, 3 ch sts, turn, continue pattern.

For the top edge make 1st row: sps.

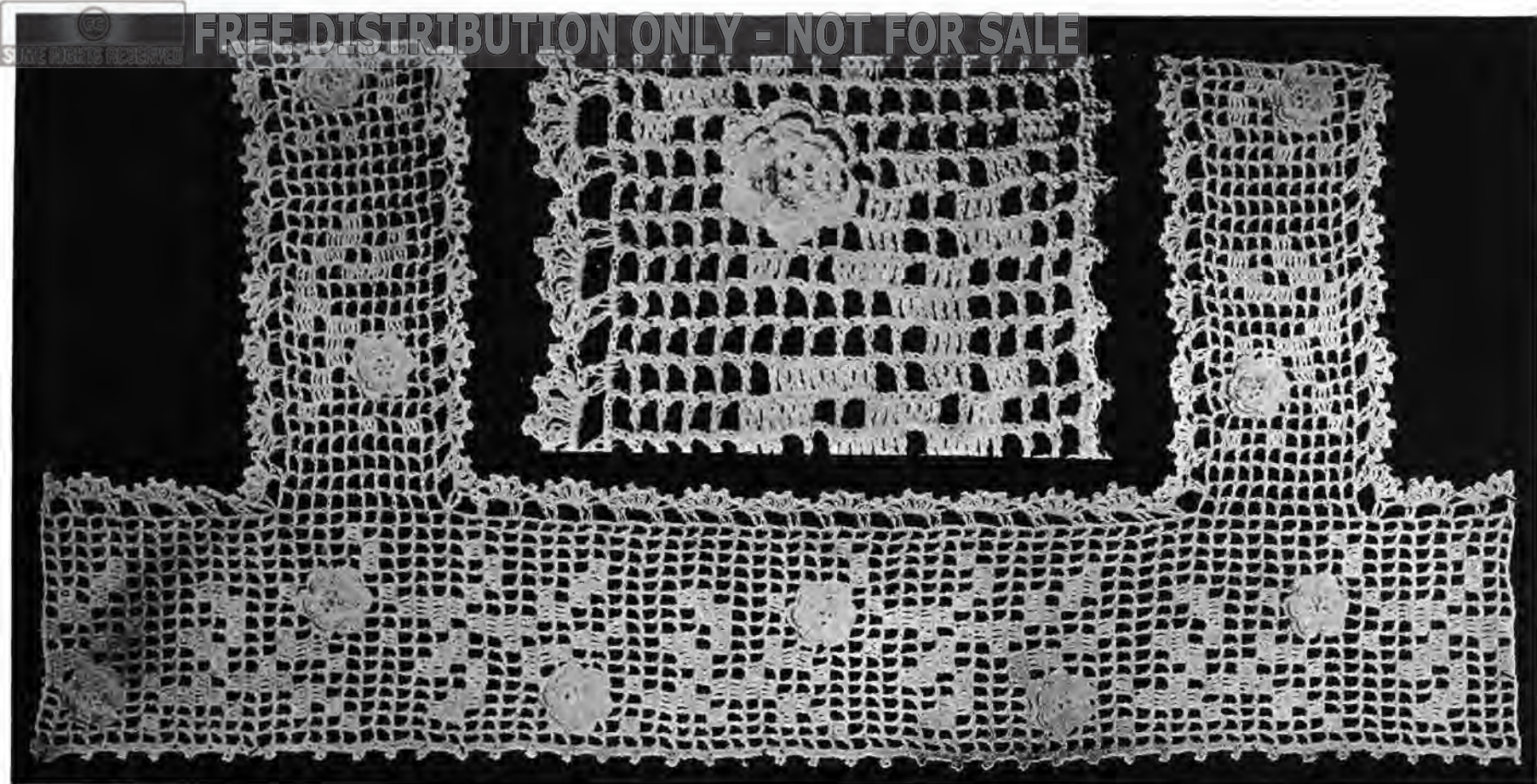
2nd Row: * thread twice over hook, skip 1 sp, over next sp, draw thread through, thread over hook, through 2 loops, thread over hook, skip 1 sp, insert hook, draw

thread through, thread over hook through 2 loops, thread over hook through two loops, 1 d c, 2 ch sts, insert hook into 2 sts, at joining of 2 lower sections, 1 d c, repeat * forming beading.

3rd Row: sps.

4th Row: 5 ch sts, 1 s c, repeat for each sp, and following row.

6th Row: 6 ch sts, 1 p, 1 ch st, 1 s c, repeat for each loop.



Filet Yoke with Irish Crochet Roses No. 8



MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Perle No. 12.

Make 53 ch sts, 1st row: 11 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

2nd Row: 3 sp, 1 gr, 12 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

3rd Row: 8 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

4th Row: 3 sp, 2 gr, 1 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

5th Row: 5 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 2 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

6th Row: 2 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 3 gr, 6 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

7th Row: 11 sp, 1 gr, 4 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

8th Row: 4 sp, 2 gr, 10 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

9th Row: 5 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 2 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 4 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

10th Row: 2 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 6 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

11th Row: 8 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

12th Row: 2 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 10 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

13th Row: 1 sp, 1 gr, 12 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

14th Row: 12 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

15th Row: 5 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 7 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

16th Row: 9 sp, 1 gr, 6 sp, 5 ch sts, turn, continue pattern.

For the roses, 5 ch sts, join.

1st Row: 5 ch sts, * 1 d c, 2 ch sts, repeat * 5 times, forming 6 loops, join.

2nd Row: 1 s c, 5 d c, over each loop.

3rd Row: 1 s c, back of s c, 5 ch sts, repeat for 6 loops.

4th Row: 1 s c, 7 d c, over each loop.

5th Row: 1 s c, 6 ch sts, repeat for 6 loops.

6th Row: 1 s c, 9 d c, over each loop, break thread. Sew to place on yoke. Beading, * 1 d c, 1 ch st, 1 d c over sp, 3 ch sts, skip 1 sp, repeat *. Scallop, 1 s c over sp, * 1 p, 2 d c, repeat * for 3 p, all over 3 ch sts, repeat *.



Chemise Yoke No. 9



MATERIALS: Two and a half Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 40. No. 9 Steel Hook.

DIRECTIONS: Begin at the upper edge of the front with a ch of 186 sts.

For the first row d c in 6th st from the hook, 58 open meshes, t c in 3rd ch from last d c. For the next row ch 4, d c over second d c from the end (this narrows a square), 23 open meshes, 2 solid squares, 6 open, 2 solid, 23 open, t c diagonally under the 4 ch at the end. Follow the pattern from the illustration for 5 rows beginning and ending each row as in first 2 rows. In the next row make 6 open meshes after the 4 ch, 3 solid, 2 open, ch 7, sl st back in 3rd ch to form a ring, turn, ch 3, in the ring make 5 d c, sl st in next d c below, 5 more d c in the ring, d c over next d c, 2 open, 2 solid, 2 open, 6 solid, 2 open, 2 solid, 2 open, begin solid ring same as the first, 2 open, 2 solid, 6 open, t c under 4 ch. In the next

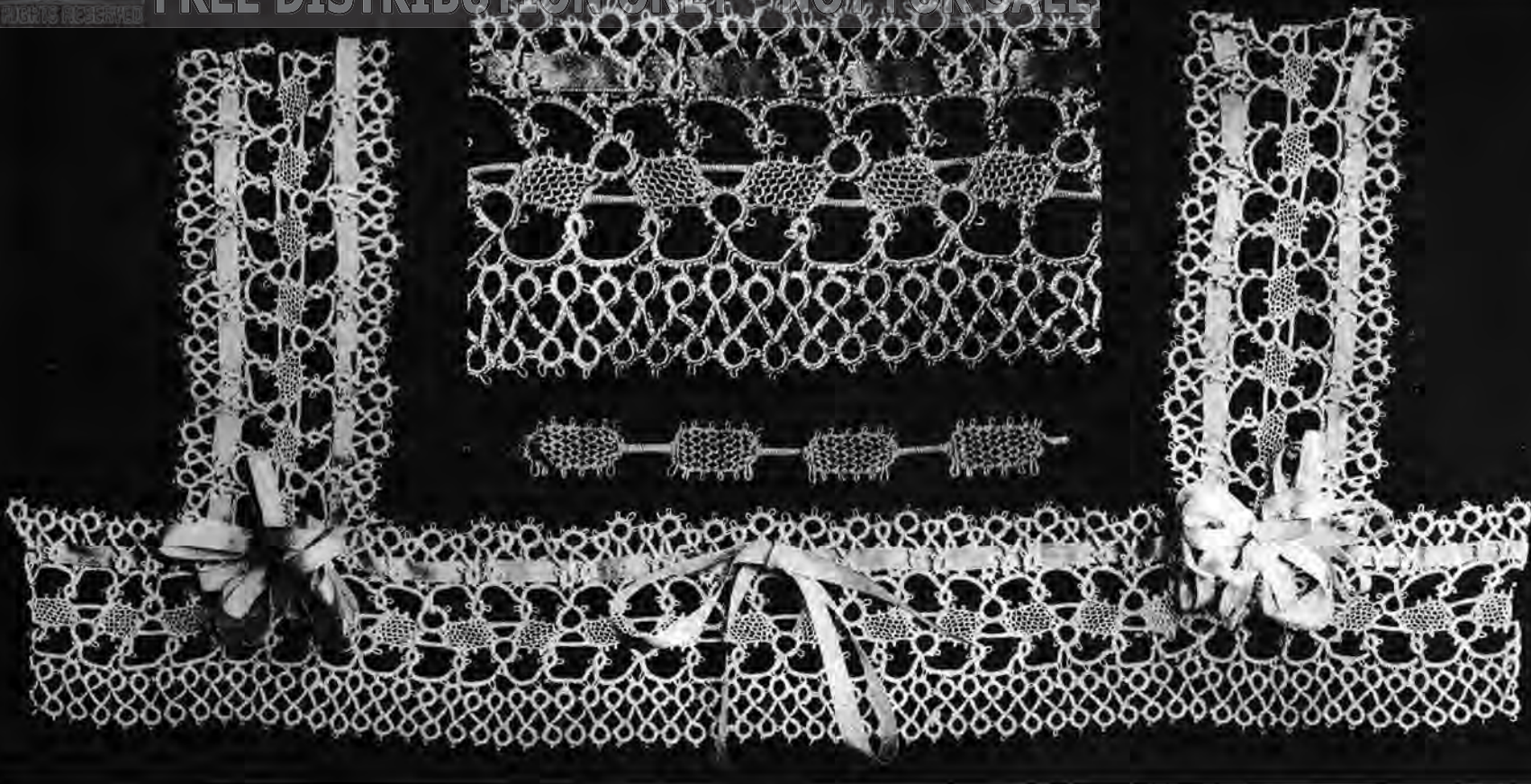
row follow the pattern to the solid ring, instead of the open mesh before the solid ring ch 3, sl st in d c after the ring, 10 d c in the r, sl st in d c after the r catching the last st of 3 ch in the sl st, ch 3, and continue the pattern. The solid ring takes the place of 4 open meshes of the pattern (see illustration). In the next row make d c in sl st before the r, 2 ch, sl st in middle of top of the r, 2 ch, d c in sl st after the r. Follow the pattern for 11 more rows, the last row being 18 open meshes. For the side begin at the end of the upper edge in last d c, ch 7, turn, d c in last d c, 6 open meshes, 1 solid, 1 open, 1 solid, 10 open, t c diagonally across the next open mesh, ch 4, turn, d c over 2d d c from end, 8 open, 2 solid, 1 open, 2 solid, 5 open, 2 ch, d c in 3rd d c of 7 ch, ch 2, d c in same place (this widens a sq at the end of one row and narrows a sq at beginning of next row). Follow pattern for 14 more rows. Beginning in next row omit the widening at the outer edge but continue narrowing at

inner edge until but 2 open meshes are left. Work the other side like this, thus finishing one-half of the yoke. Make the other half in the same manner and join on the shoulder.

For the sleeve fasten at corner and ch 75 sts. Fasten at the back corner and ch 75, turn and on the 75 ch work 24 open meshes, open meshes across the end of yoke part and 24 open meshes on the other 75 ch. Follow pattern for 4 rows more narrowing at ends each row as in the body of yoke. Join ends of sleeve.

For the neck edge and sleeves make a row of cross-treble over 2 d c, ch 3, t c over next d c, and repeat. For the next row ch 3, shell of 5 d c with 1 ch between in 2 ch of cross-treble, 3 ch, sl st in single t c and repeat.

For the outer edge make half-double in each d c and 3 half-doubles in each 2 ch.



Chemise Yoke No. 10

MATERIALS: Two Yards of Novelty Braid, one and a half Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 40.

Take 1 yd. of braid and join the ends. Use a 10-in. strip for each shoulder, joining the ends to the first strip leaving 9 medallions of braid under the arm.

Each side of the braid make a row as follows: * r of 2 d c, p, 2 d c, join to 1st p of a medallion, 2 d c, p, 2 d c, attach spool thread and make a ch of 3 d c, 3 p sep. by 2 d c, 3 d c, turn, r of 3 d c, p, 2 d c, join to 4th p of the medallion, 2 d c, join to 6th p, 2 d c, join to 1st

p of next medallion, 2 d c, join to 3rd p, 2 d c, p, 3 d c, ch like the 1st, r like the first joined to last p of the medallion, and repeat from *. At each corner of the inner edge make a small c l, joining to the 2 medallions of braid.

For the outer row at lower edge r of 4 d c, p, 4 d c, join to middle p of ch, 4 d c, attach spool thread * ch 4 d c, turn, r of 4 d c, 3 p sep. by 4 d c, 4 d c, ch 4 d c, turn, r of 4 d c, join to 1st p of 1st r, 4 d c, join to last p of ch, 2 d c, join to 1st p of next ch, 4 d c, p,

4 d c, and repeat from *, joining rings of each row to each other by 1st p.

For the last row of the inner edge * r of 2 d c, p, 2 d c, join to middle p of ch, 2 d c, p, 2 d c, ch 4 d c, turn, r of 4 d c, 5 p sep. by 2 d c, 4 d c, ch 4 d c, another r of 2 d c, p, 2 d c, join to last p of ch, 1 d c, join to 1st p of next ch, 2 d c, p, 2 d c, ch 4 d c, turn, r of 5 d c, join to 1st p of large r, 1 d c, p, 1 d c, p, 5 d c, turn, another ch. Repeat from *, turning the corners as in the first row.

This yoke is for a 34-inch bust.



Tatted Night-gown Yoke No. 11

MATERIALS: 1 Bolt of Braid, 1 Spool of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 40.

DIRECTIONS: Begin the lower wheel thus: r of 2 d c, 5 p sep. by 2 d c, 2 d c, attach spool thread, ch 3 d c, p, 2 d c, join to middle p of scallop of braid, 2 d c, p, 2 d c, join to middle p of next scallop of braid, 2 d c, p, 2 d c. Alternate rings and ch until 7 of each are made, rings joined by 2d p, and each ch to 2 scallops of braid with 1 scallop left between joinings.

For the upper wheel r of 2 d c, p, 2 d c, p, 1 d c, p, 1 d c, p, 2 d c, p, 2 d c, and ch of 3 d c, join to p of scallop of braid, 2 d c, p, 2 d c, join to next scallop, 3 d c. Make 7 rings and chains, rings joined by 2d p, and ch joined to 2 scallops of braid with no scallop between. Make 21 of each wheel.

Between the wheels in each row tie together 3 scallops of braid to 3 scallops on the opposite side. Leave 3

scallops of braid free at the top and 9 at the outer edge (see illustration).

For the neck edge make a beading of 2 rows of rings with ch of 3 d c between. Lower r is 4 d c, 3 p sep. by 4 d c, 4 d c, and upper r of 3 d c, p, 2 d c, p, 1 d c, p, 1 d c, p, 2 d c, p, 3 d c. Join rings of each row by 1st p and those in lower row to braid.

This design may be carried out with any novelty braid or rick rack.

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Corset Cover Yoke No. 12



MATERIALS: 1 yd. of Rick Rack No. 4. 2 Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 40, and a No. 9 hook.

Finish the ends of the braid and at the 4 corners turn as seen in the illustration.

1st Row: Fasten in point of braid * ch 3, d c in side of first point, d c in side of next point, ch 3, 3 d c in next point and repeat from *. At the corner make d c in

side of the point, ch 1, 3 d c in the turn, ch 1, d c side of next point.

2nd Row: Group of 5 d c (1 before the 3 d c, 1 in each of 3 d c, and 1 after) with 3 ch between. At the corner make t c in center of 3 d c.

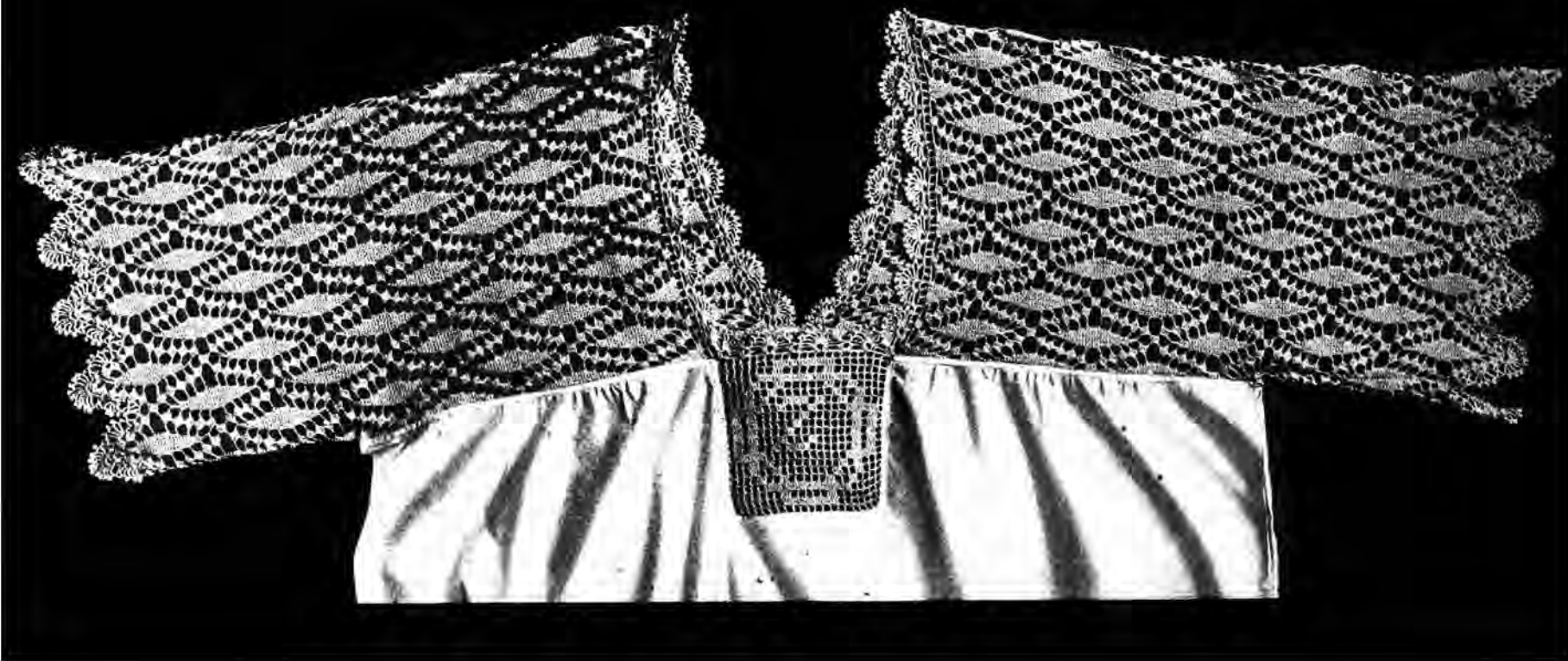
3rd Row: At upper edge make t c with 2 ch between in every 3rd st of last row.

4th Row: Ch 5, miss 2 spaces, s c in next.

5th Row: Ch 1, 6 d c in 5 ch, ch 1, s c in next 5 ch and repeat.

At the lower edge make 3 rows of d c with 2 ch between and widen as necessary at the corners. Then in first 2 ch make 4 d c and 1 d c in next 2 ch.

For the sleeve make ch to go under the arm (see illustration) and work around in the open work file until sleeve is the desired depth.



Yoke and Sleeves for Night-gown No. 13



MATERIALS: Six Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cardonnet Special No. 50. Make 264 ch sts, or about 15 inches. Add or decrease as required by 1 figure, 46 ch sts.

1st Row: Skip 7 ch sts, 4 d c, * 5 ch sts, skip 4 sts, 30 s c, 5 ch sts, skip 4 sts, 4 d c, repeat * finishing the row with 15 s c, 1 ch st, turn.

2nd Row: 1 s c, into each of first 12 s c, * 5 ch sts, 4 d c, over last sts of ch, 10 ch sts, 4 d c, over first sts of next ch, 5 ch sts, skip 3 s c, 1 s c into each st,

skip 3 s c, at the opposite end, repeat * adding 4 d c, over 7 ch sts, at start of first row, 2 ch sts, 1 d c, into same sp, 7 ch sts, turn.

3rd Row: 4 d c, over 2 ch sts, * 5 ch sts, skip 2 ch sts, 6 s c, 5 ch sts, 4 d c, over next ch, 5 ch sts, skip 3 s c, 1 s c, into each st, skip 3 s c, at opposite end, 5 ch sts, 4 d c, repeat * 1 ch st, turn.

4th Row: 9 s c, * 5 ch sts, 4 d c, over last sts of ch, 5 ch sts, 12 s c, 5 ch sts, 4 d c, 5 ch sts, 12 s c, repeat *, 4 d c, 2 ch sts, 1 d c, 7 ch sts, turn.

5th Row: * 4 d c, 5 ch sts, 18 s c, 5 ch sts, 4 d c, 5 ch sts, 6 s c, 5 ch sts, repeat * make 3 s c, at finish, 10 ch sts, turn.

6th Row: 4 d c, over end of ch, 5 ch sts, * 24 s c, 5 ch sts, 4 d c, 5 ch sts, 4 d c, 5 ch sts, repeat * 4 d c, 2 ch sts, 1 d c, at finish, 7 ch sts, turn.

7th Row: 4 d c, 5 ch sts, 30 s c, 5 ch sts, repeat * completing 1/2 the pattern, repeat backward to first row. Continue for 18 inches for half of yoke and one sleeve. For medallion, make 68 ch sts, 1st row: 21 sp.



Yoke of Spiderwebs and Clover Leaves No. 14

MATERIALS: Four Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Special No. 50. For the web, make 5 ch sts, join. 1st row: 7 ch sts, * 1 t c, 2 ch sts, repeat * for 11 t c, 2 ch sts, join.

2nd row: 7 ch sts, * 1 t c, 2 ch sts, 1 t c, into t c, of first row, 1 t c, 2 ch sts, 1 t c, into next t c, 2 ch sts, 1 t c, into next t c, repeat * 2 ch sts, join.

3rd row: 7 ch sts, * 1 t c, 2 ch sts, 1 t c, into t c, 1 t c, 2 ch sts, into next t c, 1 t c, 2 ch sts, into next t c, repeat *.

4th row: 7 ch sts, * 1 t c, 2 ch sts, 1 t c, into t c, ** 1 t c, 2 ch sts, ** for 3 t c, repeat * join.

5th row: 7 ch sts, * 1 t c, 2 ch sts, 1 t c, ** 1 t c, 2 ch sts, repeat ** for 6 t c, repeat * join.

6th row: 17 ch sts, * catch back into the 10th ch st, with 1 s c, 3 ch sts, turn, make 10 d c, into the loop just formed, 12 ch sts, repeat * for 18 fans, join. 3 ch sts, 1 s c into top of t c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c over ch, at center of fan, zig zag back and forth, joining the web and fans.

7th row: * 7 ch sts, 1 s c, into 3rd st, of fan, 7 ch sts, 1 s c, into 7th st of fan, 3 ch sts, 1 t c, into ch between fans, repeat *.

8th row: * 7 ch sts, 1 s c, into center of loop, repeat * break thread.

For the clover leaf, make 6 ch sts, join. 1st row: 12 s c.

2nd row: * 7 ch sts, 1 s c, into 4th st, repeat * for 3 loops.

3rd row: * 2 s c, 2 d c, 5 t c, 2 d c, 2 s c, all over loops, repeat * for 3 loops, for the stem, make 7 ch sts, turn,

1 s c, into each st, break thread. Completing first group of leaves.

For the second group of leaves, make 1st and 2nd rows, as before.

3rd row: 2 s c, 2 d c, 5 t c, 2 d c, 2 s c, for 1st leaf, 2nd leaf, 2 s c, 2 d c, 3 t c, join to end of stem of 1st group, continue as before. For the next group of leaves, join the 1st leaf at the connection just formed and also to the last leaf of 1st group, continue for the 5 groups of leaves. Connect these to the web by loops of 7 ch sts, 1 s c, as shown in illustration.

Beading, * 1 cl of t c, 2 ch sts, repeat * for each loop, omitting the chs, at the corners.

Scallops, * 1 t c, 3 ch sts form 1 p, repeat for 3 p, skip 1 ch, 1 s c, skip 1 ch, repeat *.



Medallion Yoke for Night-gown No. 15



MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Special No. 30. For the medallion, make 7 ch sts, join.

1st Row: 3 ch sts, 18 d c, into circle, join to 3 ch sts.

2nd Row: 5 ch sts, * 1 d c, 1 ch st, repeat * for each st, join.

3rd Row: 3 ch sts, * 1 cl, of t c, 5 ch sts, repeat * over each ch, making 19 cl.

4th Row: * 5 ch sts, 1 s c, over ch, repeat * for 19 loops, completing medallion, break thread. Connect medallions for entire yoke and sleeves.

For the top edge, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, over loop at top of medallion, 5 ch sts, 1 d c, over next loop, 1 d t c, over each of the next two loops, (1 loop on each side of connection) 5 ch sts, 1 d c, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, repeat * until you reach the corner of sleeve, 2 d t c, 5 ch sts, 2 d t c, catching each d t c, into the next loop.

2nd Row: sps.

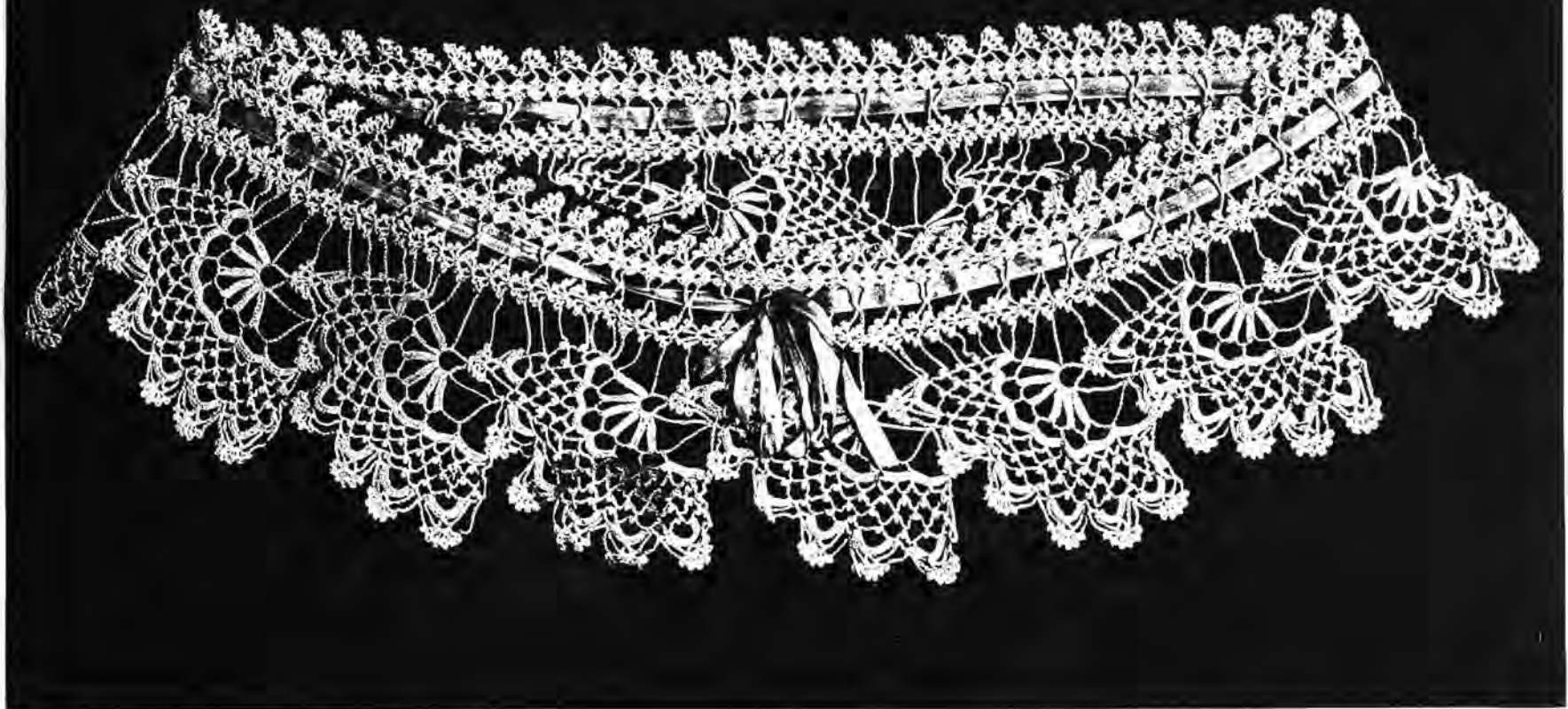
3rd Row: * 7 ch sts, skip 3 sps, 1 s c, 3 ch sts, 3 d c, all over same sp, repeat *.

4th Row: * 1 s c, between 1st and 2nd d c, 7 ch sts, repeat *.

5th Row: Repeat 2nd row, 6th row: repeat 3rd row, 7th row: repeat 4th row, 8th row: repeat 2nd row.

9th Row: * 3 ch sts, 2 d c, 2 ch sts, 2 d c, all over same sp, skip 2 sp, repeat *, make 2 ch sts, between fans.

10th Row: * 2 s c, over ch, in center of fan, 9 d t c, and 8 p, over next fan, repeat *. For the bottom edge, make 1st and 2nd rows of top edge, 3rd row: 1 s c, into each st.



Night-gown Yoke No. 16



MATERIALS: Two Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Special, No. 30. Make 40 ch sts.

1st Row: 1 s c, into 6th st, skip 2 sts, 3 d c, 2 ch sts, 3 d c, all into next st, forming 1 fan, 5 ch sts, skip 3 sts, 1 s c, 5 ch sts, skip 3 sts, 1 p fan (* 1 d c, 3 ch sts, form 1 p, repeat *, 2 ch sts, * 1 d c, 1 p, repeat * all into 1 st, forming 1 p fan,) 9 ch sts, skip 7 sts, 1 t c, 5 ch sts, skip 2 sts, 1 t c, 5 ch sts, skip 5 sts, 1 s c, turn.

2nd Row: * 10 ch sts, 1 s c, over ch between 1 c,

turn, 10 s c, over 7 of the 10 ch sts, turn, repeat * making 6 loops, 7 ch sts, 1 p fan, 7 ch sts, fan, 2 ch sts, 1 d c, 2 ch sts, 1 d c, into loop, 6 ch sts, turn.

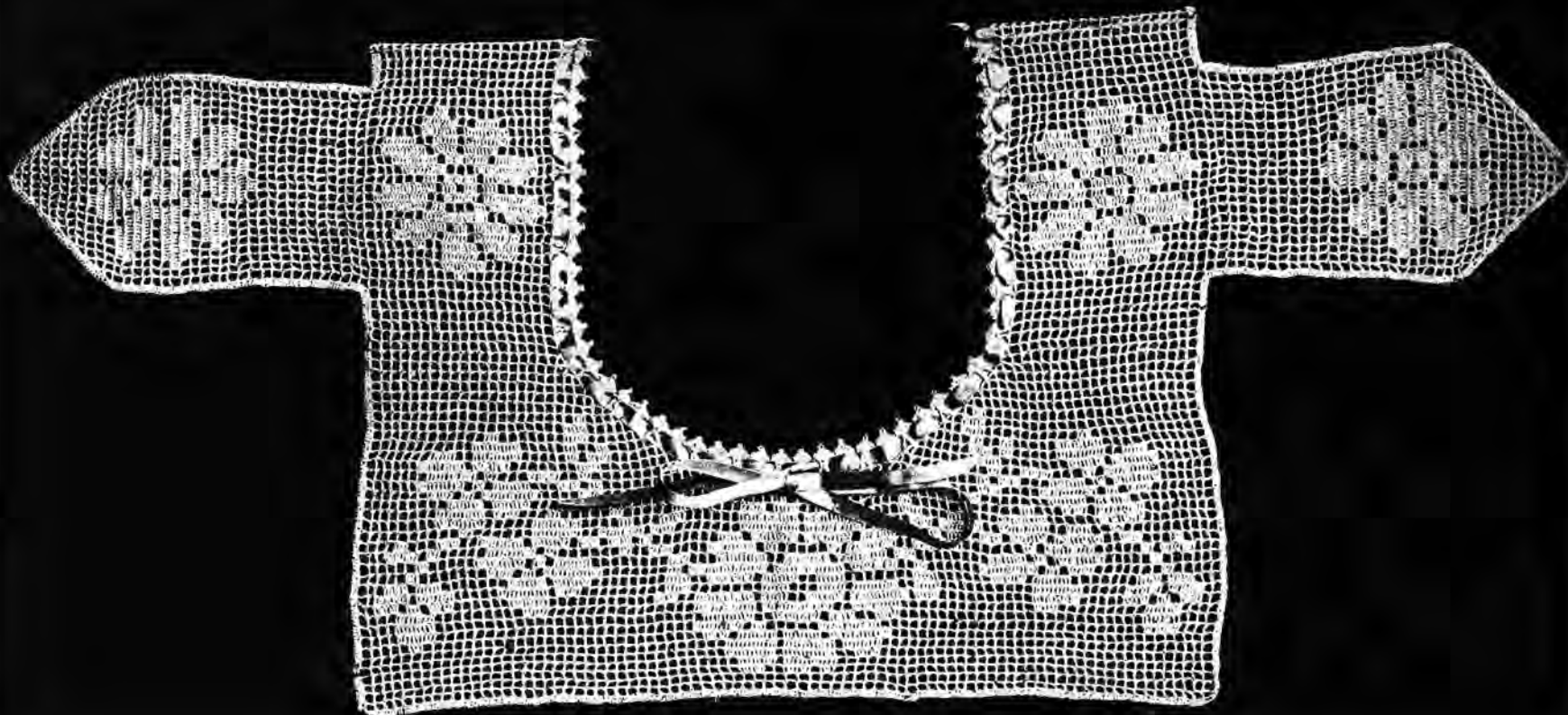
3rd Row: 5 d c, 5 p, between the 2 d c, 2 ch sts, fan, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, 5 ch sts, 1 p fan, 7 ch sts, * 1 d c, into side of s c, 5 ch sts, repeat * for 6 loops, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, into last st of original ch, turn.

4th Row: * 9 s c, over the 5 ch sts, repeat * for 7 chs, 1 s c, into last d c, 9 ch sts, 1 p fan, 9 ch sts,

1 fan, 2 ch sts, 1 d c, 2 ch sts, 1 d c, into last st of fan of row before, turn.

5th Row: 1 p fan over first 2 ch sts, 2 ch sts, 1 fan, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, 5 ch sts, 1 p fan, 9 ch sts, 1 d c, into first s c, * 5 ch sts, skip 4 sts, 1 s c, repeat * for 14 loops, 9 ch sts, turn.

6th Row: * 1 s c, over loop, 3 ch sts, catch back just above s c, of this row, forming p, 7 ch sts, repeat * for each loop, 1 p, 9 ch sts, 1 p fan, 9 ch sts, 1 fan, 2 ch sts, 1 d c, 2 ch sts, 1 d c, turn, continue pattern.



Filet Yoke No. 17

MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 40, and one No. 9 Hook.

Begin at the lower edge of the front with a ch of 246 sts. On the chain make 2 rows of 83 open spaces, then begin the pattern as seen in the illustration and follow it for 21 more rows. In the next row work 31 squares of the pattern and make a d c diagonally across the next sq, thus narrowing a sq. In next row ch 4 and make d c in 2d d c below. Continue the pattern this way for 13 rows, narrowing at neck edge in each row. With the

19 squares left work 7 rows of open meshes, then the flower figure and 7 rows of open meshes on the other side of flower. Take 31 squares on the other side of the front and work the other shoulder.

Make the back same as the front and join ends of the shoulder strips by sl st.

Take 21 squares in the middle of the shoulder and work the strip to go over the sleeve. Make it the desired length with the flower figure at the end. Narrow to a

point by making t c diagonally across the last sq in each row and begin the next row with ch 4 and d c in 2d d c. Finish the outer edge of the yoke with 2 half doubles in each sq and 1 half double over each d c.

For the inner edge make a combination double (com. d c) over 2 d c, ch 3, and repeat, thus forming the spaces for the cord or ribbon. For the last row make a shell of (2 d c, p, 2 d c) in combination d c and join by sl st in 3 ch between.



Filet Yoke No. 18—*Illustrated on Front Cover*

MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 50. A No. 10 Steel Hook.

DIRECTIONS: Begin at the armhole on the right side with a ch of 66 sts. In 4th from the hook make 3 d c to form a solid sq of filet, 18 open meshes, 1 solid sq. Follow the pattern as seen in the illustration forming all the solid flower except the last 2 rows (15 rows in all). In next row make 4 open meshes, 2 solid, ch 3, sl st in last d c of solid sq, ch 3, 3 solid sq over 3 solid sq, ch 3, sl st in first d c of next solid sq, ch 3, 3 solid sq over 3 solid sq, 4 open meshes. In next row make 1 solid sq in first open mesh, 3 open meshes, 2 solid over first solid sq, 1 open mesh, ch 5, 3 solid sq over next 3 solid sq, ch 5, d c in first d c of next 2 solid sq, 2 open meshes, 1 solid, 2 open meshes, 1 solid.

The open work around the filet needs no further instruction but may be worked by following the pattern as shown in the illustration same as for the filet. The (3 ch, sl st, 3 ch) fills space equal to 2 filet squares and the next row has (d c, 5 ch, d c) over the 2 spaces. Work 10 more rows of the pattern, then ch 5, turn, 8 open meshes and 7 solid sq on the ch, and continue the pattern until the front is finished.

For the shoulder strip begin at the upper left corner of the front, make 3 open meshes, open work over 14 squares, 3 open meshes. Make 9 more rows like the last, then in the next begin the small figure in filet as seen in illustration. Make 3 of the figures with 5 rows between and then 11 rows same as in the beginning.

For the back begin with 20 squares of filet same as in the front, work across as seen in the illustration. Join shoulder strips to the back with sl st.

Under the arm make a strip in filet of 6 open meshes in width and about 20 rows, then join.

Finish the lower edge of the yoke with 3 s e in each square of filet.

For the inner edge make a com. treble over solid sq, ch 3, com. treble over next solid sq, and repeat. For the edge * ch 3, (d c, p, 1 ch, d c, p, 1 ch, d c) in combination treble, ch 3, sl st in next combination treble, and repeat from *. Finish the sleeves in the same manner.



Filet Yoke No. 19

MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 40. A No. 10 Steel Hook.

DIRECTIONS: Begin with a loose chain of 66 sts. On the chain work 2 rows of open meshes, then in the next row begin the pattern of the rose as seen in the illustration. Work 18 more rows of the pattern. At the end of the 20th row ch 66, work 20 open meshes on the ch and open meshes to the upper edge. At the edge

narrow a square by making a d c diagonally across the last open mesh and begin the next row with 3 ch and d c over the 2d d c of last row. This narrows a sq at the upper edge in each row. Continue the pattern until 9 roses are made. Instead of making the 66 ch after the 20th row, continue the open meshes, narrowing at the upper edge until the work is brought to a point at the upper edge (see illustration). Join 20 squares to 20 squares in the upper edge of the first figure.

For the inner edge make a row of combination treble over every 2 spaces with 3 ch between.

Finish both upper and lower edges with a shell of (2 ch, 4 d c with 1 ch between, 2 ch) in every alternate d c and fasten by sl st in next d c (see illustration).

Any pretty flower design may be used in working this yoke and small figures may be placed between the large figures in the open meshes.



Night-dress Yoke No. 20



MATERIALS: Two Bolts of Rick Rack No. 4. One Spool of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 40. A No. 9 Steel Hook.

Fasten in a point of the braid (ch 5, s c in next point) 6 times, (ch 7, s c in next point) twice, ch 7, (com. d c in next point) 6 times, (ch 3, sl st in 7 ch, ch 3, sl st in next point) 3 times, (ch 2, sl st in 5 ch, ch 2, sl st in next point) 4 times, and repeat from the beginning.

For the outer edge 6 times make 5 ch and s c in point to form the scallop (see illustration), (ch 7, s c in next point) 3 times (ch 5, s c in next point), 3 times, s c

in each of next 3 points (ch 2, sl st in 5 ch, ch 2, sl st in next point), 3 times (ch 3, sl st in 7 ch, ch 3, s c in next point), 3 times, and repeat to end of the row.

For the outer edge begin in point at right side of the scallop (ch 3, d c in middle of 5 ch, ch 3, d c in same place, ch 3, sl st in next point) 6 times, ch 1, d c at joining of the 2 of the 7 ch, ch 1, s c in next point, and repeat.

For the last row (3 s c in 3 ch) 3 times, sl st in point, and in last shell of the scallop make 3 s c in each of first 3 ch, then over in last 2 of 3 ch in first shell of next scallop make 3 s c and repeat.

For the inner edge fasten in a point of braid at tip of the scallop, ch 5, d c in next point, and d c in first point of next scallop, ch 5, and repeat.

Make a row of cross-treble through which to run the ribbon. At the edge make a shell thus: (ch 3, d c in cross-treble, p. d c in same place, p. d c in same place, ch 3, sl st between cross-trebles) and repeat.

For the cord take a Battenberg ring and around it make 3 ch fastened by sl st. In last 3 ch make 4 s c, ch 1, turn, 4 s c in 4 s c, * ch 1, turn, s c in s c, ch 2, s c in last s c, ch 1, turn, s c in s c, 2 ch, s c in s c, and repeat from *. When the required length run through the spaces and join to another ring.



Night-gown Yoke No. 21



MATERIALS: Three Sools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 50, A No. 10 Steel Hook.

DIRECTIONS: Begin at the lower edge with a chain of 279 sts. On the ch work 2 rows of 91 open meshes. Follow the pattern for the next 5 rows. In the 6th row begin the solid circle in the center of each loop of the bows (see illustration). This circle fills the space of 4 open meshes. Work row 6 as follows: 2 open meshes, 2 solid squares, 1 open mesh, ch 7, sl st in 2d of the 7 ch to form a circle or ring, ch 3, 5 d c in the ring, sl st in next d c beneath, 5 more d c in the ring, d c over d c and continue the pattern to end of the row, beginning the circle in the other corner loop same

as this first one. In the 7th row work 3 open meshes, 1 solid sq, ch 3, sl st in top of next d c, 10 more d c in the ring, ch 3, d c over next d c, and continue the pattern. In the next row make d c in sl st at the side of the circle, ch 2, sl st in center of the top of the circle, ch 2, d c in sl st on the other side and continue the pattern. The other circles are made in the same manner as first, each taking space of 4 open meshes as seen in the illustration.

In the 23rd row work the pattern for 36 squares, t c diagonally across the next sq thus narrowing a sq. Begin next row with ch 4 and d c over 2d d c beneath. Narrow at the neck edge this way for 15 rows, then

with the 22 squares remaining work the shoulder (12 rows). In the next row begin to widen at the neck edge thus: after last d c, ch 7, turn, d c in last d c, and continue the pattern. In next row d c in last d c, ch 2, d c in 3rd of 7 ch. This widens a sq every row. Widen for 15 rows (see illustration). Work 22 more rows of the pattern. The rest of the pattern can be worked by following the detail as seen in the illustration.

Finish the inner edge with a shell made thus: ch 2 (d c, p, d c, p, d c, p, d c), in next d c, skip 1 d c, sl st in the next.

For the outer edge make 3 s c in each 2 ch and sl st in each d c.



Night-dress or Corset Cover Yoke No. 22



MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 50. A No. 10 Steel Hook.

DIRECTIONS: Begin at the upper edge of the front with a ch of 273 sts. On the ch work 89 open meshes. In the next row begin the pattern as seen in the illustration, and work 15 more rows. In the next row begin narrowing to form the point in front. At the end of each row make a t c diagonally across the last sq, ch 4, turn, d c over 2d d c. This narrows 1 sq at the beginning and end of each row.

On 17 squares at the upper edge of front begin the shoulder and follow the pattern to the back (47 rows). Beginning with 15 squares work the back following the pattern. Join ends of the shoulders to back by sl st. For the sleeve begin at lower corner of the back, ch 42, turn, 12 open meshes on the ch, open meshes across the shoulder and to the lower corner of the front (see illustration), ch 42, turn, work back and forth following the pattern for 15 rows. At end of each row narrow same as at front point and join edges by sl st.

For the inner edge ch 4, t c in d c, * skip 2 squares, t c in

next d c, ch 4, sl st in same place, ch 4, t c in same d c, and repeat from *.

For the next row fasten in between the 2 groups of t c and 4 ch, ch 4, t c in same place, ch 3, 2 t c in same place, * 2 t c between next 2 groups, ch 3, 2 t c in same place, and repeat from *.

For the edge make a shell of (3 ch, d c, p, d c, 3 ch) between 2 groups of t c and fasten by sl st in 4 ch. Finish sleeves in same manner.

For the lower edge of the yoke make (sl st, 3 x c, sl st) in each space.



Night-gown Yoke No. 23



MATERIALS: Two Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordnet No. 40 and 1 yard of Novelty Braid.

Ch 442 stitches, and join to form circle.

1st Row: ch 5, 18 dc, on ch, ch 3, 18 dc, until 21 groups of 18 dc, are made.

2nd Row: ch 5, * 8 dc, skip 1 dc, 8 dc, ch 2, dc into space ch 2, dc into same sp ch 2, repeat from * all around.

3rd Row: ch 5, * 7 dc, skip 1 dc, 7 dc, ch 3, 1 dc, into second sp, ch 4 (for picot), ch 3, dc, into same sp, p, ch 3, repeat from *.

4th Row: ch 5, *, 6 dc, skip 1 dc, 6 dc, ch 3, 1 dc, into

first sp, p, ch 3, dc, into 2nd sp, p, ch 3, dc into same sp, p, ch 3, dc into next sp, p, ch 3, repeat from *.

5th Row: * ch 5, 5 dc, skip 1 dc, 5 dc, ch 3, 1 dc, into 1st sp, p, ch 3, dc, into 2nd sp, p, ch 3, dc into next sp, p, ch 3, dc into same sp, p, ch 3, dc into next space, p, ch 3, dc into next sp, picot ch 3, repeat from *.

6th Row: ch 5, *, 4 dc, skip 1 dc, 4 dc, ch 3, 1 dc, into 1st sp, p, ch 3, dc into 2nd sp, p, ch 3, dc into next space, p, ch 3, dc into next sp, p, ch 3, dc into same sp, p, ch 3, dc into next space, p, ch 3, dc into next space, p, ch 3, dc into next sp, p, ch 3, repeat from *.

7th Row: ch 5, *, 3 dc, skip 1 dc, 3 dc, ch 3, 1 dc into 1st sp, p, ch 3, dc into next sp, p, ch 3, dc into next sp,

p, ch 3, dc into next sp, p, ch 3, dc into next sp, p, ch 3, dc into same sp, p, ch 3, dc into next sp, p, ch 3, dc into next sp, p, ch 3, dc into next sp, p, ch 3, repeat from *.

8th Row: ch 5, *, 2 dc, skip 1 dc, 2 dc, ch 3, dc, p, into each sp, repeat from *.

9th Row: ch 5, dc on dc, ch 4, *, dc, into sp, repeat from *. Finish bottom of yoke with row of shells made as follows: *, 6 dc, into 2 dc, sl st into next dc, 5 dc, into next dc, repeat from *. After lace is finished fasten to braid by ch 1, and sl st into each loop on braid.

Beading for Top of Yoke: ch 7, *, tc, into loop of braid, ch 2, repeat from *. Finish top of yoke with shell same as for bottom.



Maltese or Hair-pin Lace Yoke No. 24



MATERIALS: Two Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 30. One Adjusto Hair-pin or Maltese Crochet Fork, or a 1 in. Staple.

Make a length of hair-pin lace as long as desired, shaping around shoulders.

With crochet needle, take up eleven stitches and draw thread through, ch 3, taking up 1 st, with s c (Repeat 11 times). Then take up 11 stitches and continue.

2nd Row: 3 ch, s c, to 11 combined stitches, then 7 ch,

missing 1, 3 ch on each side of 11 ch. Then 3 ch, 1 s c. (Repeat 9 times).

3rd Row: 7 ch to center of 7 ch, s c, 7 ch, s c, 3 ch, s c. (6 times).

4th Row: 7 ch, s c, to center of 7 ch, 7 ch, s c, 7 ch, 3 ch, s c. (3 times.)

5th Row: 1 t c, 2 ch all across on upper side with each 2 ch. Take up a loop of top row of hair-pin lace. Repeat on opposite side, finishing with 1 t c, 2 ch spaces and joining sleeve, see illustration.

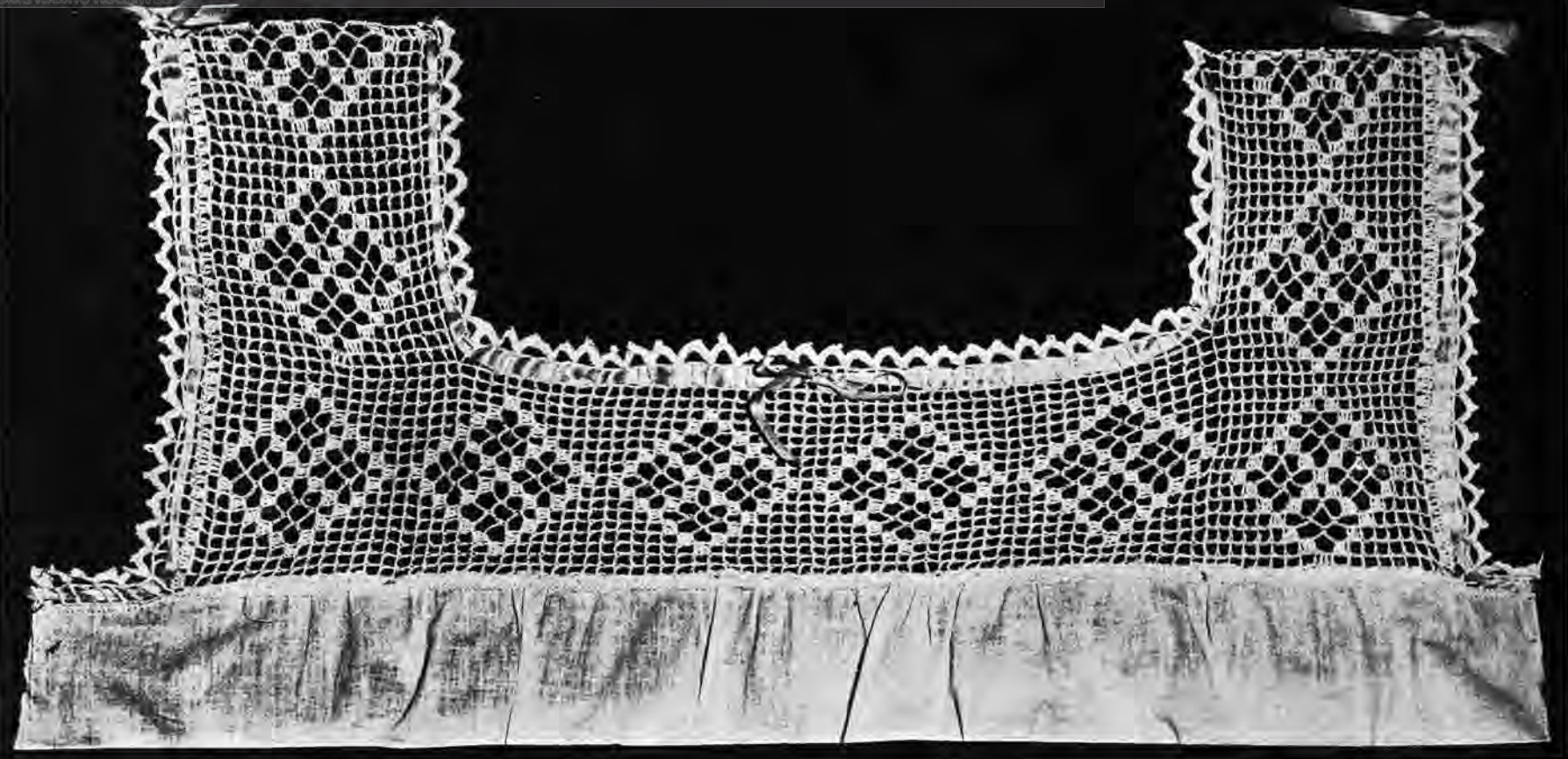
On upper side of top row of hair-pin lace take up every

other loop with a cluster of 3 t c, 3 ch. Above the cluster row, 1 t c, 2 ch, all around.

Last Row: Fill spaces with 3 s c, 3 ch, 3 s c.

Shape sleeve by joining hair-pin lace of same width as upper part of yoke.

Make another piece of hair-pin lace same width as one joined to yoke, and join the two widths in each loop with cluster, ch 3, alternating from piece to piece until joined. Finish with row of spaces and fill spaces with 3 s c, 3 ch, 3 s c.



Open Diamond Yoke No. 25



MATERIALS: Two Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Special No. 30. Make 56 ch sts. 1st Row: 8 sp, 1 gr, 8 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

2nd Row: 7 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 7 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

3rd Row: 6 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, over center sp, 5 ch sts 1 gr, over next sp, 6 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

4th Row: 5 sp, 1 gr, * 5 ch sts, 1 s c, repeat *, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

5th Row: 4 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, over ch, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, over ch, 1 sp, 1 gr, 4 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

6th Row: 3 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 3 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

7th Row: 2 sp, 1 gr, * 5 ch sts, 1 s c, repeat * 5 ch sts,

1 gr, * 5 ch sts, 1 s c, repeat * 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 2 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

8th Row: 3 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 3 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

9th Row: 4 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 4 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

10th Row: 5 sp, 1 gr, * 5 ch sts, 1 s c, repeat * 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

11th Row: 6 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 6 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

12th Row: 7 sp, 1 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 7 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

13th Row: 8 sp, 1 gr, 8 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

14th Row: 17 sp, completing pattern, repeat for five figures, using the top edge of the last 17 sp, as foundation,

start 1st row of shoulder strap, continue making 4 figures, the last one, forming the start of the front. In this manner there is but one seam in this yoke.

For the finish at the neck, make 1 row of sp, for the beading.

2nd Row: * 5 ch sts, skip 1 sp, 1 s c, repeat *.

3rd Row: 5 s c, 3 ch sts, forming a p, 5 s c, over each loop.

Around the armhole, 1st Row: 3 ch sts, 3 d c, into each sp. Along the bottom edge of front and back, make 3 s c, over each sp, 1 s c, into each d c.

Sew the yoke to your garment, allowing easy space under the arm. Hem across this space and over the hem make s c, finish the armhole with beading and scallops to match the neck.



Corset Cover Yoke No. 26



MATERIALS: Two Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Special No. 40. Make 50 ch sts, 1st Row: 9 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 39 ch sts, turn.

2nd Row: 2 gr, * 1 sp, 1 gr, repeat * for 5 sp, 2 gr, 13 sp, turn.

3rd Row: sl st, back on 3 sts, which drops 1 sp, 24 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, turn.

4th Row: 24 sp, turn.

5th Row: sl st, back on 3 sts, 12 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, turn.

6th Row: 3 sp, 4 gr, 1 sp, 4 gr, 10 sp, turn.

7th Row: sl st, back on 3 sts, 9 sp, 4 gr, 1 sp, 4 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, turn.

8th Row: 4 sp, 3 gr, 2 sp, 2 gr, 9 sp, turn.

9th Row: sl st, back on 3 sts, 11 sp, 1 gr, 6 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, turn.

10th Row: 4 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 4 sp, 1 gr, 4 sp, turn.

11th Row: sl st, back on 3 sts, 3 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 4 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, turn.

12th Row: 3 sp, 4 gr, 3 sp, 3 gr, 3 sp, turn, completing pattern, repeat for the length around the yoke and join.

For the top edge make ch sts, 1 s c, into center of each turn, making a straight ch, to this start the shoulder straps.

1st Row: 24 sp, drop 1 sp, on each side of the next 3 rows.

5th Row: 5 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 2 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

6th Row: skip 1 sp, 2 sp, 4 gr, 1 sp, 4 gr, 4 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

7th Row: 4 sp, 4 gr, 1 sp, 4 gr, 2 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

8th Row: 3 sp, 3 gr, 2 sp, 2 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

9th Row: 8 sp, 1 gr, 6 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

10th Row: 3 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 4 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

11th Row: 2 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 4 gr, 2 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

12th Row: 2 sp, 5 gr, 3 sp, 3 gr, 3 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

13th Row: 10 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 5 ch sts, turn, sp, for the next 2 rows, repeat for 5 figures and increase at the back as you have decreased at front.

Beading: 1 row of sp, scallops, 3 ch sts, * 3 d c, into d c, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, into next d c, 3 ch sts, repeat * around neck and armholes. At the points, finish with 1 row of s c.



Night-dress Yoke in Hair-pin Crochet No. 27

MATERIALS: Two Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 40, a No. 9 Hook and an Ajusto Hair-pin Crochet Fork or a 1½-inch Staple.

For the hairpin work ch 2 sts, bring thread around the right prong of the staple, s c in each of the 2 ch, turn the staple, insert the hook in the dropped st, s c in 2 s c and s c under the left loop, turn staple (always from right to left) insert the hook in dropped st., 2 s c in 2 s c and s c under left loop. Repeat until there are 450 loops or 1 yd. of the hairpin lace. Slip off the staple and join the

ends. For the inner edge fasten the thread in 4 loops, ch 5 (over twice, take a st in the same 4 loops, over and st through 2 sts, over twice, take a st in next 4 loops, work all sts off 2 at a time, ch 2, d c in the crossing) thus forming one cross treble. Repeat the cross treble around the yoke, beginning each in loops with the last (see illustration). For the next row * t c in between 2 cross trebles, ch 4, t c in the same place, t c between next 2 cross treble, and repeat from *. For last row * ch 2, d c in top of 2 t c (p. 1 ch, d c) in same place three times, ch 2, sl st in top of next 2 t c and repeat.

For the outer edge fasten in 3 loops of hair-pin work, ch 9, sl st in next 3 loops, ch 3, sl st in next 3 loops, turn (12 t c with 1 ch between) in the 9 ch, sl st in next 3 loops, ch 3, sl st in next 3 loops, ch 2 (t c with 2 ch between) in each t c of the scallop, sl st in next 3 loops, ch 3, sl st in next 3 loops, turn, ch 3 (t c with 3 ch between) in each t c, sl st in next 3 loops, turn, make (s c, 3 half-doubles, s c) in each 3 ch of last row. sl st in sl st (ch 3, sl st in next 3 loops) 3 times, and repeat from the beginning with the 9 ch.



Filet Yoke No. 28



MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Special No. 40 and 30 inches of Novelty Braid.

1st Row: * 1 sp, into one loop of braid, 2 sp, into next loop, repeat *, making 260 sps, for this row, join at end of each row.

2nd Row: * 1 gr, 15 sp, 1 gr, 25 sp, 1 gr, 22 sp, 1 gr, 15 sp, 1 gr, 22 sp, 1 gr, 25 sp, completes one-half of row; repeat *.

3rd Row: Repeat 2nd row.

4th Row: * 2 gr, 13 sp, 2 gr, 25 sp, 2 gr, 21 sp, 2 gr, 13 sp, 2 gr, 21 sp, 2 gr, 25 sp, repeat *.

5th Row: Repeat 4th row.

6th Row: * 3 gr, 3 sp, 5 gr, 3 sp, 3 gr, 25 sp, 3 gr, 3 sp, 5 gr, 12 sp, 3 gr, 3 sp, 5 gr, 3 sp, 3 gr, 12 sp, 5 gr, 3 sp, 3 gr, 25 sp, repeat *.

7th Row: * 1 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 2 gr, 27 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 2 gr, 17 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 2 gr, 17 sp, 2 gr, 2 sp, 2 gr, 26 sp, repeat *.

8th Row: * 3 sp, 3 gr, 5 sp, 3 gr, 5 sp, 3 gr, 23 sp, 3 gr, 12 sp, ** 3 gr, 5 sp, ** until you have 4 gr, 12 sp, 3 gr, 5 sp, 3 gr, 15 sp, 3 gr, 2 sp, repeat *.

9th Row: * 4 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 4 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 21 sp, 4 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 12 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 4 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 4 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 15 sp, 4 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 17 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, repeat *.

10th Row: * 1 gr, 5 sp, 2 gr, 1 sp, 2 gr, 5 sp, 2 gr, 23 sp, 2 gr, 5 sp, 2 gr, 14 sp, 2 gr, 5 sp, 2 gr, 1 sp, 2 gr, 5 sp, 2 gr, 17 sp, 1 gr, 3 sp, 2 gr, 23 sp, 1 gr, repeat *.

11th Row: * 6 sp, 2 gr, 1 sp, 2 gr, 6 sp, 1 gr, 23 sp, 1 gr, 6 sp, 2 gr, 14 sp, 1 gr, 6 sp, 2 gr, 1 sp, 2 gr, 6 sp, 1 gr, 17 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 1 gr, 23 sp, 1 gr, repeat *.

15th Row: * 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 11 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 15 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 16 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 13 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 16 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 15 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, 1 gr, 2 sp, repeat *, break thread.

Start 5 sp to right of small figure, 6 sp, 2 gr, 1 sp, 2 gr, 6 sp, 3 ch sts, turn, skip 1st sp, follow pattern, skipping 1 sp on each end of 8 rows, ch down left side catching with s c, at each row to 15th row, skip two sp, continue across large point in the same manner.



Filet Yoke No. 29



MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet Special No. 30. Make 56 ch sts, 1st Row: 17 sps.

2nd Row: 5 sp, 1 gr, 5 sp, 1 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

3rd Row: 5 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 2 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

4th Row: 5 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

5th Row: 5 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

6th Row: 1 sp, 4 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 t c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 1 sp, 4 gr, 1 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

7th Row: 2 sp, 4 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 s c, into last ch st, 1 s c, into t c, 1 s c, into next ch st, 5 ch sts, 4 gr, 2 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

8th Row: 3 sp, 2 gr, 5 ch sts, 5 s c, 5 ch sts, 2 gr, 3 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

9th Row: 4 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 7 s c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 4 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

10th Row: 3 sp, 2 gr, 5 ch sts, 5 s c, 5 ch sts, 2 gr, 3 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

11th Row: 2 sp, 4 gr, 5 ch sts, 3 s c, 5 ch sts, 4 gr, 2 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

12th Row: 1 sp, 4 gr, 1 sp, 1 gr, 5 ch sts, 1 t c, 5 ch sts, 1 gr, 1 sp, 4 gr, 1 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

13th Row: 5 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

14th Row: 5 sp, 3 gr, 1 sp, 3 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

15th Row: 5 sp, 2 gr, 3 sp, 2 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

16th Row: 5 sp, 1 gr, 5 sp, 1 gr, 5 sp, 5 ch sts, turn.

17th Row: 17 sp, repeat for 3 figures, turn, using the upper edge for the foundation, work on 17 sp, make 4

figures. Forming one half the front and one shoulder, repeat for the opposite side.

In the same manner work across the back and seam at one side.

For the beading, make *5 ch sts, skip 1 sp, 1 s c, repeat * around neck, fronts and armholes.

2nd Row: * 1 gr, over loop, 2 ch sts, 1 d c, over next loop, 2 ch sts, repeat *.

3rd Row: Repeat 1st row of beading.

4th Row: * 1 d c, 1 p, repeat for 4 p, 3 ch sts, 1 s c, over next loop, 3 ch sts, repeat *.

For the lower edge, make one row of s c, extend (this over hem of material under the arm and continue the heading around armhole.



Ladies' Camisole With Crocheted Silk Lace

No. 30 [Size 36-38]

MATERIALS: Three Spools of Richardson's Blue Perfect Crochet and Knitting Silk, ¼ yard Jersey Silk Cloth or Silk, 40 inches wide, 1 piece Ribbon No. 1, 1 Steel Crochet Hook No. 8.

DIRECTIONS: Ch a number of Sts. divisible by 6, turn, skip 3 Sts., 1 D. in each Dt., turn, Ch. 6.

2nd Row: 1 Tr. in 3rd St., * Ch. 1, skip 1 St., 1 Tr. in next St., repeat from * across, turn, Ch. 5.

3rd Row: Skip 1 St., 1 Tr. in each of 3 Sts., * Ch. 2, skip 2 Sts., 1 Tr. in each of 4 Sts., repeat from * across.

4th Row: * repeat Ch. 5, 1 Sl. St. in 2nd Ch. St., Ch. 2, twice, 1 S. in space made

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Ladies' Camisole With Crocheted Silk Lace

No. 31 [Size 36-38]

MATERIALS: 3 Spools of Richardson's Pink Crochet or Knitting Silk, ¼ yard Jersey Silk or Silk 40 inches wide, 1 piece Ribbon No. 1, 1 Steel Crochet Hook No. 10.

DIRECTIONS: Ch. a number of Sts. (about 40 inches in length) divisible by 24, add 3, turn, skip 3 Sts., 1 D. in each St., turn, Ch. 6.

St. in next St., 1 Tr. in each of 3 Sts., * Ch. 2, skip 2 Sts., 1 Tr. in each of 4 Sts., Ch. 9, slip loop from hook, insert hook in top St. of petal, slip loop on hook again and draw through St., turn, Ch. 2, skip 2 Sts., 1 S., 1 H. D., 3 D., 1 H. D., 1 S. on the 9 Ch. Sts., 1 Sl. St. in Tr., Ch. 2, skip 2 Sts., 1 Tr. in next St., Ch. 9, turn, skip 2 Sts., 1 S., 1 H. D., 3 D., 1 H. D., 1 S. on the 9

Ch. Sts., 1 Sl. St. in Tr., 1 Tr. in each of 3 Sts., repeat from * ending row, Ch. 2, skip 2 Sts., 1 Tr. in each of 4 Sts., Ch. 9, join to top of last petal, turn, skip 2 Sts., 1 S., 1 H. D., 3 D., 1 H. D., 1 S. on the 9 Ch. Sts., 1 Sl. St. in Tr., Ch. 1, break off silk.

9th Row: Ch. 1, 1 D. in first St., * Ch. 7, 1 D., Ch. 5, 1 D. in joining St. at the point of 2 petals, Ch. 7, 1 D. in space between petals, repeat from * making last D. in last St. in row, Ch. 1, break off silk, fasten.

10th Row: * 1 S. in 5th Ch. St. on Ch. 7, Ch. 5, 1 Sl. St. in 2nd Ch. St., Ch. 2, 1 S., Ch. 3, 1 S., Ch. 3, 1 S., Ch. 3, 1 S. in space made by Ch. 5, Ch. 5, 1 Sl. St. in 2nd Ch. St., Ch. 2, 1 S. in 5th Ch. St. on Ch. 7, Ch. 3, repeat from * across, Ch. 1, break off silk, fasten.

Sew crocheted edge to Jersey Silk, have seam come at sideseam, sew a 1/2-inch hem around bottom of Silk, and draw a piece of elastic about 27 inches long, 3/8 inch wide through seam, sew together firmly, sew shoulder straps in place and draw ribbon through spaces, and trim with bows.

Ch. 5, 1 Sl. St. in 2nd Ch. St., Ch. 1, skip 1 Tr., 1 Tr. in next Tr., twice, Ch. 11, slip loop from hook, insert hook in top St. of last petal, slip loop on hook again, draw through St., Ch. 12, slip loop from hook, insert hook in 9th Ch. St. from last, slip loop on hook again, draw through St., Ch. 2, skip 2 Sts., 1 S., 1 H. D., 5 D., 1 H. D., 1 S. on the 12 Ch. Sts., 1 Sl. St. in Sl. St. on petal, repeat Ch. 11, turn, skip 2 Sts., 1 S., 1 H. D., 5 D., 1 H. D., 1 S. on the 11 Ch. Sts., 1 Sl. St. in Tr., repeat Ch. 5, 1 Sl. St. in 2nd Ch. 6th Row: Turn, Ch. 6, 1 Tr. in 2nd Ch. St., * Ch. 1, skip 1 St., 1 Tr. in next St., repeat from * across, turn, Ch. 6.

7th Row: 1 Tr. on Tr., * Ch. 1, 1 Tr. in next Tr., repeat from * across, turn, Ch. 1.

8th Row: 1 S. in St., * Ch. 3, skip 1 Tr., 1 D., Ch. 4, 1 D. in next Tr., Ch. 3, skip 1 Tr., 1 S. in next Tr., repeat from * across, turn, Ch. 1.

9th Row: 1 S. in St., Ch. 3, * 1 S., Ch. 3, 1 S., Ch. 3, 1 S., Ch. 3, 1 S. in space made by Ch. 4, between the 2 D., Ch. 3, repeat from * ending row, 1 S. in last S., Ch. 1, break off thread, fasten.

Edge across start of Insertion: Ch. 1, 1 S. in St., * Ch. 5, 1 Sl. St. in 2nd Ch. St., Ch. 2, skip 3 Sts., 1 S. in next St., repeat from * across.

Straight Bands: Make a Ch. 17 inches long, turn, skip 6 Sts., 1 Tr. in next St., * Ch. 1, skip 1 St., 1 Tr. in next St., repeat from * across, turn, Ch. 6.

2nd Row: 1 Tr. in Tr., * Ch. 1, 1 Tr. in next Tr., repeat from * across.

Then repeat 8th and 9th row on each side of strip. Make 2 of these strips.

Sew crocheted edge to Jersey Silk, have seam come at sideseam, sew a 1/2-inch hem around bottom of silk, and draw a piece of elastic about 27 inches long, 3/8 inch wide through seam, sew together firmly, sew shoulder straps in place and draw ribbon through spaces, and trim with bows.

MATERIALS: Two Spools of Richardson's R. M. C. Cordonnet No. 40, a No. 9 Hook and one Adjusto Crochet Fork, or 1/2-inch Hair-pin Staple.

Make 2 lengths of the hair-pin work, the inside piece 48 inches long and the outside strip 57 inches long. This yoke illustrated is for a 36-inch bust.

Ch 6 and join for a ring, ch 4 to take the place of a

t c and 2 t c in the r leaving last st of each to work off together, ch 1, sl st to 2 loops, ch 2, sl st to 2 loops, ch 1, 3 t c in r leaving last st of each until the last to be worked off together, ch 1, sl st to 2 loops, ch 2, sl st to 2 loops, ch 1, another group of 3 t c in r, ch 5, group in r, ch 5, group in r, ch 1, sl st to 2 loops of the other strip of hair-pin work, ch 2, sl st to next 2 loops, ch 1, group in r, ch 2, sl st in 2 loops,

ch 1, group of 3 t c, ch 5, group in r, ch 5, sl st to 1st group. In making the rest of the stars join to each other by the 5 ch as seen in the illustration. Have 8 stars each side of front, 12 across the shoulder, and 15 for the back. If a slip over yoke is preferred join the ends of the front before making the edge.

For inner edge make 3 d c in 2 loops with p in center, ch 2, sl st in next 2 loops and repeat.



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
